## INTRODUCTION

The *2008 Wyoming Employment, Income, and Gross Domestic Product Report* serves as a compendium of Federal government data, highlighting Wyoming and its twenty-three counties. The report contains several of the best indicators of Wyoming's demographic and economic growth and is presented in a format which can be easily used for planning and projection purposes.

Specifically, data contained within the publication include:

- Total employment, Employment by Industry, and Unemployment Rates for the United States, individual states, Wyoming, and counties.
- Income descriptions such as Total Personal Income, Per Capita Personal Income, Total Personal Income by Source and Earnings by Major Industry, and Average Wage and Salary per Job are presented for the United States, Wyoming, and counties.
- Personal Transfer Receipts and Farm Income for Wyoming.
- Total Gross Domestic Product data for the United States and individual states; Gross Domestic Product by Industry for the United States and Wyoming.

All information contained herein, except unemployment data, was obtained from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) served as the source for the unemployment rates. Source websites are listed below:

The BEA compiles employment and income data on a place of work basis, therefore a residence adjustment has been made. Employment and income data were compiled according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Gross Domestic Product was also compiled using NAICS. NAICS is a classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability of industrial statistics across North America. Detailed information about data compilation is located in the Data Notes, Glossary, and Industry Classification section, pages 93 - 96. Definitions of the major NAICS sector classifications are found on pages 97 - 100. Due to processing time, the release of a majority of the data is lagged approximately 24 to 48 months.

## SUMMARY

### Employment

The United States experienced an increase in total employment between the years 2005 and 2006, from 174 million to 178 million occupied jobs, or 2.4 percent. The Nation reported an increase of 6.8 percent over the past five years. The State of Nevada led with an increase of 25.1 percent over the five year period. Wyoming ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the Nation in regards to employment with an increase of 13 percent from the years 2001 to 2006. A large portion of this five year increase is created from the enormous annual increase that Wyoming experienced from 2005 to 2006. Showing growth in occupied jobs of 4.6 percent from 2005 to 2006 is a great accomplishment for the Equality State, ranking it 4<sup>th</sup> in the Nation. Following the news of the strong growth of Wyoming's employment, population in 2007 grew by 2 percent from one year earlier, the largest increase Wyoming has seen in 25 years. This sheds light on Wyoming's economy, proving that a successful industry, such as mining, has the ability to create jobs and attract many new individuals, boosting the population, employment, and in turn, the economy.

Analyzing the various counties within Wyoming, many showed stable growth over the past five years in regards to employment. Made up of twenty-three counties, only one county experienced a decrease in employment, Hot Springs. On the other hand, during the same time period, counties such as Campbell and Sweetwater experienced increases of over 20 percent and Sublette over 50 percent. This is astonishing growth, which can be attributed to the boom in the mining industry. These counties have offered numerous high paying mining jobs, drawing individuals and families into the area, creating growth in the economy, employment, and population at the local level.

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates total employment by surveying individual employers and/or establishments. These employers report the number of both full-time and part-time workers. Employees, sole proprietors, and active partners are included, but unpaid family members and volunteers are not counted. These employment figures represent number of jobs as opposed to workers, so if an individual were to hold two jobs, he or she would be counted twice.

**Chart 1: Percent Change in Employment by County: 2001 - 2006**

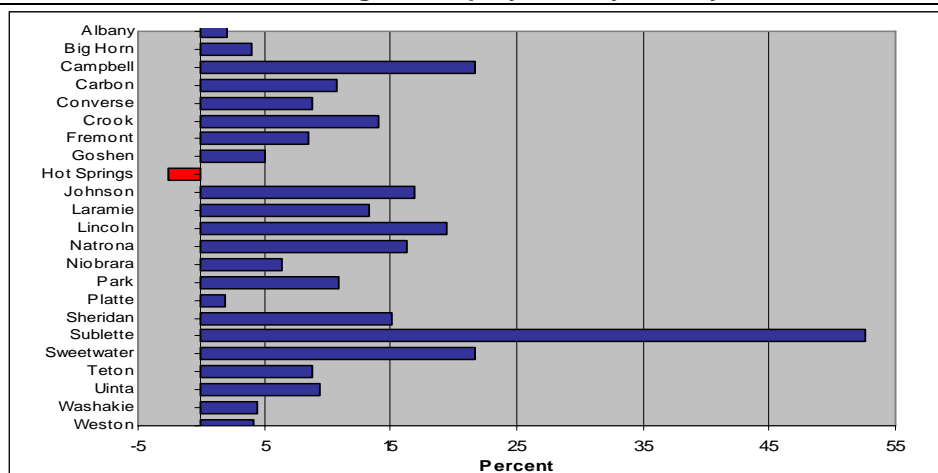


Chart 1 illustrates the percent change in employment for Wyoming's counties for 2001 to 2006. Twenty-two out of the twenty-three counties experienced positive growth, and Sweetwater and Campbell counties experienced an increase of over 20 percent while Sublette County saw the largest growth, 52.6 percent over the 5 year period. The tremendous growth was largely due to

the flourish in those counties caused by mining activities. Overall, Chart 1 portrays a positive picture for Wyoming and its counties in regards to employment growth.

In the United States Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector experienced the largest employment increase of the NAICS sectors in 2006, 8.6 percent. From 2001 – 2006, 2.2 million jobs were created in this sector. In contrast, growing 41 percent over five years and a 2005 to 2006 growth of 14.7 percent, the Mining sector was the clear employment leader in Wyoming's economy. Construction was not far behind, reporting a 13.3 percent increase from 2005 - 2006. The increase in construction could also be attributed to the mining activities occurring in the state. Leading the increases were mining employment in Sheridan, Sublette, and Fremont counties, reporting percentage increases of 40.7, 35.2, and 23.2 respectively from 2005 - 2006. Leading the Construction sector employment increases were Carbon, Lincoln, and Goshen counties with annual growth of 55.7, 26.7, and 23.7 percent respectively. The large growth of construction in Carbon and Lincoln Counties is largely due to the mining sector and housing needs, whereas the increase in Goshen County is fueled by a new prison located in Torrington, which is slated to be completed in 2009. The counties with large increases in construction employment also could be due to the fact that many of these counties are small and starting off with a low base, any growth would appear to be large such as Carbon, Goshen, Johnson, and Sublette Counties.

