MACRO Report:

Review of Wyoming's Economy



Economic Indicators Update as of December 31, 2023

The MACRO Report is a quarterly publication comprised of charts focusing on employment, energy, state revenues, and other indicators that provide an overview of Wyoming's economy.



Economic Analysis Division (EAD)



Summary: Strong labor market and sales & use tax collections are high points for Wyoming's economy through the first half of fiscal year 2024. Persistent under \$3/MMBtu natural gas prices and recently lower oil prices lead to year-over-year declines in mineral revenues.

Positives:

- 1. Statewide employment continues to grow in November, increasing year-overyear in every month since the pandemic hit the labor market in April 2020.
- 2. The statewide November unemployment rate is 3%. This is the fifth consecutive month the unemployment rate has been at or below 3%.
- 3. Sales & use tax collections have increased year-over-year by 10% or more in four of the first six months of fiscal year 2024.

Negatives:

- 1. Oil and gas jobs are still recovering slowly from the pandemic.
- 2. Natural gas prices in December at the national benchmark (Henry Hub) averaged \$2.52/MMBtu, below \$3/MMBtu for the fifth time in the last six months.
- 3. Severance tax collections in each of the first six months of fiscal year 2024 were lower than a year ago.

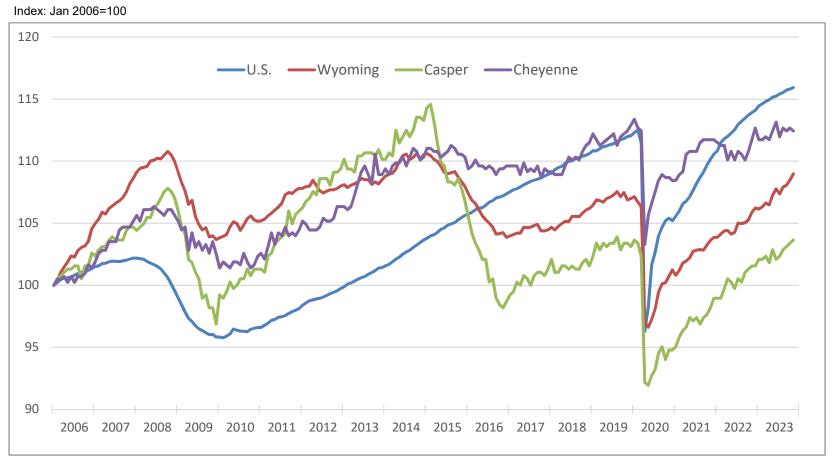
Employment:

Low Unemployment Rate and Year-Over-Year Employment Increases Lead the Way for Strong Labor Market.

- Statewide employment in November 2023 increased by 8,400 jobs (+2.9%) compared to November 2022.
- The mining sector decreased year-over-year by 300 jobs (-1.8%). The leisure & hospitality sector saw the largest increase in employment, up 2,400 jobs (+6.3%).
- The Casper MSA and Cheyenne MSA both experienced an increase in jobs year-over-year in November, up 700 and 300, respectively.
- The statewide unemployment rate for November was 3.0%, lower than the national unemployment rate of 3.7%.

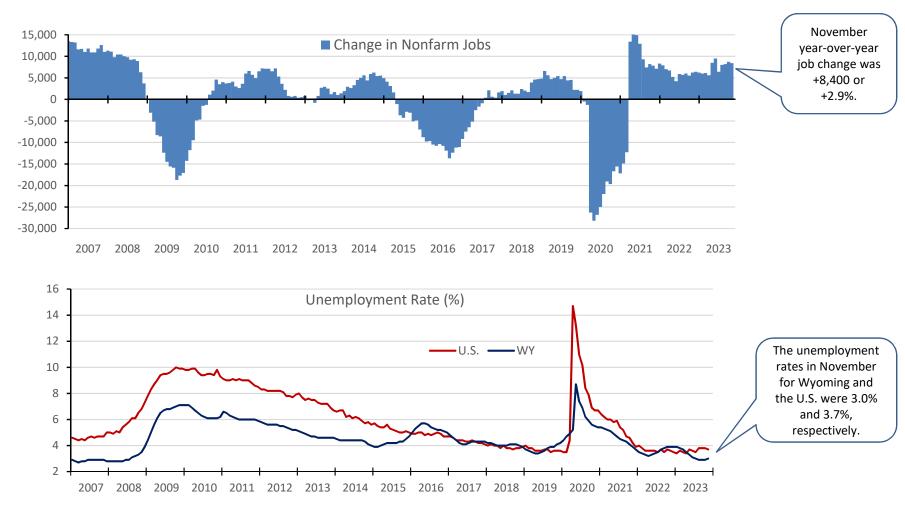
Nonfarm Employment Index: United States, Wyoming, Casper (MSA), and Cheyenne (MSA)

