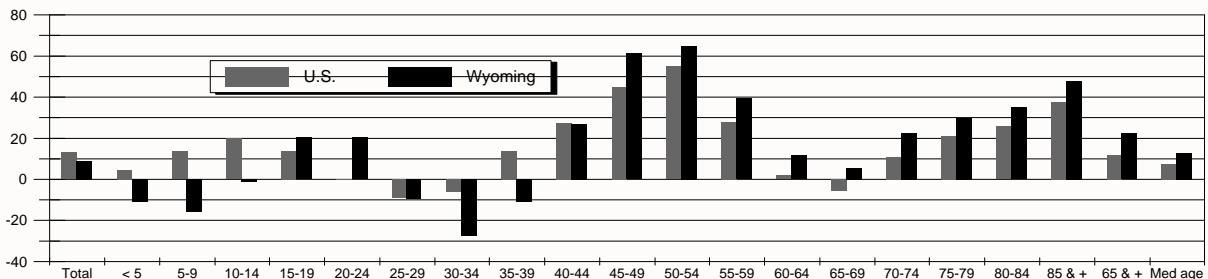

WYOMING MINERAL PRODUCTION BY COUNTY: 1996 - 2000

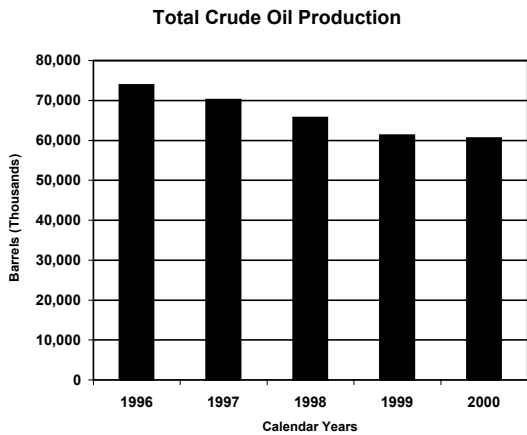

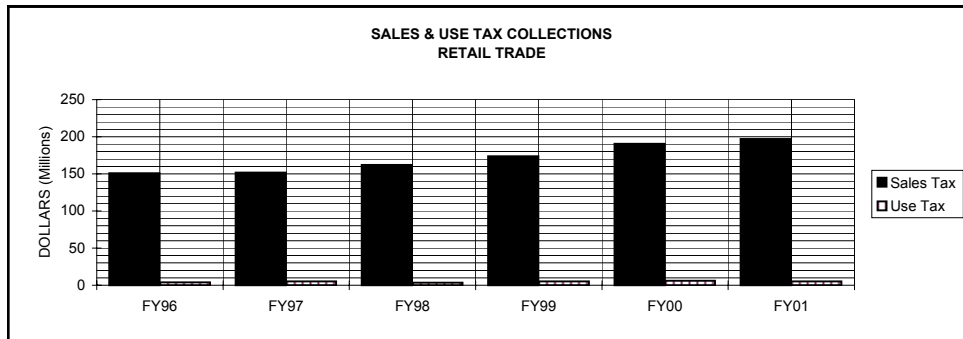