**Chart 2: United States and Wyoming Employment by NAICS Industry, 2006**

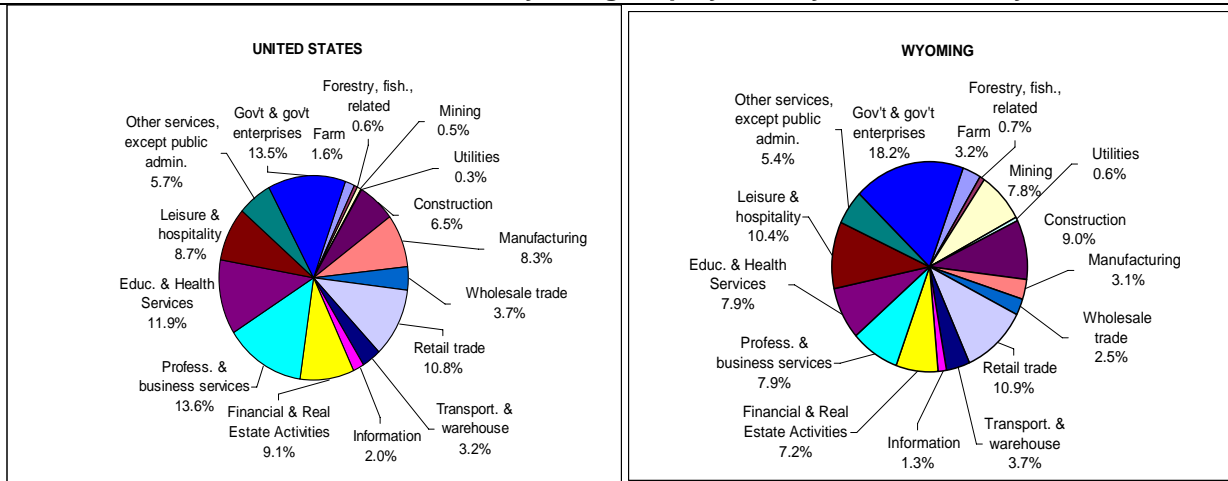


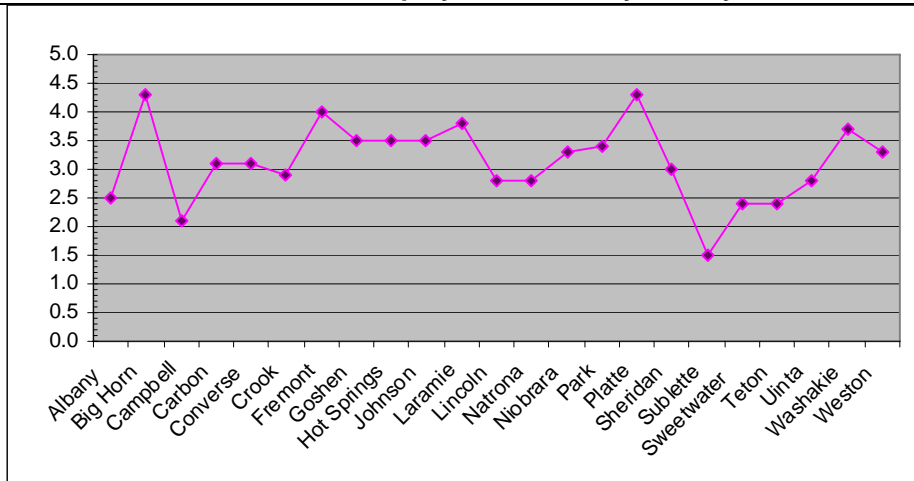
Chart 2 illustrates the proportion of employment for each of the NAICS sectors. One chart shows the make-up of employment in the United States, while the other depicts Wyoming's employment. The sector with the largest proportion of employment for the United States in 2006 was Professional and Business Services, holding 13.6 percent of total employment. Defined by NAICS, the Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services consists of activities performed for others requiring a high degree of expertise and training. This may include legal advice and representation, accounting services, engineering, and veterinary services. The sectors with the smallest percentage of employment for the U.S. were Utilities and Mining, reporting 0.3 and 0.5 percent respectively. Conversely, Wyoming experiences success and economic benefits from the mining industry and comprised 7.8 percent of jobs in Wyoming's economy. Other sectors leading Wyoming's employment are Government and Government Enterprises, as well as Leisure and Hospitality, reporting 10.4 and 7.8 percent respectively. Leisure and Hospitality hold a great portion of Wyoming's employment due to Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park, and the premier ski town of Jackson Hole.

Unemployment is defined as a person who is currently over the age of sixteen, who is not employed, but is capable of working and is actively seeking employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force.

In 2007, the United States recorded an unemployment rate of 4.6 percent, whereas Wyoming, scoring 4<sup>th</sup> in the Nation, experienced a rate of 3.0 percent. Hawaii registered the lowest unemployment, taking 1<sup>st</sup> with a rate of 2.6 percent. Wyoming's counties also recorded low unemployment rates; every county recorded a value under the rate for the United States. The lowest in the State was Sublette County with a rate of 1.5 percent and Platte and Big Horn Counties had the highest rates of unemployment, 4.3 percent. The unemployment rate for Wyoming has been decreasing at a steady rate since 1997 and hit another low in 2007.

Chart 3 shows the unemployment rates for the counties within Wyoming. As seen in the chart, the counties with the lowest unemployment rates include Sublette, Campbell, and Sweetwater, which are also areas that have been significantly affected by the mineral industry. While these areas attract many new residents due to the numerous job opportunities, more rural counties within the State find it more difficult to offer promising jobs. Rural areas such as Goshen and Platte Counties have experienced population declines due to the lack of jobs. The residents of these areas are relocating to places with more employment opportunities. Wyoming has been faced with the problem of keeping younger workers in the State. Without the availability of careers that offer stimulating and high growth opportunities, many young people find job prospects outside of Wyoming.

In summary, for employment in Wyoming, the overall growth was achieved largely due to the boom in the mining industry, which also caused other sectors, such as construction, to be positively affected. The creation of new jobs in otherwise unpopulated areas spurs additional employment in other businesses and service sectors. The construction sector is stimulated by the need to build more homes, businesses, infrastructure, and government projects. Retail, food service, and entertainment establishments increase; completing the creation of a lifestyle and economy in these areas experiencing population increases.

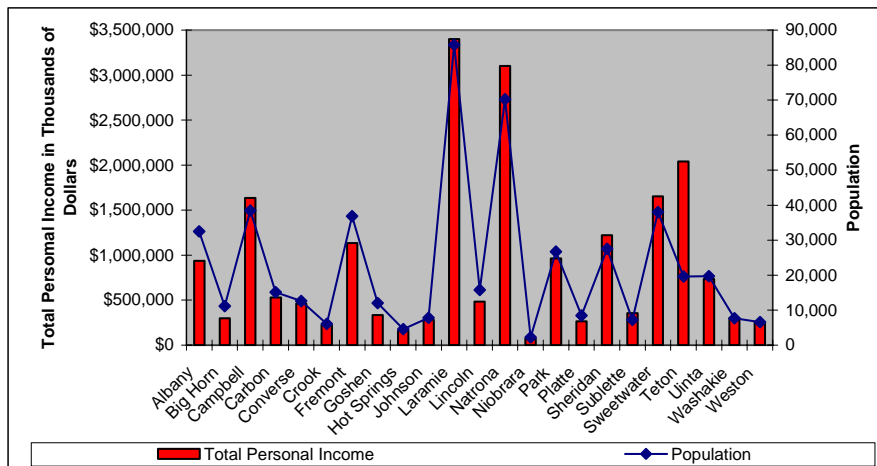
**Income**

Income is broadly defined as revenue from all sources, i.e. businesses; Federal, State, local, and foreign governments; households; and institutions. Total Personal Income (TPI) is a measure of income received by all residents of a particular area from all sources within that area. TPI is calculated after deduction of personal contributions to Social Security, but before personal tax deductions. This value includes net earnings by place of residence, rental income, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and transfer receipts. The change in TPI for the United States between the years of 2005 to 2006 was 6.7 percent, while Wyoming, ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Nation, experienced an increase of 10.3 percent. Following Louisiana with an increase of