Through November 2023 - Seasonally Adjusted



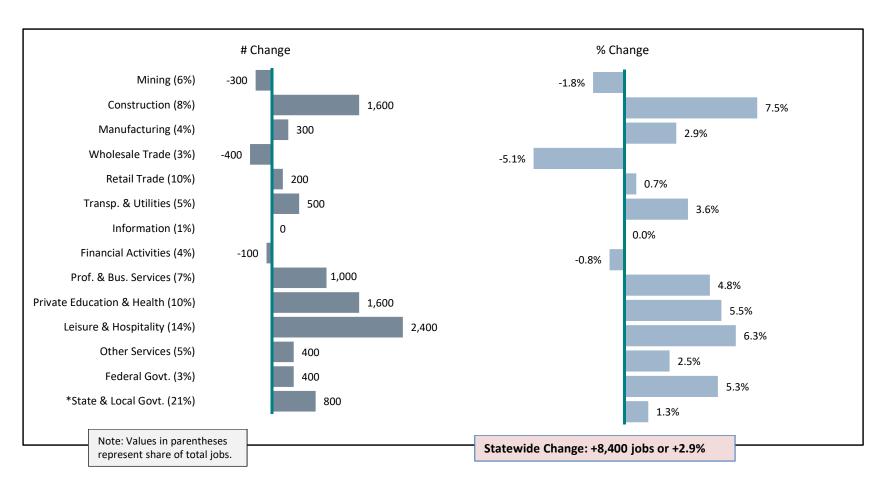

Annual Change in Nonfarm Jobs for Wyoming and Unemployment Rates for the U.S. and Wyoming – Seasonally Adjusted



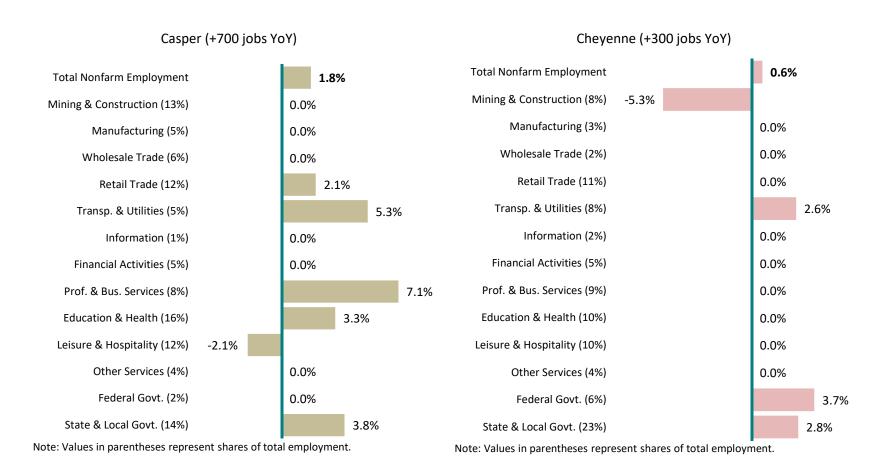

Casper (MSA) & Cheyenne (MSA) Nonfarm Employment Change: November 2023 — Year-over-Year: Not Seasonally Adjusted



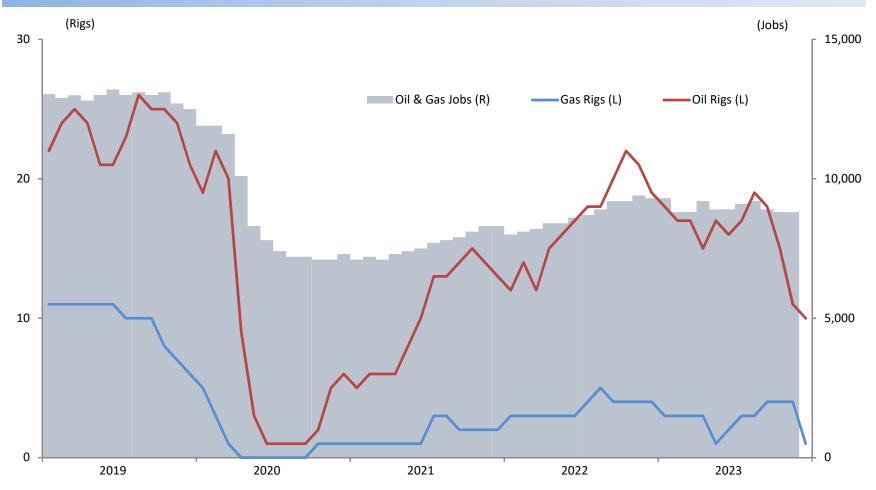

Energy:

