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## INTRODUCTION

The *2006 Wyoming Employment, Income, and Gross State Product Report* serves as a compendium of federal government data, with Wyoming and its twenty-three counties detailed. The report contains several of the best indicators of Wyoming's demographic and economic growth, presented in a format which can be easily used for planning and projection purposes.

Specifically, data contained within this publication include:

- Employment data for Wyoming, Unemployment data for the U.S. and Wyoming, and data depicting Employment by Industry for both the U.S. and Wyoming.
- Income descriptions such as Total Personal Income, Per Capita Personal Income, Total Personal Income by Source & Earnings by Major Industry, and Average Wage and Salary per Job are presented for both the U.S. and Wyoming. Personal Transfer Receipts and Farm Income for Wyoming are also included in this section.
- Total Gross State Product data for the U.S. and states; Gross State Product by Industry data for the U.S. and Wyoming are covered as well.

All information contained herein, except unemployment rate data, was obtained from the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) served as the source for the unemployment rate data. Source websites are listed below:

The BEA compiles employment and income data on a place of work basis, therefore a residence adjustment has been made. Employment and income data were compiled according to the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) System from 1969 to 2000, after which the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) was instituted. Gross State Product data was compiled using NAICS. Together, the United States, Canada, and Mexico developed NAICS to improve comparability of industrial statistics across North America. Detailed information about data compilation can be found in the Data Notes section, pages 85-88. The glossary, located on pages 89-92, briefly defines the major sector classifications of both SIC and NAICS. Due to processing time, the release of a majority of the data is lagged approximately 24 to 48 months.


## Summary

### Employment

Wyoming experienced a 2.3% increase in the number of jobs, rising from 341,894 in 2003 to 349,822 in 2004. This year-over increase in employment exceeds Wyoming's historical average. Over this same period, the United States experienced only a 1.6% increase in employment.

Chart 1 compares the percentage change in employment between 2003 and 2004 on a county-by-county basis. Only two of Wyoming's twenty-three counties experienced a decrease in the number of jobs over this time period (Lincoln and Uinta counties), while seven counties enjoyed job growth rates of 3% or greater. Compared to the previous period, 2002-2003, when ten counties recorded a decrease in the number of jobs, Wyoming's economy appears to be growing more robustly than in prior years.

These employment figures measure occupied jobs, as opposed to employed persons. Therefore, if an individual were to hold two jobs, he or she would be counted twice. The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) counts all full-time and part-time jobs without distinction. Employment figures communicate the approximate size of a job market, whereas the unemployment rate is a statistical measure intended to ascertain the percentage of individuals desiring work, but who are unable to find employment in the economy.

Unemployment is defined by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) as those persons 16 years of age or older, who did not work during a particular time period, but made specific efforts to procure employment and were available to work during the reference period. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force. Those members of society purposely not seeking employment, or who are retired or disabled, are not included in the total civilian labor force, and do not affect the unemployment rate. Chart 2, on the following page, compares the 2004 and 2005 unemployment rates for the United States, Wyoming, and its counties. For 2005, county unemployment rates ranged from a low of 1.8% in Sublette County, to a high of 4.8% in Platte County. The unemployment rate for seventeen Wyoming counties declined over the 2004-2005 year period, while four counties experienced no change. Hot Springs and Goshen counties were the only two

areas in Wyoming which experienced a rise in the unemployment rate for the 2004-2005 period. In general, Wyoming recorded an unemployment rate of 3.6% in 2005, which was below the national average of 5.1%.





Chart 3, below, portrays the somewhat countercyclical relationship that exists between Wyoming and the United States regarding unemployment rates. Over the past fifteen years, Wyoming's unemployment rate has been consistently less than the national average, with the exception occurring between 1998 and 1999. Since 2000, Wyoming's job growth has kept unemployment numbers low. Unlike much of the rest of the country, Wyoming did not experience a severe increase in unemployment as a result of the high-tech sector crash of 2000. While the United States' unemployment rate spiked, Wyoming's unemployment rate increased only slightly in comparison.

In recent times, the increase in energy prices has generally hurt the U.S. economy as a whole. However, due to Wyoming's substantial mining sector, the high energy prices have spurred job growth in the state, as evidenced by the falling unemployment rate. In 2004 and 2005, strong mineral prices, particularly for oil and natural gas, and increased natural resource production contributed to the overall healthy labor market. From 2003 to 2004, the mining industry added 2,359 jobs, which amounts to an 11% increase in employment for the mining sector.