20.6 percent, TPI in Wyoming was \$21 billion in 2006. Seen in Chart 4 below, Laramie County held the highest Total Personal Income with just over \$3 billion, while Niobrara County reported the lowest, \$74 million and the only negative percent change from 2005 to 2006. The chart illustrates the relationship between the population and Total Personal Income. Laramie County leads Wyoming with 85,783 residents while Niobrara County reports the lowest population of only 2,212 in 2006. Also seen on the graph are areas where TPI is not influenced by population. Those with the greatest disconnection are Teton and Natrona Counties, showing a TPI at a higher level than that of their population. Teton County, known for the resort town of Jackson Hole attracts many wealthy visitors and residents, while Natrona County has experienced a boost from the mining activity. The counties with the largest increases in TPI were Sublette and Campbell, reporting 21.2 and 17 percent increases respectively from 2005 to 2006. Sublette and Campbell counties possess a booming mining industry which explains the great increase in Total Personal Income for those areas.

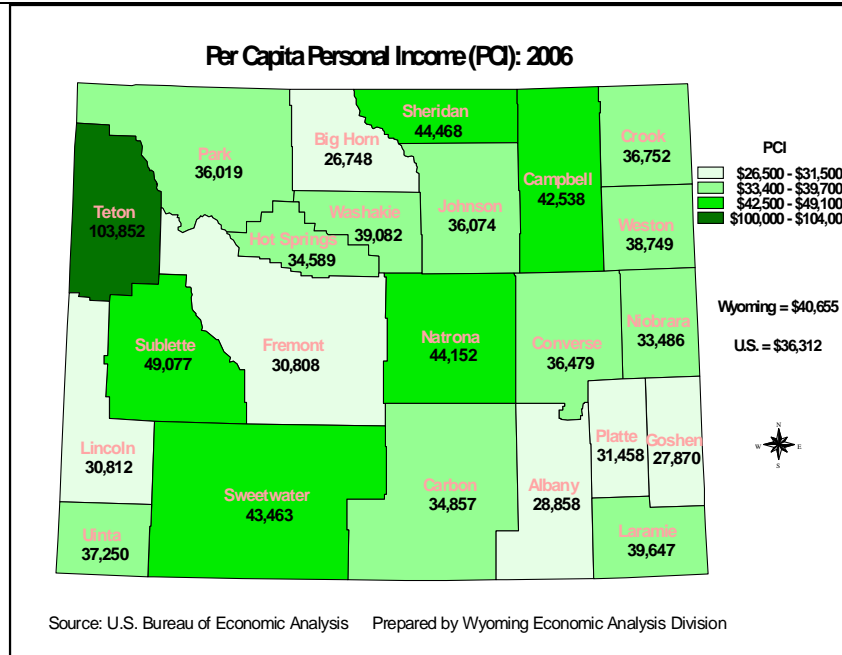
**Chart 4: Total Personal Income and Population by County: 2006**



Per capita income is defined as the Total Personal Income of a particular area divided by the population of that area. In 2006 Wyoming was ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in the Nation with a per capita income of \$40,655, an increase of 8.9 percent from 2005. Wyoming's increase ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Nation, behind Louisiana with a 2005 to 2006 growth of 27.8 percent. The United States reported a per capita income of \$36,714 in 2006, an increase of 5.6 percent. For the last five years, Wyoming has reported a greater per capita income than the United States. This is attributed to Wyoming's low population and the boost it has experienced through increased mining activity. Teton County led Wyoming with a per capita income of \$103,852, which is twice the amount of the next highest county, Sublette, reporting \$49,077. Teton County has a large numerator, Total Personal Income and a low denominator, population, equaling a high per capita income. As Total Personal Income includes income from everything, not simply earnings, Teton County receives a great amount of money from investment income, dividends, etc. It is a very wealthy community made up of a small number of individuals which in turn reports of a high per capita income. The county with the lowest per capita income was Big Horn with a value of \$26,748.

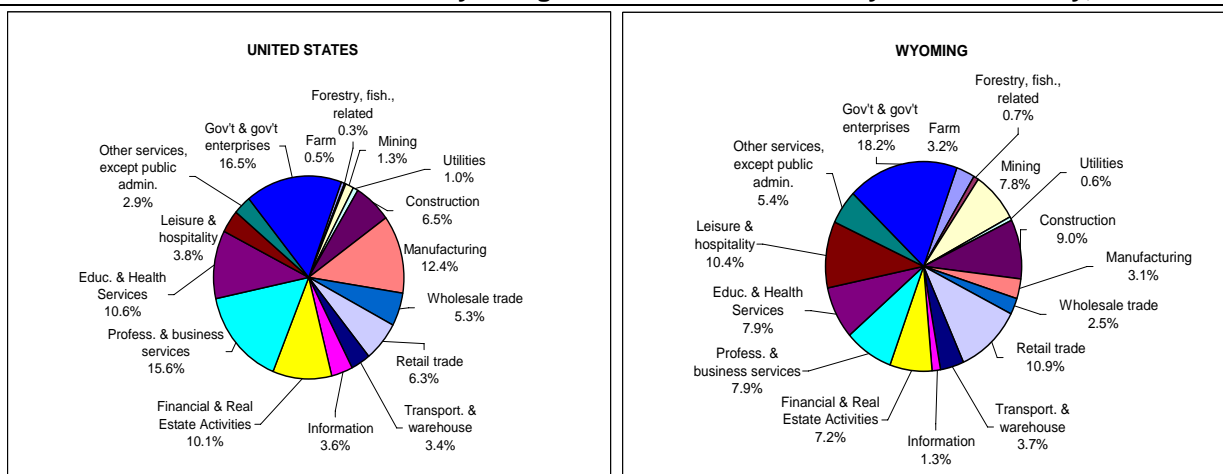
Niobrara was the only county that experienced a decrease in per capita income. Counties such as Sublette, Sweetwater, and Campbell experienced percentage increases of 15.1, 13.4, and 12.7 respectively. Again, this is attributed to successful mining activity in these areas. Chart 5 provides a visual depiction of the various counties, their locations, as well as their range and values of per capita income in 2006.