Natural Gas Prices Stay Low, Around \$2.50/MMBtu.
Oil Prices Decline Towards \$70/barrel.

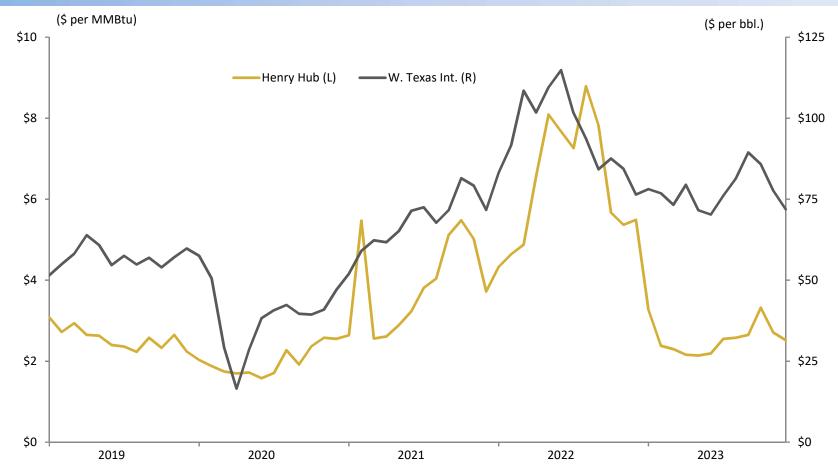
- Oil & gas jobs were at 8,800 in November 2023, 600 less (-6.4%) than November last year.
- Oil & gas rig counts were 10 and 1, respectively, in December 2023. There were 19 oil rigs and 4 gas rigs in December last year.
- The price of Henry Hub natural gas averaged \$2.52/MMBtu for the month of December, \$2.97 lower than December last year. The price of West Texas Intermediate (WTI) oil averaged \$71.90/barrel in December, \$4.54 less than December 2022.
- October 2023 calendar YTD natural gas production was down 4.4% compared to last year. Oil production YTD in October increased by 5.3% while coal production saw a decline of 4.1%.

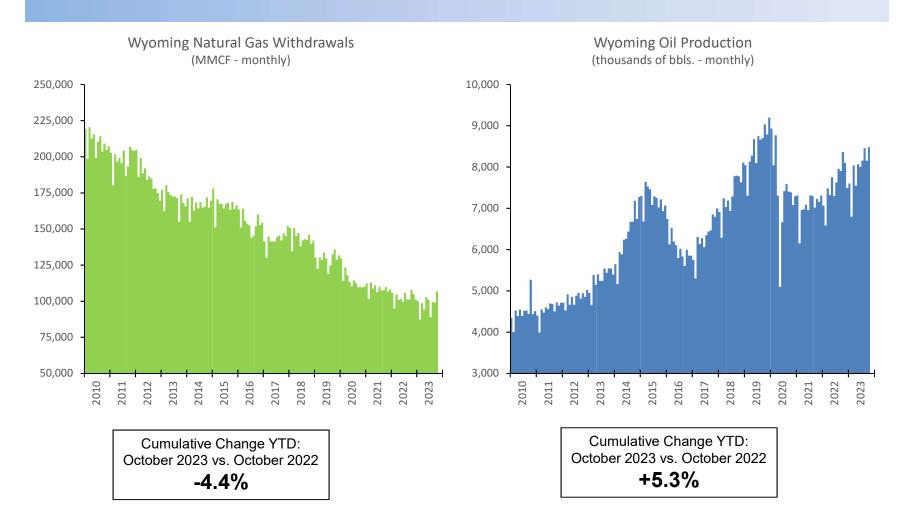
Henry Hub Natural Gas Prices and WTI Crude Oil Prices (through December)