The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) was developed by the Federal Office of Management and Budget, and replaced the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system in 2000. By combining some of the twenty industrial sectors that comprise NAICS under new titles, fourteen sectors were tabulated for use in this report in order to allow for basic comparison between the two systems. Nine of these sectors are the original NAICS title, whereas the other five are unofficial sector groups entitled: Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities; Financial Activities; Professional and Business Services; Education and Health Services; and Leisure and Hospitality. Those commonly adopted sectors are defined in more detail in the Data Notes section, [on pages 85-88](#).

Chart 4, below, may be used to compare the industrial composition of employment by NAICS sectors between the United States and Wyoming. Sectors with the most noteworthy differences between the U.S. and Wyoming were Mining, Government, Manufacturing, and Professional & Business Services. In 2004, Mining accounted for 7.1% of employment in Wyoming, but only 0.5% of total employment for the United States. Likewise, a larger number of jobs were devoted to the Government sector, 20.0% of Wyoming's total employment, compared to the national percentage of 14.2%. In contrast, a considerably smaller portion of Wyoming's work force was employed in Manufacturing—3.2% compared to 8.9% for the nation on whole. The Professional & Business Services sector employed 8.2% of Wyoming residents versus 13.7% of total U.S. employment.

## Income

Total Personal Income (TPI), defined by the BEA, is a measure of income received by all residents of a particular area. TPI is the current, before-tax income of residents less personal contributions to Social Security. Income is broadly defined as income from all sources, i.e. business; federal, state, local and foreign governments; households; institutions; other labor income (such as employers' contribution to private social insurance programs); farm and non-farm proprietor income; dividends, interest and rent; and transfer payments. TPI is adjusted for seasonality; it is not adjusted for price changes or inflation. The only way to increase TPI is to increase wages or other income sources, and to increase the number of jobs. TPI does not show the distribution of income among residents.




Chart 5 illustrates the range of TPI across Wyoming counties. Laramie and Natrona counties report the largest TPI, which can be attributed to the larger population and greater number of jobs found within these counties. Niobrara reports the smallest TPI of any Wyoming county, mainly because of its relatively small population.

In order to eliminate the effects of population and population changes, Per Capita Personal Income (PCI) is calculated by dividing the TPI of an area by that area's population. PCI is a useful statistical measure for tracking income growth over time, and for making income comparisons across regions, states, and counties. Chart 6, below, displays PCI for the United States, Wyoming, and its counties. Wyoming's PCI for 2004 was \$34,279, which was about 3.7% greater than the national average of \$33,050. At the county level, PCI ranged from \$24,132 in Big Horn County to \$81,231 in Teton County. The majority of counties fell between the \$28,000 and \$34,000 range. The extremely high figure for Teton County is due, in large part, to high amounts of income from the "dividends, interest, and rent" component of TPI, which was reported as \$729,868 in 2004, and accounted for approximately 47.3% of Teton County's TPI.






Chart 7 compares the differences between the United States' and Wyoming's 2004 earnings by NAICS industry. Earnings are defined as the pay or wages of a worker or group of worker for services performed during a specific period of time. Total industry earnings for Wyoming were approximately \$11.5 billion in 2003 and \$12.4 billion in 2004, an increase of 10.6%. The Government & Government Enterprises (24.2%), Mining (15.1%), and Construction (8.6%) sectors accounted for almost half (48%) of total earnings for Wyoming. Total industry earnings for the United States increased by 5.9%, from \$7.1 trillion in 2003 to \$7.6 trillion in 2004. On a national level, the Government & Government Enterprises (16.7%), Mining (0.9%), and Construction (6.2%) sectors accounted for only 23.8% of total earnings.

To analyze annual growth in earnings by industry, the year-over percentage change for Wyoming's industry sector earnings between 2003 and 2004 are presented in Chart 8. Referring back to the 2002-2003 period, only the Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, & Hunting sector recorded a decrease (-5.1%), while the Financial Activities sector recorded the largest gain (14.9%). For the 2003-2004 period, the Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing & Hunting sector recorded a percent increase in earnings of 1.7%. The Mining and Wholesale Trade sectors experienced the largest increases in earnings, at 13.8% and 15.9% respectively. No sectors recorded a decrease in earnings for the 2003-2004 period.

## Gross State Product

Gross State Product (GSP) is a measurement of a state's output, and is derived from the summation of value added from all industries within the state. In other words, GSP is the total market value of goods and services produced by the labor and property of a state. An increase in GSP can be attributed to a rise in the quantity or price of production. Value added, also referred to as GSP originating, is equal to gross output (sales) minus intermediate inputs. GSP acts as the state counterpart to the nation's gross domestic product (GDP). According to the BEA, GSP is one of the most comprehensive measures of economic activity in a state.