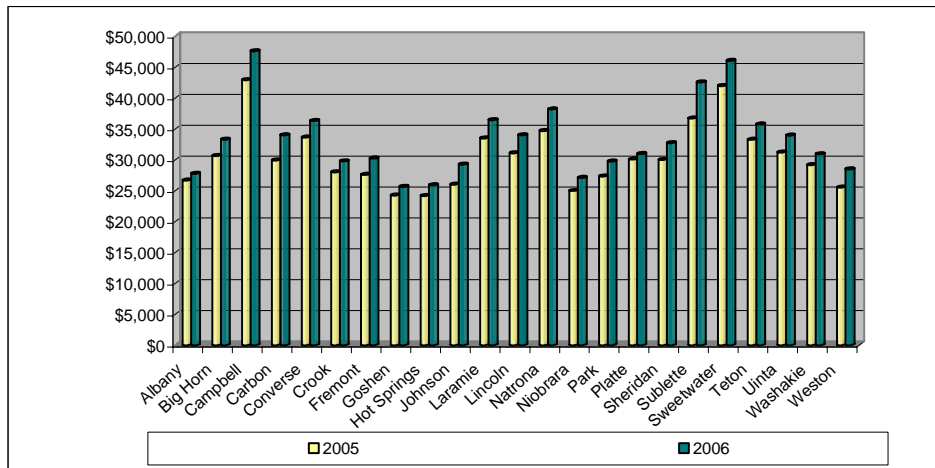
Shown in Chart 6 below and according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), Total Personal Income by Major Source and Earnings for Wyoming is led by Government and Mining sectors with 22.3 and 18.9 percent respectively. Compared to the United States, where mining contributed 1.3 percent of TPI, the charts show the significance and influence mining has had on Wyoming's economy. Totalling over \$2.8 billion of Total Personal Income, mining has a deep impact on Wyoming's economy. Particularly the Counties of Campbell, Natrona, and Sweetwater, leading Wyoming, in TPI portions in the mining sector over \$500 million. The sector contributing to the largest proportion of TPI in the United States is Professional and Business Services which includes various services and professions focused on providing citizens with assistance such as legal advice or waste management. Manufacturing also held a high percentage of the Total Personal Income for the United States, providing income through the transformation of materials into new products.

In 2006, the United States reported an average wage of \$41,991. Ranking 30<sup>th</sup> in the Nation, Wyoming had an average wage of \$36,312. The Nation's capitol, Washington D.C., held the number one spot for average wage, \$69,124. The counties with the largest average wage in 2006 were the mining counties of Campbell, Sweetwater, and Sublette, all with wages all over \$40,000. The mining industry of Wyoming has expanded and due to the high price and demand of oil and gas, the associated jobs with the State's mining industry tend to be higher paying. These jobs are great for Wyoming as a whole as well as the individual counties. High paying wages will attract outside individuals to otherwise unpopulated areas, giving these towns the opportunity to grow and develop. As can be seen on Chart 7 below, each county saw an increase in the average wage from 2005 to 2006. Laramie and Natrona counties were relatively in the middle to high range. These counties hold the State's two largest populations where many of the government and professional jobs are located. Goshen, Hot Springs, and Albany counties show lower average wages. Albany County is populated with many students attending the University of Wyoming. These students are willing to work entry level and temporary positions that are often lower paying jobs. Goshen and Hot Springs are smaller, rural counties where cost of living and wages are lower.

**Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**

Previously referred to as Gross State Product (GSP), Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by state is a comprehensive measure of economic activity within a state. It is the total market value of goods and services produced by the labor and property within a specific state during a specified period of time. Also equivalent to sales less intermediate inputs, GDP is reported using both current (nominal) and chained (real) dollars. Increases can be attributed to the rise in the quantity or price of production. Current dollars reflect the period in which they are being reported, they have not been adjusted for inflation and are the market value of an item, reflecting the value of a dollar for each specific year. Chained dollars, however, are compared and adjusted according to a base year to express real prices. For example, in the Gross Domestic Product data, chained 2000 dollars are used, meaning that the years of 2001 through 2006 are multiplied by the change in the chained-type quantity index number. The benefit of using chained dollars allows the reader to more accurately evaluate the growth through the years.

In 2007, the United States experienced a GDP of over \$13 trillion. Wyoming reported a Gross Domestic Product of \$31.5 billion in 2007, ranked it 49<sup>th</sup> in the Nation, only ahead of Vermont and North Dakota. Illustrated in Chart 8 on the next page, the Rocky Mountain Region, comprised of Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah, and Wyoming was by far the region reporting the smallest GDP, \$460 billion. Comparatively, the Southeast Region, made up of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida,

Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia led with a GDP of \$3 billion.

**Chart 8: Gross Domestic Product for the Regions of the United States, 2007**

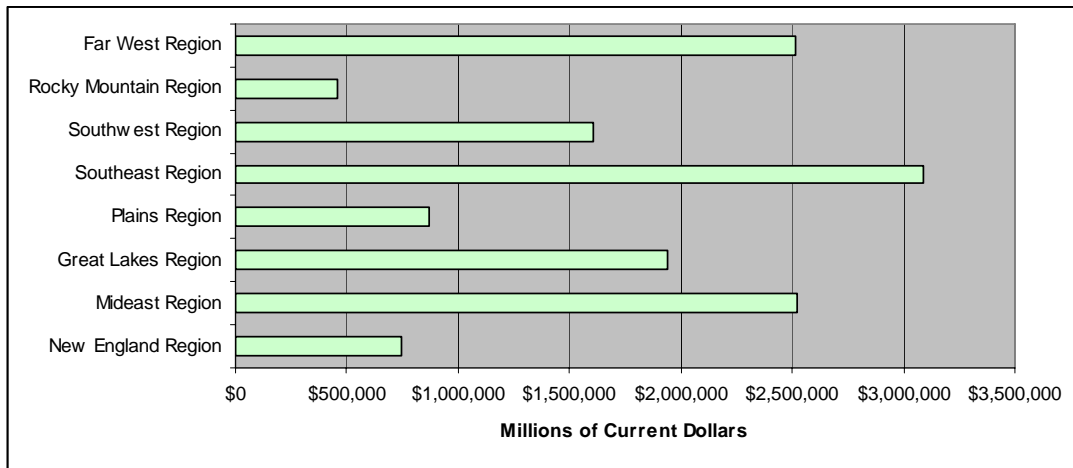
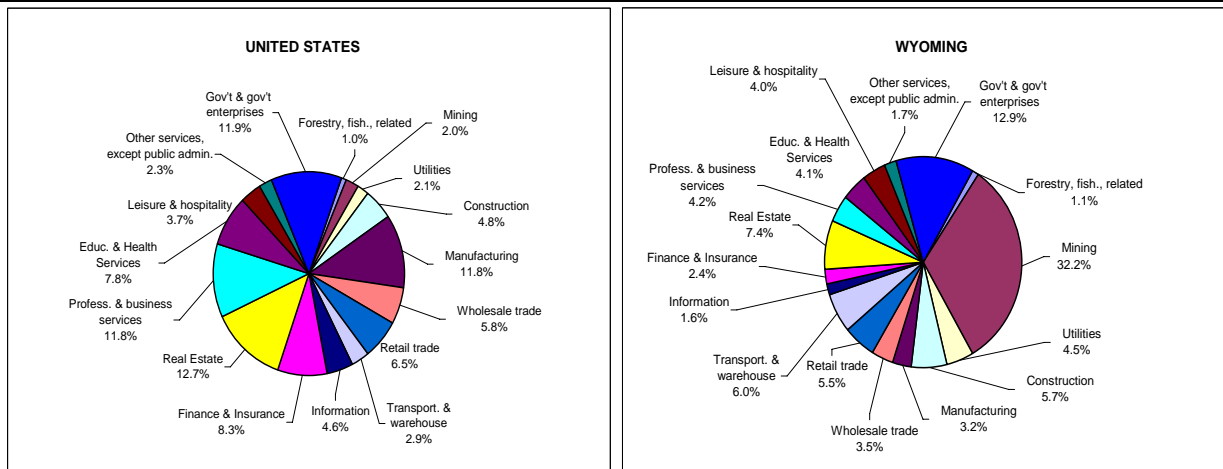