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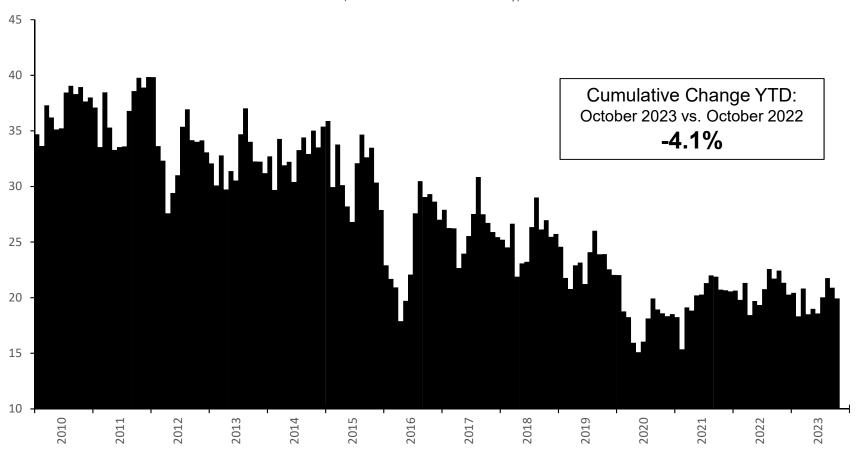
Wyoming Natural Gas and Oil Production (through October 2023)

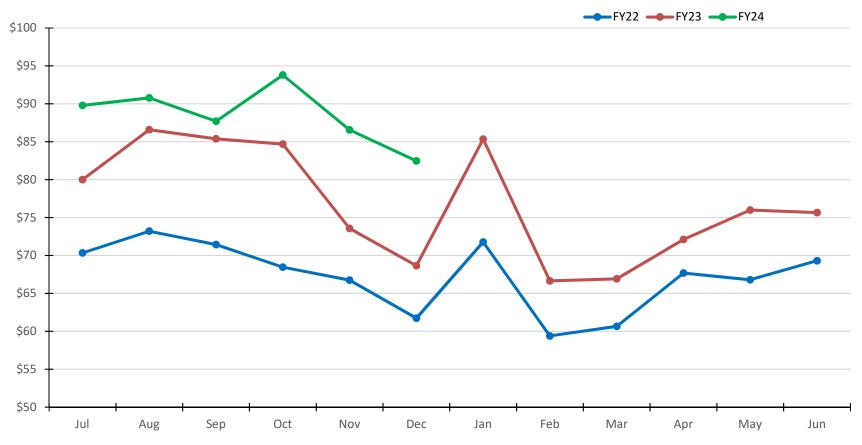
State Revenues:

Sales & Use Tax Collections are Strong through the First Half of Fiscal Year 2024.

Severance Tax Collections Subdued Amongst Continuing Low Natural Gas Prices.

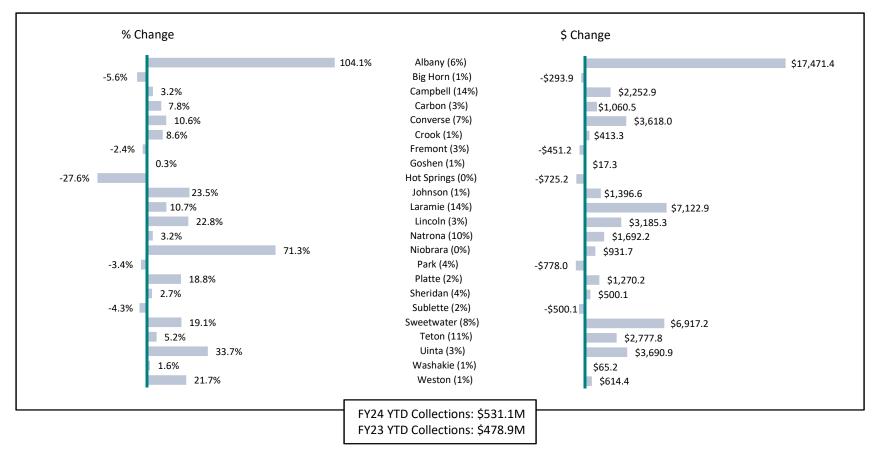
- Statewide sales and use (S&U) tax collections through the first six months of fiscal year 2024 (July-December) increased by \$52.2 million (+10.9%) compared to fiscal year 2023.
- Albany County has experienced the largest increase in sales & use tax collections, up 104.1% through the first six months of fiscal year 2024. Hot Springs County has declined the most, down 27.6% compared to last fiscal year.
- Compared to fiscal year 2023, sales and use tax collections from the mining sector increased by \$9.7 million (+16.7%) through the first six months of fiscal year 2024.
- Severance tax collections fiscal year-to-date through December are down 32.2% compared to last fiscal year.