Current-dollar (nominal) GSP represents the market value of goods and services, reflecting the prices and quantities of the period being measured. In contrast, constant-dollar (real) GSP measures the market value of goods and services using a constant (base year) set of prices. Using a constant set of prices eliminates the effects of inflation, and gives a more accurate depiction of GSP growth due to production changes.

NAICS GSP historical data is only available back to 1997. Chart 9 shows the trend lines for Wyoming's nominal and real GSP since the inception of NAICS. As the graph illustrates, both real and nominal GSP have been increasing over the 1997-2004 period. Real GSP (in constant dollars) is flatter than nominal GSP because it has been adjusted for inflation, and consequently gives a more accurate representation of Wyoming's output over the last eight years. Wyoming realized a 3.7% gain in GSP over the 2003-2004 period, compared to a 4.2% increase for the Rocky Mountain region (comprised of Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming), and a 4.9% increase for all states over the same period.






Chart 10, located on the following page, highlights the percent change in real GSP by industry. Fourteen of the nineteen NAICS industry sectors listed recorded increases in GSP for the 2003-2004 period. The largest gains in the state were: Management of Companies & Enterprises (41.2%); Information (21.6%); and Professional & Technical Services (8.8%). The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing & Hunting sector experienced the greatest loss in industry earnings for this period (-17.9%), followed by the Administrative & Waste Services (-3.4%) and Arts, Entertainment, & Recreation (-3.2%) sectors.


Another way to view GSP is to compare per capita GSP between regions. Chart 11 makes such a comparison between the United States, the Rocky Mountain region, and Wyoming. Over the 2004-2005 period, Wyoming experienced a 4.2% growth in real per capita GSP, while the U.S. and Rocky Mountain region experienced growth of 2.5% and 3.4%, respectively. Wyoming's per capita GSP was considerably higher than that of the United States and Rocky Mountain region after 2000, thanks to large increases in the Mining sector. Wyoming's Mining sector was responsible for 21.3% of the state's total GSP in 2004, but employed just 7.1% of Wyoming's work force.

Each industry sector's share of GSP for 2004 is presented on the following page, in Chart 12. The two-panel chart allows for comparison between the GSP by industry for the United States and Wyoming. For some industries, the value of the "end product" is easier to measure than in others. For example, the Mining sector's "end product" is a physical object, such as a ton of coal, compared to a service sector, like Government, whose "end product" is intangible.



Mining constituted 21.3% of Wyoming's GSP, compared with 1.0% for the U.S. Likewise, the Transportation, Warehousing, & Utilities sector represented a greater share (11.4%) of Wyoming's GSP than of the United States' GSP (4.9%). Conversely, Manufacturing contributed 13.8% toward national GSP, but only 4.6% towards Wyoming's GSP. Similarly, Financial Activities accounted for 20.4% of GSP for all states, and just 12.2% for Wyoming. Finally, the Professional & Business Services sector contributed 11.6% to the U.S. GSP, compared to 4.8% for Wyoming.

Although the Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing & Hunting sector represents a relatively small part of Wyoming's GSP (1.6%), the smaller, more rural areas of Wyoming depend heavily on agricultural production. In 2005, approximately 9,200 farms and ranches were operating in the State, comprising a total land area of 34.4 million acres. The average farm size is 3,739 acres, ranking Wyoming first in the nation, and is significantly higher than the national average of 444 acres per farm. Chart 13 illustrates the distribution of Wyoming farms by county.

## DATA NOTES

### EMPLOYMENT

Employment, as defined by the BLS, is the total number of persons who, during the reference week: a) performed any type of labor for pay or profit, b) worked at least 15 hours on an unpaid basis in family enterprises, or c) was temporarily absent from work for non-economic reasons. Excluded are persons whose only activity consisted of work around their own house or volunteer work. Each employed person is counted only once, even if he or she holds more than one job.

The BEA's methodology of calculating employment figure differs in that it is a count of occupied jobs, not employed people. Employment under this definition includes all full-time and part-time jobs. If an individual holds two separate jobs at any given time, the individual is counted twice, since two employment positions are occupied.

Unemployment rates are taken from the BLS. Unemployed persons include those persons who did not work during the reference week, were available for work, and had made specific efforts to find employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force.

### TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME

Total personal income (TPI), as defined by the BEA, is the current income of residents of a particular area from all sources. It is measured after deductions of personal contributions to Social Security, but before personal tax deductions have been made. It includes income received from businesses; federal, state, and local governments; households; institutions; foreign governments; other labor income (such as employers' contributions to private social insurance programs); farm and non-farm proprietor income; dividends, interest, and rent; and transfer payments. It is the only key economic indicator which is adjusted for seasonality; it is not, however, adjusted for price changes.

Because TPI is a measure of income received, estimates of state and local area personal income should reflect the residence of the income recipients. Of the six major components of personal income, three are recorded on a place-of-residence basis. They are transfer payments (or transfer receipts); dividends, interest, and rental income; and proprietors' income. The data available at the state and county level for wages and salaries, other labor income (OLI), supplements to wages and salaries, and personal contributions for social insurance are estimated from data that are recorded on a place-of-work basis.

Four adjustments are made to earnings by place of work to derive total personal income by place of residence. Following these adjustments, total earnings still comprise the bulk of total personal income. Beginning with total labor and proprietor earnings, the first adjustment is made by deducting contributions for social insurance. Although these are considered part of employee total earnings for the current period, social insurance contributions are not received during the current period and are, therefore, not included in personal income.

The second adjustment is made for employee place of residency. The BEA defines employee residency as the location at which the employee is residing while employed. An example of this type of adjustment is a regular occurrence in Sheridan County, Wyoming. Here, a significant number of employees work at coal mines in Montana while residing in Sheridan County. Earnings for these employees show up as earnings data for Montana. However, in the derivation of personal income by place of residence, an adjustment is made to reallocate these earnings as personal income for Wyoming. This residency adjustment for Wyoming is, therefore, the net effect of all interstate place-of-work versus place-of-residence discrepancies.

A third adjustment is made by appending dividends, interest, and rent income. Dividends are payments in cash or other assets, excluding stock, by for-profit corporations to non-corporate stockholders in the state. Interest is the monetary and imputed interest income of persons from all sources. Rental income is the monetary income of persons from the rental of real property; the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of non-farm dwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources.

The fourth and final adjustment is the addition of transfer payments (or transfer receipts). Transfer payments are income payments to persons, generally in monetary form, for which they do not render current services. As a component of personal income, they are payments by governments and businesses to individuals and nonprofit institutions.

Once these four adjustments to the earnings by place of work component are made, the result is total personal income by place of residence. Personal income effectively measures the size of consumer markets. When presented by industry of origin, as in this report, earnings can also be interpreted as a measure of the size of industrial markets.

Per capita personal income (PCI) is calculated by dividing total personal income of an area by the total population of this area. Per capita personal income is a useful tool to compare income across regions, states, and counties. Per capita personal income can also be used to track income growth over time because it removes the effects of population changes on TPI.

## **GROSS STATE PRODUCT**

The BEA calculates gross state product (GSP) for a state as the sum of gross state product originating (GSPO) by industry in all industries. This measure of GSP is the state counterpart to the Nation's gross domestic product (GDP) by industry from the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

The GSPO by industry is the contribution of each industry, including government, to GSP. An industry's GSPO, often referred to as its "value added", is equal to its gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory change) minus its intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased from other industries or imported).

For each industry, the estimate of gross product is composed of four components (estimated in current-dollars only): (1) Compensation of employees; (2) proprietors' income with inventory valuation adjustment (IVA) and capital consumption allowances; (3) indirect business tax and non-tax liability (IBT); and (4) other, mainly capital related, charges. Most of the compensation and proprietors' income components of GSP are primarily based on BEA's estimates of earnings by place of work, an aggregate in the state personal income series. The IBT component of GSP reflects liabilities charged to business expense, most of which are sales and property taxes levied by state and local governments. The capital charges component of GSP comprises corporate profits with IVA, corporate capital consumption allowances, business transfer payments, net interest, rental income of persons, and subsidies less current surplus of government enterprises.

Current and constant (chained) dollar estimates of GSP by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) industry classification are presented for the U.S. and states for the years 1997-2004. Current and constant dollar estimates of GSP by NAICS industry classification are also presented for Wyoming and its counties for 1997-2004. Current dollars represent the market value of an item, which reflects the prices and quantities of the period being measured, and has not been adjusted for inflation. Constant (chained) dollars are a measure used to express real prices, which are inflation-adjusted, and reflect the purchasing power of current dollars in regards to some reference year.

## INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATIONS

The industry classifications for the years 1993-2000 represent groupings in accordance with the revised 1987 Standard Industrial Classification Manual, published by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. The Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system was developed for use in the classification of establishments by the type of activity in which they are engaged, for purposes of facilitating the collection, tabulation, presentation, and analysis of data relating to establishments, and for promoting uniformity and comparability. These ten major industrial sectors (one-digit SIC codes) are: 1) Agriculture; 2) Mining; 3) Construction; 4) Manufacturing; 5) Transportation, Communication, and Public Utilities (TCPU); 6) Wholesale Trade; 7) Retail Trade; 8) Finance, Insurance, and Real Estate (FIRE); 9) Services; and 10) Government.

The Federal Office of Management and Budget replaced the SIC system with the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Industry classifications for the years 2001-2003 represent this change in industry groupings, and are classified in accordance with the 2002 NAICS. The twenty major industrial sectors that comprise NAICS are: 1) Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; 2) Mining; 3) Utilities; 4) Construction; 5) Manufacturing; 6) Wholesale Trade; 7) Retail Trade; 8) Transportation and Warehousing; 9) Information; 10) Finance and Insurance; 11) Real Estate and Rental and Leasing; 12) Professional, Scientific, & Technical Services; 13) Management of Companies & Enterprises; 14) Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services; 15) Educational Services; 16) Health Care and Social Assistance; 17) Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation; 18) Accommodation and Food Services; 19) Other Services (except public administration); and 20) Public Administration.

These twenty sectors were condensed to only fourteen sectors for purposes of this report. The combined sectors are listed under new titles:

- **Transportation, Warehousing, and Utilities:** comprised of: 3) Utilities; and 8) Transportation and Warehousing.
- **Financial Activities:** comprised of: 10) Finance and Insurance; and 11) Real Estate and Rental and Leasing.
- **Professional and Business Services:** comprised of: 12) Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services; 13) Management of Companies and Enterprises; and 14) Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services.
- **Educational and Health Services:** comprised of: 15) Educational Services; and 16) Health Care and Social Assistance.
- **Leisure and Hospitality:** comprised of: 17) Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation; and 18) Accommodation and Food Services.

It is important to note that SIC and NAICS industry classifications are not directly comparable. The only exception to this is public administration and its subcategories.

For purposes of industry classification, an establishment is an economic unit, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted, or where services or industrial operations are performed. Each establishment is assigned an industry code on the basis of its primary activity, which is determined by the principal product (or group of products) produced or distributed, or the services rendered. Ideally, the principal product or service should be determined by its relative share of "value added" at the establishment. In practice, however, it is rarely possible to obtain this measure for individual products or services. Typically, it is necessary to adopt some other criterion which may be expected to give approximately the same results in determining the primary activity of an establishment.

Occasionally, in activity-diversified establishments, the appropriate measure cannot be determined or estimated for each product or service. In some instances, an industry classification based upon the recommended output measure will not adequately represent the relative

economic importance of each of the varied activities carried on at such establishments. In such cases, employment or payroll information should be used to determine the primary activity of a particular establishment.

Due to this broad categorization of multi-sector establishments under one code, estimates will frequently be understated in one sector and overstated in another. While this does not influence the accuracy of either county or state totals, it will obviously have an effect upon estimates for a particular sector.

Data from business tax returns, provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), are used to generate detailed industrial estimates of self-employed individuals at the national level. At the state level, FICA (Federal Insurance Contributions Act) records on individuals making self-employed contributions are used to obtain first round estimates by industry. This has resulted in an increase in the count of self-employed individuals, which was prompted by several factors. First, those proprietors who were previously counted only once in the Current Population Survey (CPS), but who are in fact proprietors of two or more businesses, are now being counted once for each business. Additionally, all persons formerly classified solely as wage and salary employees, but who also spend some time as sole proprietors or participating partners in businesses, are now being counted in each of their multiple positions.

## GLOSSARY

### ***Standard Industry Classification (SIC)***

**Agriculture, Forestry, and Fishing:** Includes establishments primarily engaged in agricultural production, forestry, commercial fishing, hunting and trapping, and related services.

**Construction** Includes establishments primarily engaged in construction, defined to include new work, additions, alterations, reconstruction, and repairs.

**Finance, Insurance, and Real Estate:** Includes establishments operating primarily in the fields of finance, insurance, and real estate.

**Manufacturing:** Includes all establishments such as plants, factories, and mills engaged in the mechanical or chemical transformation of materials or substances into new products.

**Mining:** Includes all establishments primarily engaged in mining. Mining is defined, in the broad sense, to include the extraction of solid, liquid, and gaseous minerals occurring naturally, as well as other preparation customarily done at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity.