Chart 9, reports the current dollar percentages of the Gross Domestic Product by industry for the United States and Wyoming. The most noticeable difference between the two pie charts is the percent distributions. As can be seen in the United States on the left side, the GDP values are fairly evenly spread throughout the various sectors whereas the Mining sector makes up over 30 percent of Wyoming's GDP. Leading the United States' GDP are the sectors of Real Estate, Rental and Leasing; Government; and Manufacturing, all holding about 12 percent. In contrast, Wyoming's Gross Domestic Product is dominated by Mining at 32.2 percent. Shown in employment, income, and now Gross Domestic Product, the influence and benefits that mining has brought to Wyoming are quite significant. The mining industry and the success it has experienced in Wyoming have had a prosperous and positive effect on the State's economy.

**Chart 9: United States and Wyoming Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by NAICS Industry, 2006**

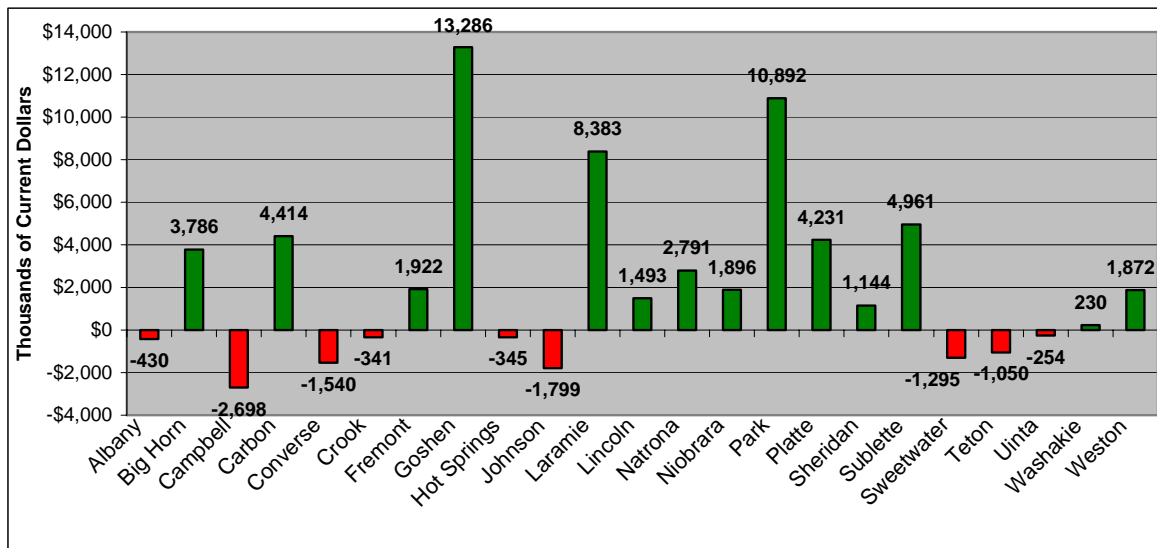


Farm earnings were down in 2006, with many of Wyoming's counties reporting negative earnings. Nine out of the twenty-three counties were affected by the trials and difficulties associated with farming and ranching and these were reflected in the farm income. Factors affecting agriculture production include drought and rising feed costs, which resulted in lower profits for livestock and

crop production. After experiencing one of the most severe droughts in Wyoming's history, pastures and farmlands were in poor condition. The prices for corn and grain have skyrocketed, making it more expensive to feed livestock. Wyoming producers have been receiving lower prices for livestock, which combined with higher fuel and feed prices, lead to reduced profit. Some producers were forced to downsize herds and incurred losses due to the higher costs which had a negative effect on farm earnings in many of Wyoming's counties. Chart 10 illustrated the 2006 farm earnings for Wyoming counties.

Although agriculture does not make up a large portion of Wyoming's income, it does contribute significantly to the culture and lifestyle of Wyoming residents. Wyoming has a great agricultural history, with many rural residents relying on this industry for their way of life. In 2006 there were over 9,400 farms and the average size of a Wyoming farm was almost 4,200 acres, which ranked first in the Nation. In comparison, the United States' average was only 446 acres. Although the influence and significance is not seen in contribution to Wyoming's economy, visiting the State or talking with the many ranching and farming families and seeing their way of life, agriculture is important to Wyoming's identity.