Wyoming 4% Statewide Sales and Use Tax Collections (In Millions of Dollars)



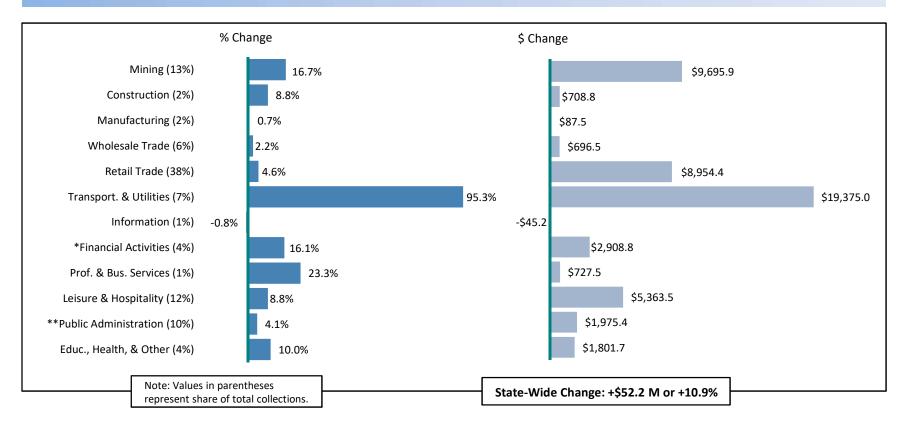

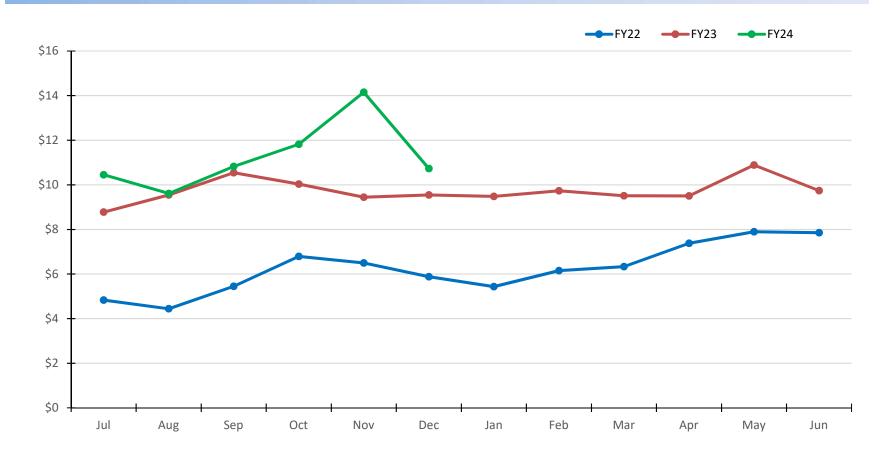

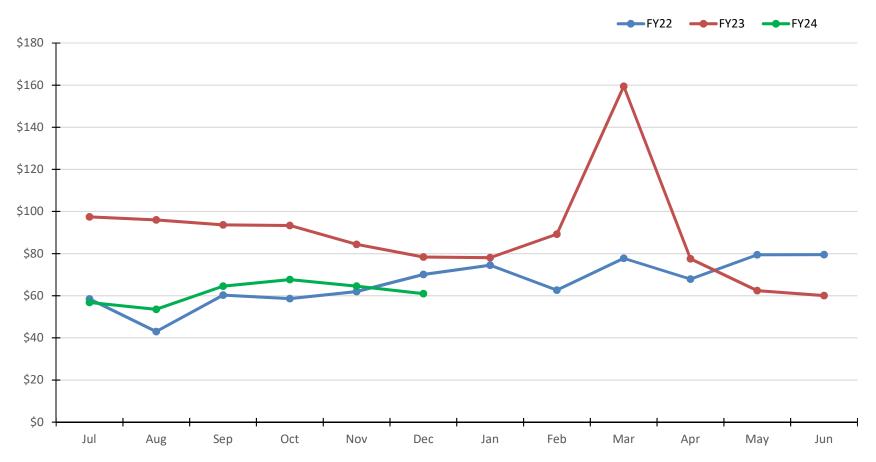

Wyoming Statewide Severance Tax Collections (In Millions of Dollars)



