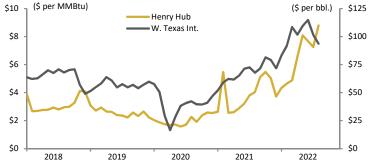

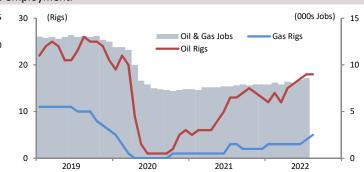
▶ Energy index: natural gas and crude oil prices, rig counts, and oil & gas employment.^{1,3,8,11}



➤ The Henry Hub natural gas price averaged \$8.79 per MMBtu in August, \$1.53 higher than a month ago. The WTI crude oil price decreased 7.8% in August compared to the previous month but increased 38.3% compared to August 2021.

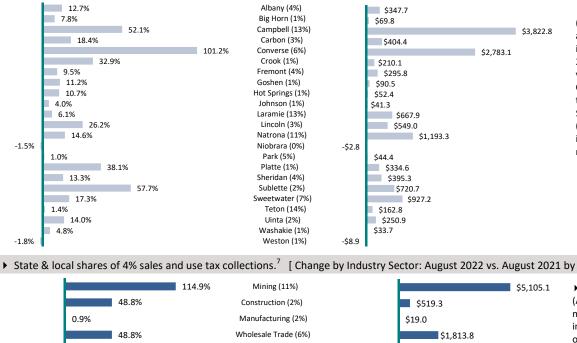

▶ In a year-over-year comparison (August 2022 vs. August 2021), sales and use tax collections statewide increased by \$13.4 million or 18.3%. 21 of the 23 counties saw year-overyear increases in collections. Campbell and Converse County saw the largest increases in collections, up \$3.8 million (+52.1%) and \$2.8 million (+101.2%), respectively. Both of these increases are mostly due to boosts in mining activity.

Note: Collections in August primarily reflect sales in July.

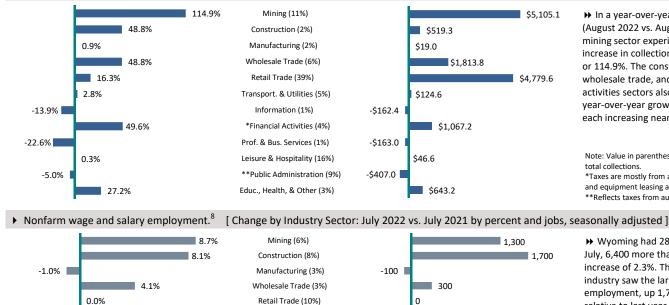

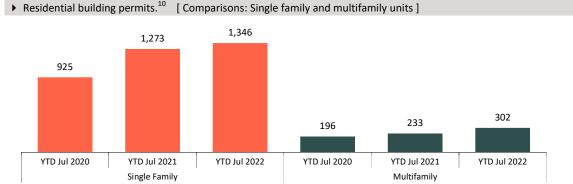
▶ In a year-over-year comparison (August 2022 vs. August 2021), the mining sector experienced the largest increase in collections, up \$5.1 million or 114.9%. The construction, wholesale trade, and financial activities sectors also saw significant year-over-year growth in collections, each increasing nearly 50%.

Note: Value in parentheses represents share of total collections *Taxes are mostly from automotive, machinery, and equipment leasing and rental. **Reflects taxes from automobile purchases.

▶ Wyoming had 284,300 jobs in

July, 6,400 more than a year ago, an increase of 2.3%. The construction industry saw the largest increase in employment, up 1,700 jobs (+8.1%) relative to last year. The mining industry saw the largest percent increase, up 8.7% year-over-year.

Note: Value in parentheses represents share of total jobs *Includes public education and hospitals.



➡ Single family housing units permitted through the end of July 2022 increased by 73 (+5.7%) compared to 2021. The number of multifamily units increased by 69 (+29.6%) during the same period compared to 2021.