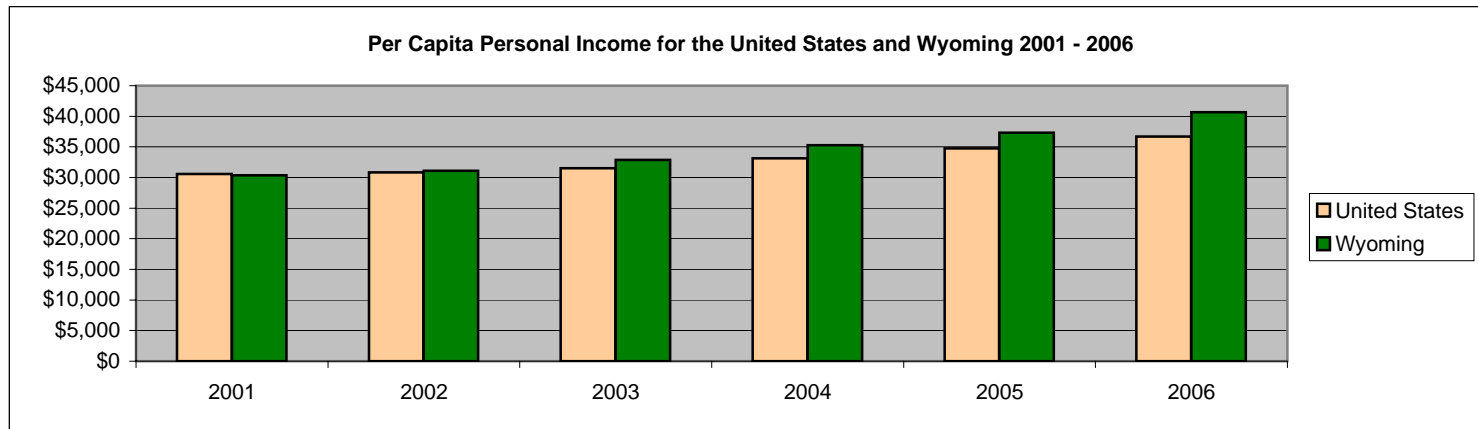

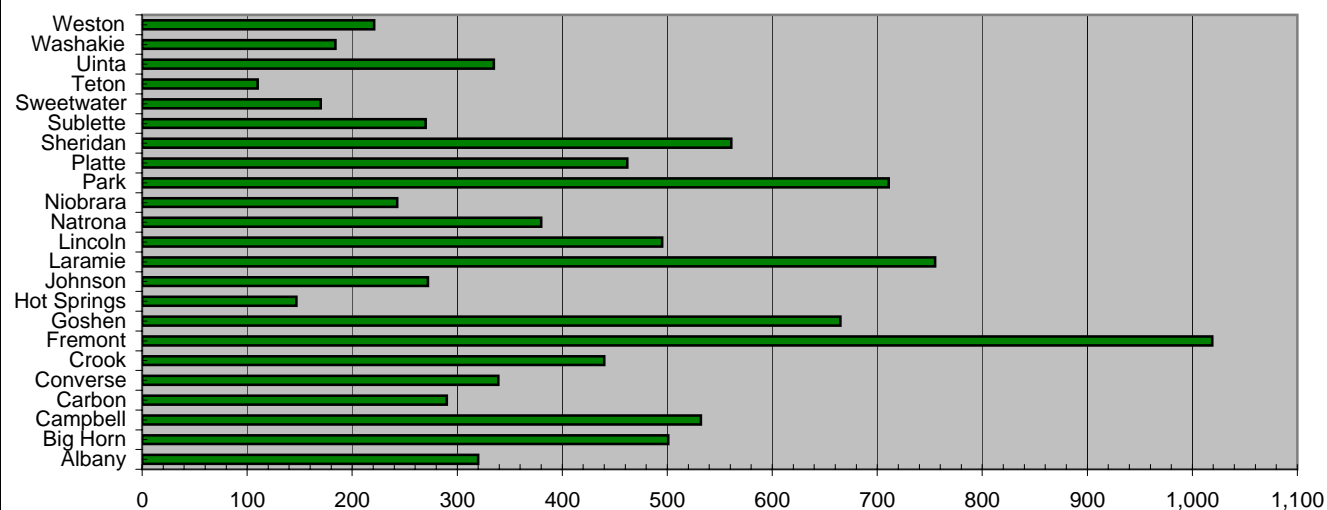

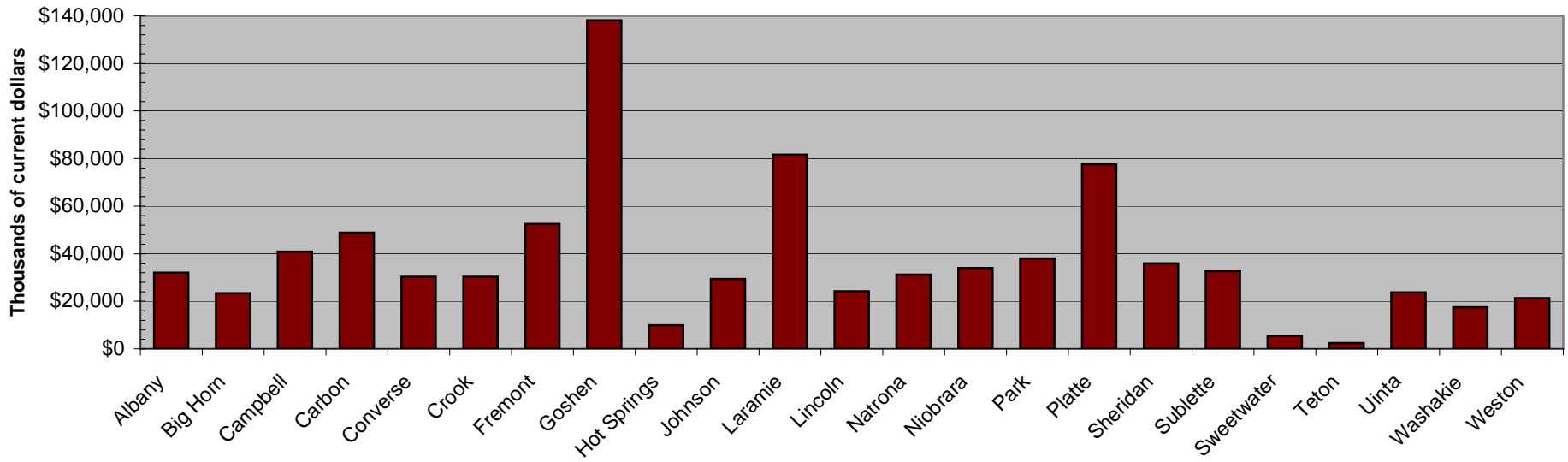
### Number of Farms in Wyoming by County: 2006



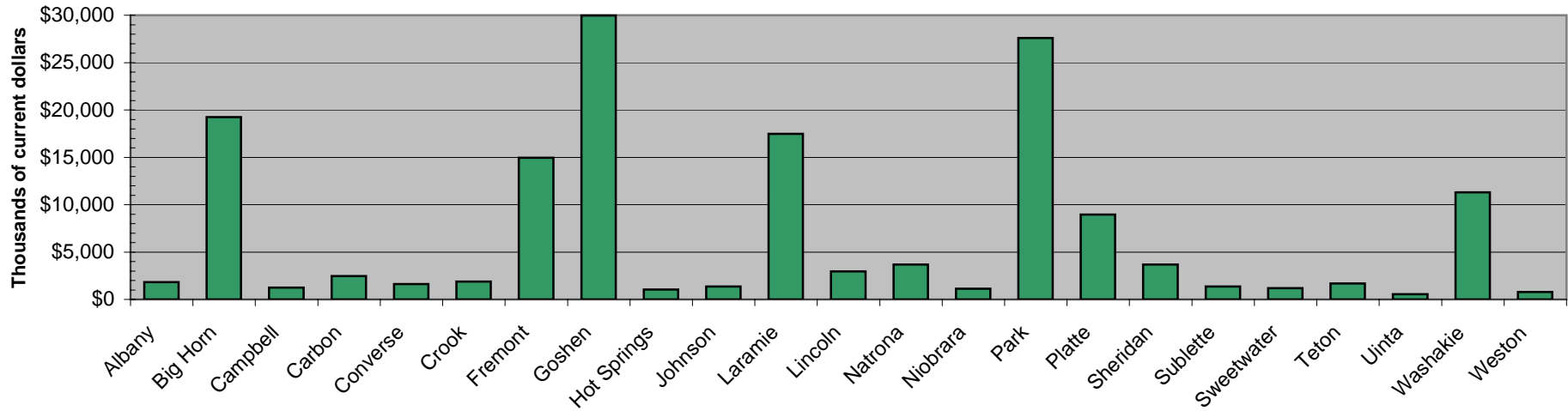

For the United States, it consists of adjustments for border workers: Wage and salary disbursements to U.S. residents commuting to Canada less wage and salary disbursements to Canadian and Mexican residents commuting into the United States.
- (4) Rental income of persons includes the capital consumption adjustment.
- (5) Proprietors' income includes the inventory valuation adjustment and capital consumption adjustment.
- (6) The estimates of earnings are based on the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS).
- (7) "Other" consists of wage and salary disbursements to U.S. residents employed by international organizations and foreign embassies and consulates in the United States.