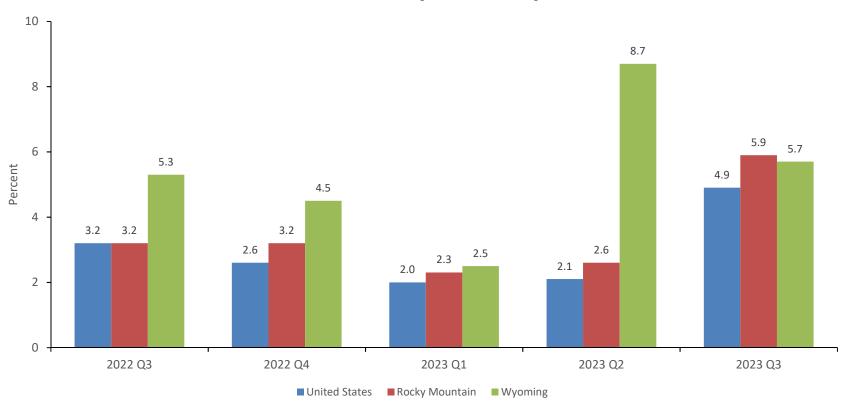

Other Indicators for the State: Real Gross Domestic Product (GDP), House Price Appreciation, and Building Permits

- Q3 2023 real GDP increased by 5.7% at an annualized rate from Q2 2023. Nationally, real GDP increased by 4.9% over this time period.
- Wyoming's house prices in Q3 2023 saw annual growth of 5.1%, higher than the U.S. (4.8%).
- The Cheyenne MSA house prices saw annual growth of 0.5% in Q3 2023, while the Casper MSA saw annual growth of 10.0%.
- Statewide single family units permitted decreased year-to-date through the end of November 2023 by 723 (-37.5%) compared to 2022. Multi-family units permitted through November 2023 decreased by 820 (-78.4%) compared to 2022.

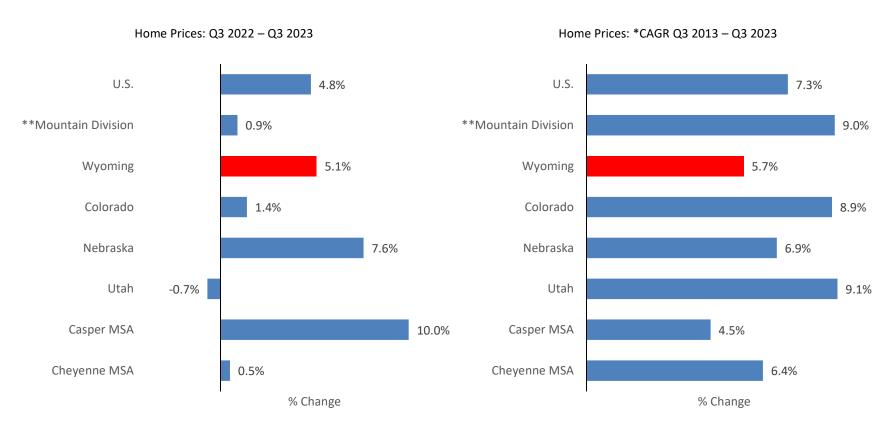
Quarterly Real Gross Domestic Product (GDP) Wyoming, Rocky Mountain Region, & United States

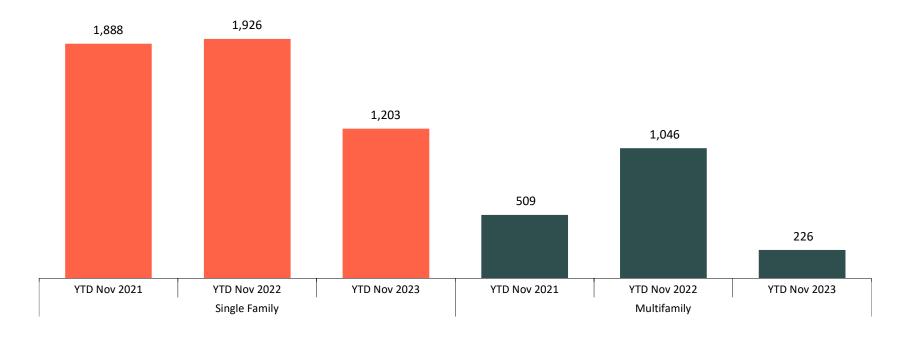
