
WYOMING'S FISCAL PICTURE Are We in Focus?

Quick Facts

2006:

- -population highest ever: 515,004 (1.2%).
- -job growth: 12,800; 4.9% (2nd in U.S.), mining 17%.
- -per capita income up 9.0% (2nd in U.S.) to \$40,676.
- -consumer spending up 10%.
- -state revenue outpacing forecast levels.
- -Inflation outpacing U.S. 4.4% vs. 2.5% .
- 2Q2007:
 - -job growth rate: 3.4%, mining sector 4%.
 - -income growth rate: 5.0%.
 - -consumer spending: not much change.
 - -mineral revenue: decline.
 - -Inflation outpacing U.S. 4.7% vs. 2.7% .

Why is mineral production important to Wyoming?

- Mineral income currently makes up close to two-thirds of State's total revenue.
- Mineral income is obtained from:
 - Severance taxes (FY07 = \$852 million; -17% from FY06).
 - Federal mineral royalties (FY07 = \$757 million; -12% from FY06).
 - Mineral property taxes (FY07 = \$1+ billion; +% FY06).
 - Coal lease bonuses (FY07 = \$170 million; -18% from FY06).
 - Sales and use taxes (FY07 = \$179 million; +34% from FY06).

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
Energy Price Sensitivity

- Crude Oil → [\$1.00 per bbl. change] ± \$6 million revenue change.
- Coal → [\$0.25 per ton price change] ± \$14 million revenue change.
- Natural Gas → [\$0.10 per mcf change] ± \$23 million revenue change.

Note: revenue sources include severance taxes, federal mineral royalties, and the school foundation portion of ad valorem taxes (based on FY06 projections). Source: January 2007 CREG Forecast and Legislative Services Office.

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
Natural Gas Price (\$/mcf): May 2000 - Sept 2007



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General Fund Revenue: FY 1980 - FY 2007



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Mineral Severance Taxes: FY1980 - FY2007



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
Federal Mineral Royalties: FY 1980 - FY 2007

(in millions of current dollars)



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

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Direct Tax Collections and Public Service Costs: 2001


(For a 4-person family with income of \$40,000 and owning home valued at \$100,000)




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Direct Tax Collections and Public Service Costs: 2006

For a 4-person family with income of \$50,000 and owning home valued at \$150,000




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

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
Other Indicators for 2Q2007:

- Foreclosure Rate: WY was the one of the lowest in the nation (nearly doubled in July).
- Existing Home Sales: U.S. = -10.8% (worst since 1991); WY = 10.8% (1st)
- Single Family Building Permits: U.S. = -25%; WY = 5%.