### **Transfer Receipts:**

- (1) Consists largely of temporary disability payments and black lung payments.
- (2) Consists of Medicaid and other medical payments.
- (3) Consists of payments made under the TriCare Management Program (formerly called CHAMPUS) for the medical care of dependants of active duty military personnel and of retired military personnel and their dependents at nonmilitary medical facilities.
- (4) Through 1995, consists of emergency assistance and aid to families with dependent children. For 1998 forward, consists of benefits -- generally known as temporary assistance for needy families -- provided under the Personal Responsibility and Work Opportunity Reconciliation Act of 1996. For 1996-97, consists of payments under all three of these programs.
- (5) Consists largely of general assistance, refugee assistance, foster home care and adoption assistance, earned income tax credits, and energy assistance.
- (6) Consists of trade readjustment allowance payments, Redwood Park benefit payments, public service employment benefit payments, and transitional benefit payments.
- (7) Consists largely of veterans' readjustment benefit payments, educational assistance to spouses and children of disabled or deceased veterans, payments to paraplegics, and payments for autos and conveyances for disabled veterans.
- (8) Consists of State and local government payments to veterans.

- (9) Consists largely of federal fellowship to payments (National Science Foundation fellowships and traineeships, subsistence payments to State maritime academy cadets, and other fellowships), interest subsidy on higher education loans, basic education opportunity grants, and Job Corps payments.
- (10) Consists largely of Bureau of Indian Affairs payments, education exchange payments, Alaska Permanent Fund dividend payments, compensation of survivors of public safety officers, compensation of victims of crime, disaster relief payments, compensation for Japanese internment, and other special payments to individuals.
- (11) Consists of State and local government educational assistance payments to nonprofit institutions, and other State and local government payments to nonprofit institutions.
- (12) Consists largely of personal injury payments to individuals other than employees and other business transfer payments.

## DATA NOTES

### **EMPLOYMENT:**

The methodology utilized by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) for calculating employment is a count of occupied jobs, not employed people. Employment under this definition includes all full-time and part-time jobs. If an individual holds two separate jobs at any given time, the individual is counted twice, since two employment positions are occupied. BEA employment also includes proprietors or self-employed.

Unemployment data is compiled by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS). Unemployed persons include those persons who did not work during the reference week, were available for work, and made specific efforts to find employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME (TPI):**

Total personal income (TPI), as defined by the BEA, is the current income of residents in a particular area from all sources. It is measured after deductions of personal contributions to Social Security, but before personal tax deductions have been made. It includes income received from businesses; federal, state, and local governments; households; institutions; foreign governments; other labor income (such as employers' contributions to private social insurance programs); farm and non-farm proprietor income; dividends, interest, and rent; and transfer payments. It is the only key economic indicator which is adjusted for seasonality; it is not, however, adjusted for price changes.

Because TPI is a measure of income received, estimates of state and local area personal income should reflect the residence of the income recipients. Of the six major components of personal income, three are recorded on a place-of-residence basis: transfer receipts or payments; dividends, interest, and rental income; and proprietors' income. The data available at the state and county level for wages and salaries; other labor income; supplements to wages and salaries; and personal contributions for social insurance, are estimated from data that are recorded by place-of-work.

Four adjustments are made to earnings by place-of-work to derive total personal income by place-of-residence. Following these adjustments, total earnings still comprise the bulk of total personal income. Beginning with total labor and proprietor earnings, the first adjustment is made by deducting contributions for social insurance. Although these are considered part of employee total earnings for the current period, social insurance contributions are not received during the current period and are, therefore, not included in personal income.

The second adjustment is made for employee by place-of-residency. The BEA defines employee residency as the location at which the employee is residing while employed. An example of this type of adjustment is a regular occurrence in Sheridan County, Wyoming. There are employees that work in the coal mines in Montana, but reside in Sheridan County, Wyoming. Earnings for these employees show up as earnings data for Montana. However, in the derivation of personal income by place-of-residence, an adjustment is made to reallocate these earnings as personal income for Wyoming. This residency adjustment for Wyoming is, therefore, the net effect of all interstate place-of-work versus place-of-residence discrepancies.

A third adjustment is made by appending dividends, interest, and rental income. Dividends are payments in cash or other assets, excluding stock, by for-profit corporations to non-corporate stockholders in state. Interest is the monetary and imputed interest income of persons from all sources. Rental income is the monetary income of persons from the rental of real property; the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of non-farm dwellings;

and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources.

The fourth and final adjustment is the addition of transfer receipts or payments. Transfer receipts or payments are income payments to persons, generally in monetary form, for which they do not render current services. Common examples of transfer payments include Social Security payments and public assistance. As a component of personal income, they are payments by governments and businesses to individuals and nonprofit institutions.

Once these four adjustments to the earnings by place-of-work are made, the result is total personal income by place-of-residence. Personal income effectively measures the size of consumer markets. When presented by industry of origin, as in this report, earnings can also be interpreted as a measure of the size of industrial markets.

Per capita personal income (PCI) is calculated by dividing total personal income of the area by the total population of that area. Per capita personal income is a useful tool to compare income across regions, states, and counties. Per capita personal income can also be used to track income growth over time. It is also a good comparison tool because it removes the effects of population growth on TPI.

### **GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP):**

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for a state as the sum of Gross Domestic Product Originating (GDPO) by industry in all industries. This measure of GDP is the state counterpart of the Nation's gross domestic product (GDP) by industry from the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

The GDPO by industry is the contribution of each industry, including government, to GDP. An industry's GDPO, often referred to as its "value added," is equal to its gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory change) minus its intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased or imported from other industries).

For each industry, the estimate of gross domestic product is composed of four components (estimated in current-dollars only): (1) Compensation of employees; (2) proprietors' income with inventory valuation adjustment (IVA) and capital consumption allowances; (3) indirect business tax and non-tax liability (IBT); and (4) Other, mainly capital related, charges. Most of the compensation and proprietors' income components of GDP are primarily based on BEA's estimates of earnings by place-of-work, an aggregate in the state personal income series. The IBT component of GDP reflects liabilities charged to business expense, most of which are sales and property taxes levied by state and local governments. The capital charges component of GDP comprises corporate profits with IVA, corporate capital consumption allowances, business transfer payments, net interest, rental income of persons, and subsidies less current surplus of government enterprises.

Current and constant (chained) dollar estimates of GDP by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) classification are presented for the U.S. and states for the years 1998-2007. Current and constant dollar estimates of GDP by NAICS industry classification are also presented for Wyoming and by industry for 1998-2006.

## GLOSSARY

**Chained Dollars** – A measure used to express real prices. It is a measure used to approximate the chained-type index level and is calculated by taking the current-dollar level of a series in the base period and multiplying it by the change in the chained-type quantity index number for the series since the base period. Chained-dollar estimates correctly show growth rates for a series, but are not additive in periods other than the base period.

**Current Dollars** – The market value of an item, which reflects price and quantities of the period being measured and has not been adjusted for inflation. For example, 2006 data in current dollars indicate values based on the worth of the dollar in the year of 2006.

**Industry** – A group of establishments that produce similar products or provide similar services. For example, all establishments that manufacture automobiles are in the same industry. A given industry, or even a particular establishment within that industry, might have employees in dozens of occupations. The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) groups similar establishments into industries.

