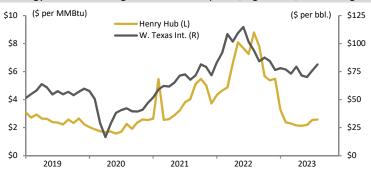
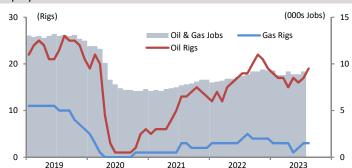

▶ Energy index: natural gas and crude oil prices, rig counts, and oil & gas employment. ¹,3,8,11



 \blacktriangleright The Henry Hub natural gas price averaged \$2.58 per MMBtu in August, \$0.03 higher than a month ago. The WTI crude oil price increased 7.0% in August compared to the previous month, but decreased 13.1% compared to August 2022.



→ Oil & gas jobs numbered 9,200 in July, an increase of 500 compared to a year ago. Average active oil rigs were 19 in August while the conventional gas rig count was 3. Note: Oil & gas jobs include both the NAICS 211 (oil and gas extraction) and NAICS 213 (support activities for mining) subsectors.

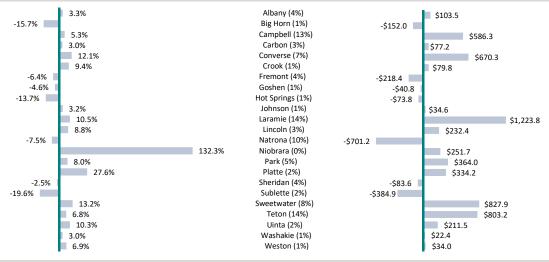

▶ State & local shares of 4% sales and use tax collections. [Change by County: August 2023 vs. August 2022 by percent and dollars (in thousands)]

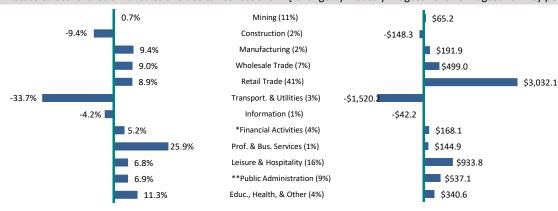


▶ In a year-over-year comparison (August 2023 vs. August 2022), sales and use tax collections statewide increased by \$4.2 million or 4.9%. 16 of the 23 counties saw year-over-year increases in collections.

Laramie County experienced the largest increase in collections, up \$1.2 million (+10.5%) compared to August 2022. Niobrara County saw the fastest increase in collections, up 132.3%.

Note: Collections in August primarily reflect sales in July.

▶ State & local shares of 4% sales and use tax collections. [Change by Industry: August 2023 vs. August 2022 by percent and dollars (in thousands)]



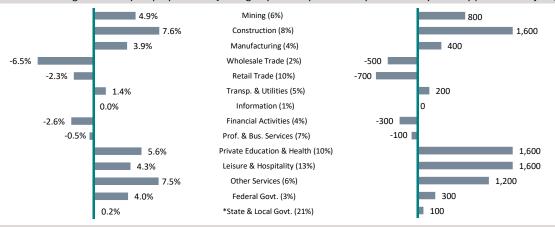
▶ In a year-over-year comparison (August 2023 vs. August 2022), the retail trade sector experienced the largest increase in collections, up \$3.0 million or 8.9%. The transportation & utilities sector experienced the largest decrease, down \$1.5 million or 33.7%.

Note: Value in parentheses represents share of total collections.

Nonfarm wage and salary employment. [Change by Industry Sector: July 2023 vs. July 2022 by percent and jobs, seasonally adjusted]

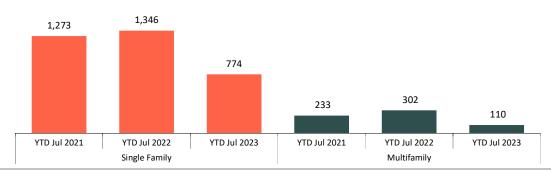


➤ Wyoming had 291,300 jobs in July, 6,200 more than a year ago, an increase of 2.2%. The retail trade sector experienced the largest decline in employment, down 700 jobs (-2.3%). Three sectors saw an increase of 1,600 jobs (construction, private education & health, leisure & hospitality).

➤ Single family housing units permitted through the end of July 2023 decreased by 572 (-42.5%) compared to 2022. The number of multifamily units decreased by 192 (-63.6%) during the same period compared to 2022.



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