**Government:** Includes the executive, legislative, judicial, administrative, and regulatory activities of federal, state, local, and international governments.

**Retail Trade:** Includes establishments engaged in selling merchandise for personal or household consumption and rendering services incidental to the sale of the goods.

**Services:** Includes establishments primarily engaged in providing a wide variety of services (i.e. legal, health, and repair) for individuals, businesses, government establishments, and other organizations.

**Transportation and Public Utilities:** Includes establishments providing, to the general public or other business enterprises, passenger and freight transportation, communication services, electricity, gas, steam, water, sanitary services, and the U.S. Postal Service.

**Wholesale Trade:** Includes establishments or places of business primarily engaged in selling merchandise to retailers, or acting as agents or brokers in buying merchandise or for selling merchandise to retailers.

### ***North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)***

**11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting:** The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing and Hunting sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or their natural habitats.

**21 Mining:** The Mining sector comprises establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. The term mining is used in the broad sense to include quarrying, well operations, beneficiating (e.g., crushing, screening, washing, and flotation), and other preparation customarily performed at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity.

**22 Utilities:** The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities.

**23 Construction:** The construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g., highways and utility systems). Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in subdividing land for sale as building sites also are included in this sector.

**31-33 Manufacturing:** The Manufacturing sector comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing, except in cases where the activity is appropriately classified in Sector 23, Construction.

**42 Wholesale Trade:** The Wholesale Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The merchandise described in this sector includes the outputs of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing.

**44-45 Retail Trade:** The Retail Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The retailing process is the final step in the distribution of merchandise; retailers are, therefore, organized to sell merchandise in small quantities to the general public. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore retailers.

**48-49 Transportation and Warehousing:** The Transportation and Warehousing sector includes industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation. Establishments in these industries use transportation equipment or transportation related facilities as a productive asset. The type of equipment depends on the mode of transportation. The modes of transportation are air, rail, water, road, and pipeline.

**51 Information:** The Information sector comprises establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data.

**52 Finance and Insurance:** The Finance and Insurance sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions (transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets) and/or in facilitating financial transactions.

**53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing:** The Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks.

**54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services:** The Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector comprises establishments that specialize in performing professional,

scientific, and technical activities for others. These activities require a high degree of expertise and training. The establishments in this sector specialize according to expertise and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries and, in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services.

**55 Management of Companies and Enterprises:** The Management of Companies and Enterprises sector comprises (1) establishments that hold the securities of (or other equity interests in) companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or (2) establishments (except government establishments) that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic or organizational planning and decision-making role of the company or enterprise. Establishments that administer, oversee, and manage may hold the securities of the company or enterprise.

**56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services:** The Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services sector comprises establishments performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations. These essential activities are often undertaken in-house by establishments in many sectors of the economy. The establishments in this sector specialize in one or more of these support activities and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries and, in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services.

**61 Educational Services:** The Educational Services sector comprises establishments that provide instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects. This instruction and training is provided by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges, universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and accommodation services to their students.

**62 Health Care and Social Assistance:** The Health Care and Social Assistance sector comprises establishments providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities. The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. The services provided by establishments in this sector are delivered by trained professionals. All industries in the sector share this commonality of process, namely, labor inputs of health practitioners or social workers with the requisite expertise. Many of the industries in the sector are defined based on the educational degree held by the practitioners included in the industry.

**71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation:** The Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation sector includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing; (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests.

**72 Accommodation and Food Services:** The Accommodation and Food Services sector comprises establishments providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, and beverages for immediate consumption. The sector includes both accommodation and food services establishments because the two activities are often combined at the same establishment.

**81 Other Services (except Public Administration):** The Other Services (except Public Administration) sector comprises establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system. Establishments in this sector are primarily engaged in activities, such as equipment and machinery repairing, promoting or administering religious activities, grant making, advocacy, and providing dry-cleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services.

**92 Public Administration:** The Public Administration sector consists of establishments of federal, state, and local government agencies that administer, oversee, and manage public programs and have executive, legislative, or judicial authority over other institutions within a given area. These agencies also set policy, create laws, adjudicate civil and criminal legal cases, provide for public safety and for national defense. In general, government establishments in the Public Administration sector oversee governmental programs and activities that are not performed by private establishments. Establishments in this sector typically are engaged in the organization and financing of the production of public goods and services, most of which are provided for free or at prices that are not economically significant.
