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## INTRODUCTION

The *2009 Wyoming Employment, Income, and Gross Domestic Product Report* serves as a compendium of Federal government data, highlighting Wyoming and its twenty-three counties. The report contains several of the best indicators of Wyoming's demographic and economic growth and is presented in a format which can be used for planning and projection purposes.

Specifically, data contained within the publication include:

- Total Employment, Employment by Industry, and Unemployment Rates for the United States, individual states, Wyoming, and counties.
- Income descriptions such as Total Personal Income, Per Capita Personal Income, Total Personal Income by Source and Earnings by Major Industry, and Average Wage and Salary per Job for the United States, Wyoming, and counties.
- Personal Transfer Receipts and Farm Income for Wyoming.
- Total Gross Domestic Product data for the United States and individual states; Gross Domestic Product by Industry for the United States and Wyoming.

All information contained herein, except unemployment data, was obtained from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) served as the source for the unemployment rates. Source websites are listed below:

The BEA compiles employment and income data on a place of work basis, therefore a residence adjustment has been made. Employment and income data were compiled according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Gross Domestic Product was also compiled using NAICS. NAICS is a classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability of industrial statistics across North America. Detailed information about data compilation is located in the Data Notes, Glossary, and Industry Classification section, pages 93 - 96. Definitions of the major NAICS sector classifications are found on pages 97 - 100. Due to processing time, the release of a majority of the data is lagged approximately 24 to 48 months.

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## SUMMARY

### Employment

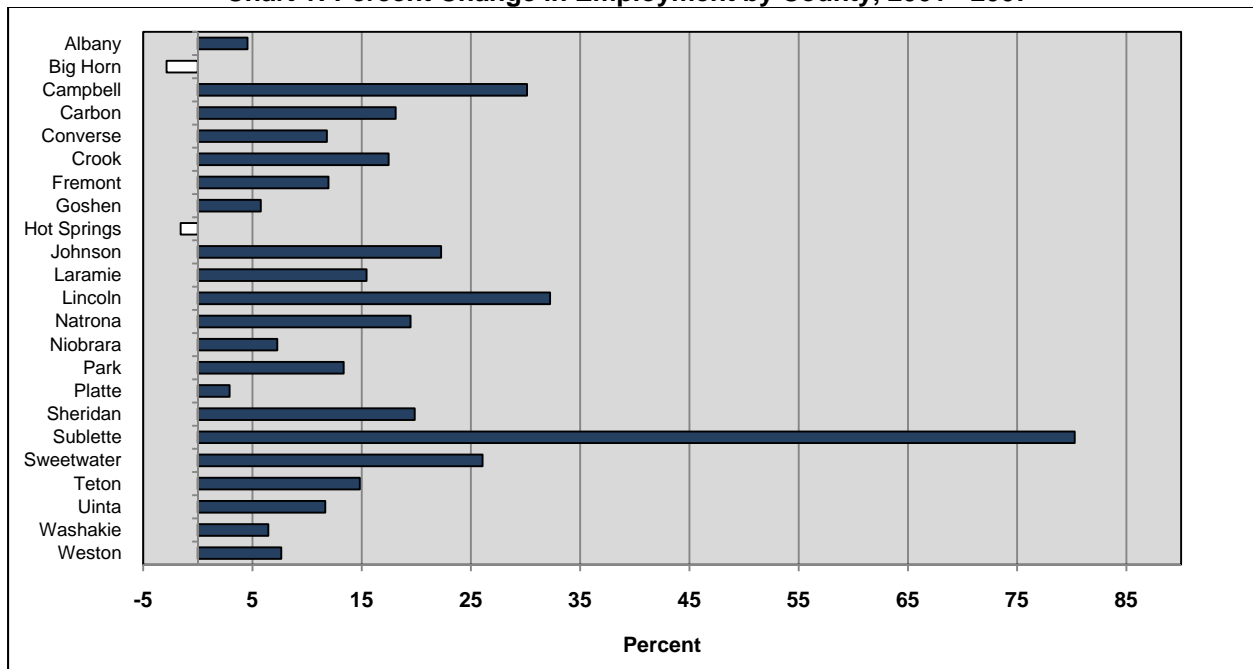
Total employment in the United States increased 1.8% from 2006 to 2007, from 178 million to 181 million occupied jobs. Since 2001, national employment increased 8.3%. Leading the nation in employment increases from 2001 to 2007 were Nevada, Arizona, and Utah, all with expansions of greater than 20%. Employment in Wyoming increased 17% from 2001 to 2007, making it one of the national leaders in employment growth. In 2007, Wyoming had 389,776 occupied jobs, up 3.9 percent from one year earlier.

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates total employment by surveying individual employers and/or establishments. These employers report the number of both full- and part-time workers. Employees, sole proprietors, and active partners are included, but unpaid family members and volunteers are not counted. These employment figures represent number of jobs as opposed to number of workers, therefore if an individual were to hold two jobs, he or she would be counted twice.

