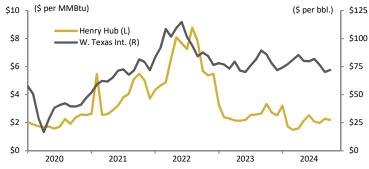

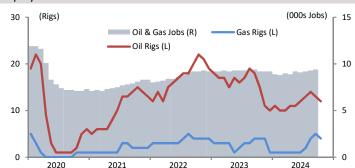
## • Energy index: natural gas and crude oil prices, rig counts, and oil & gas employment.<sup>1,3,8,11</sup>



➤ The Henry Hub natural gas price averaged \$2.20 per MMBtu in October, \$0.08 less than a month ago. The WTI crude oil price increased 2.5% in October compared to the previous month, but declined 16.1% compared to October 2023.

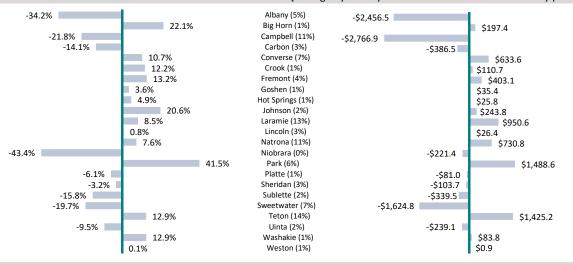

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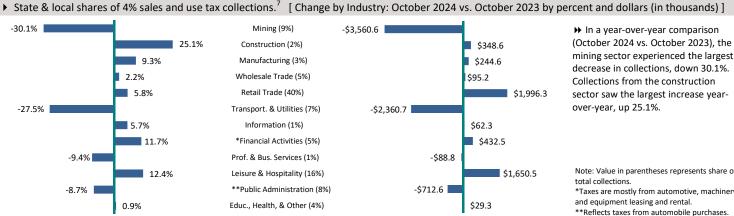

State & local shares of 4% sales and use tax collections.<sup>7</sup> [Change by County: October 2024 vs. October 2023 by percent and dollars (in thousands)]



In a year-over-year comparison (October 2024 vs. October 2023), sales and use tax collections statewide decreased by \$1.9 million or 2.0%. 9 of the 23 counties saw year-over-year decreases in collections. Niobrara County experienced the largest decrease in collections, down 43.4% compared to October 2023. Park County saw the largest increase in collections, up 41.5%.

Note: Collections in October primarily reflect sales in September.

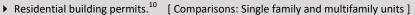

▶ Wyoming had 294,800 jobs in September, 2,900 more than a year ago, an increase of 1.0%. Private education & health added the most jobs in September (+1,000). Three sectors (retail trade, professional & business services, other services) saw a decrease of 300 jobs yearover-vear.

Note: Value in parentheses represents share of total jobs \*Includes public education and hospitals.





➡ Single family housing units permitted through the end of September 2024 increased by 289 (+28.0%) compared to 2023. The number of multifamily units increased by 130 (+91.5%) during the same period compared to 2023.