**Inflation** – An increase in the level of consumer prices, or equivalently, a decline in the purchasing power of money. Inflation is defined as a time for generally rising prices for goods and factors of production.

**North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)** – A classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability in industrial statistics across North America. It replaced the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) in 2000. A list of NAICS classifications can be found on page 97.

**Transfer Receipts** – Payments made by the government to individuals and non-profit institutions that are not in exchange for goods and services, such as Social Security payments, and are a component of personal income. The term was previously identified as transfer payments.

## INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

The industry classifications utilized in this report are classified in accordance with the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), published by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. The twenty major industrial sectors that comprise NAICS are: 1) Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; 2) Mining; 3) Utilities; 4) Construction; 5) Manufacturing; 6) Wholesale Trade; 7) Retail Trade; 8) Transportation and Warehousing; 9) Information; 10) Finance and Insurance; 11) Real Estate and Rental and Leasing; 12) Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services; 13) Management of Companies and Enterprises; 14) Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services; 15) Educational Services; 16) Health Care and Social Assistance; 17) Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation; 18) Accommodation and Food Services; 19) Other Services (except public administration); and 20) Public Administration.

For purposes of this classification, an establishment is an economic unit, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed. Each establishment is assigned an industry code on the basis of its primary activity, which is determined by its principal product (or group of products) produced or distributed, or services rendered. Ideally, the principal product or service should be determined by its relative share of "value added" at the establishment. In practice, however, it is rarely possible to obtain this measure for individual products or services. Typically, it is necessary to adopt some other criterion which may be expected to give approximately the same results in determining the primary activity of an establishment.

Occasionally, in activity-diversified establishments, the appropriate measure cannot be determined or estimated for each product or service. In some instances, an industry classification based upon the recommended output measure will not adequately represent the relative economic importance of each of the varied activities carried on at such establishments. In such cases, employment or payroll information should be used to determine the primary activity of a particular establishment.

Due to this broad categorization of multi-sector establishments under one code, estimates will frequently be understated in one sector and overstated in another. While this does not influence the accuracy of either county or state totals, it will obviously have an effect upon estimates for a particular sector.

Data from business tax returns, provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), are used to generate detailed industrial estimates of self-employed individuals at the national level. At the state level, Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) records on individuals making self-employed contributions are used to get first round estimates by industry. This has resulted in an increase in the count of self-employed individuals, which was prompted by the following factors. First, those proprietors who were previously only counted once in the Current Population Survey (CPS), but who are in fact proprietors of two or more businesses, are now being counted once for each business. In addition, all persons formerly classified solely as wage and salary employees, but also spend some time as sole proprietors or participating partners in businesses, are now being counted in each of their multiple positions.

## NORTH AMERICAN INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM (NAICS)

**11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting:** The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or their natural habitats. The establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: agricultural production and agricultural support activities. Production includes establishments performing the complete farm operation whereas the support includes the performance of one or more activities associated with farm operation.

**21 Mining:** The Mining sector comprises establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. The term mining is used in the broad sense to include quarrying, well operations, beneficiating (e.g., crushing, screening, washing, and flotation), and other preparation customarily performed at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: mine operation and mining support activities. Operation includes establishments operating mines, quarries, or oil and gas wells on their own account or for others on a contract or fee basis. Support activities include establishments that perform exploration and/or other mining services on a contract or fee basis.

**22 Utilities:** The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities.

**23 Construction:** The Construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g. highways and utility systems). Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in subdividing land for sale as building sites are also included in this sector.

**31-33 Manufacturing:** The Manufacturing sector comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing, except in the cases where the activity is appropriately classified in Sector 23, Construction. Establishments in the Manufacturing sector are often characterized as plants, factories, or mills; however, establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public are also included in this sector.

**42 Wholesale Trade:** The Wholesale Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The merchandise described in this sector includes the output of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office. These warehouses and offices are characterized by having little display of merchandise.

**44-45 Retail Trade:** The Retail Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of the merchandise. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high

volume of walk-in customers. This type generally has extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers. Nonstore retailers are organized to serve the general public and reach their customers and market their merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of “infomercials,” the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-to-door solicitations, and distribution through vending machines.

**48-49 Transportation and Warehousing:** The Transportation and Warehousing sector includes industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation. Establishments in these industries use transportation equipment or transportation related facilities as a productive asset. The type of equipment depends on the mode of transportation. The modes of transportation include air, rail, water, road, and pipeline.

**51 Information:** The Information sector comprises establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. The main components of this sector are publishing industries, motion picture and sound recording industries, broadcasting industries, telecommunications industries, Web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries.

**52 Finance and Insurance:** The Finance and Insurance sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions (transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets) and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) Raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities; and (3) Providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs.

**53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing:** The Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks.

**54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services:** The Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector comprises establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others. These activities require a high degree of expertise and training. The establishments in this sector specialize according to expertise and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries, and in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services.

**55 Management of Companies and Enterprises:** The Management of Companies and Enterprises sector comprises (1) establishments that hold the securities of (or other equity interests in) companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or (2) establishments (except government establishments) that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic or organizational planning and decision making role of the company or enterprise. Establishments that administer, oversee, and manage may hold the securities of the company or enterprise.

**56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services:**

The Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services sector comprises establishments performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations. These essential activities are often undertaken in-house by establishments in many sectors of the economy. The establishments in this sector specialize in one or more of these support activities and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries and, in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services.

**61 Educational Services:** The Educational Services sector comprises establishments that provide instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects. This instruction and training is provided by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges, universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and/or accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning. Instruction is imparted in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home.

**62 Health Care and Social Assistance:** The Health Care and Social Assistance sector comprises establishments providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities. The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. The services provided by establishments in this sector are delivered by trained professionals. All industries in the sector share this commonality of process, namely, labor inputs of health practitioners or social workers with the requisite expertise. Many of the industries in the sector are defined based on the educational degree held by the practitioners included in the industry.

**71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation:** The Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation sector includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing; (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests.

**72 Accommodation and Food Services:** The Accommodation and Food Services sector comprises establishments providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, and beverages for immediate consumption. The sector includes both accommodation and food services establishments because the two activities are often combined at the same establishment. Excluded from this sector are civic and social organizations; amusement and recreation parks; theatres; and other recreation or entertainment facilities providing food and beverage services.

**81 Other Services (except Public Administration):** The Other Services (except Public Administration) sector comprises establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system. Establishments in this sector are primarily engaged in activities, such as equipment and machinery repair, promoting or administering religious activities, grant making, advocacy, and dry-cleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services.

**92 Public Administration:** The Public Administration sector consists of establishments of federal, state, and local government agencies that administer, oversee, and manage public programs and have executive, legislative, or judicial authority over other institutions within a given area. These agencies also set policy, create laws, adjudicate civil and criminal legal cases, provide for public safety and for national defense. In general, government establishments in the Public Administration sector oversee governmental programs and activities that are not performed by private establishments. Establishments in this sector typically are engaged in the organization and financing of the production of public goods and services, most of which are provided for free or at prices that are not economically significant.