Within Wyoming, most counties showed stable employment growth from 2001 to 2007. Of the twenty-three counties in Wyoming, only two experienced a decrease in employment, Hot Springs and Big Horn, with decreases of 1.6 and 2.9 percent, respectively. Conversely, Campbell, Sweetwater, and Lincoln counties experienced increases of over 25 percent over the past six years. Incredibly, Sublette County boasted an 80 percent growth in employment from 2001 to 2007. Growth in these counties was largely attributed to the mining boom, which has created high paying mining jobs that draw individuals and their families to these areas, stimulating employment growth in many industry sectors.

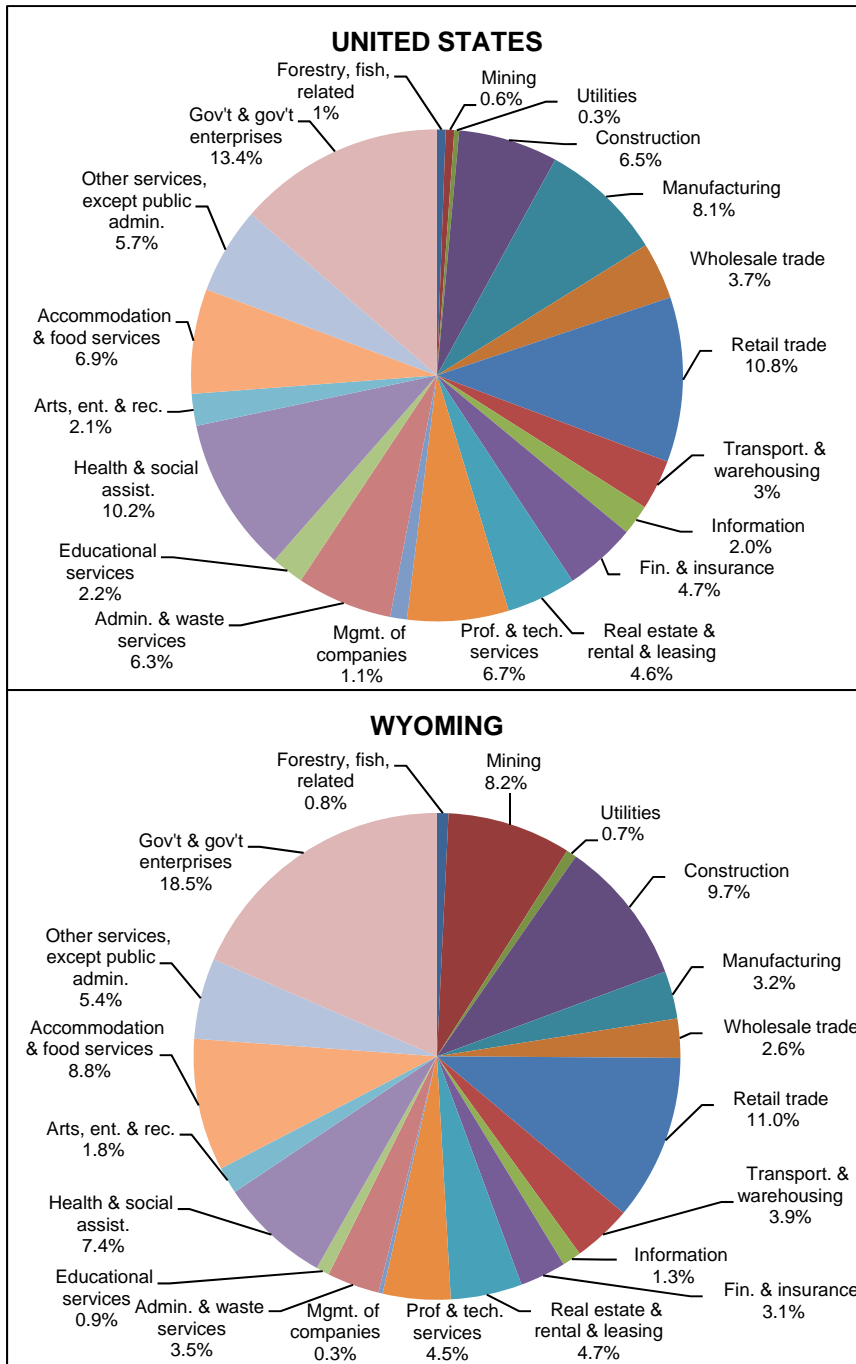
Chart 1 illustrates the percent change in employment for Wyoming's counties from 2001 to 2007. Overall, Wyoming is consistent with the national trend of employment growth from 2001 to 2007. From 2006 to 2007, Wyoming experienced employment growth of 3.94 percent, the third highest growth rate in the United States.

Of the twenty primary North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) sectors, the Real Estate and Rental and Leasing industry experienced the greatest national employment growth in 2007, increasing 9.0 percent. Twenty-six million jobs were created in this sector from 2001 to 2007, spurred by the U.S. housing boom. Likewise, Real Estate and Rental and Leasing led Wyoming in employment growth, with an increase of 53.3 percent from 2001 to 2007. The Mining industry is an employment leader, exhibiting an increase in employment from 2001 to 2007, increasing 50.2 percent and defining the industry as an employment leader for Wyoming. Other industries demonstrating significant employment

growth of over 30 percent in Wyoming included Construction and Educational Services. Growth in all four of these industries is connected to the recent mining boom in Wyoming. The job opportunities in Wyoming's energy sector have brought people to counties in the State and increased demand for construction, real estate services and educational services.

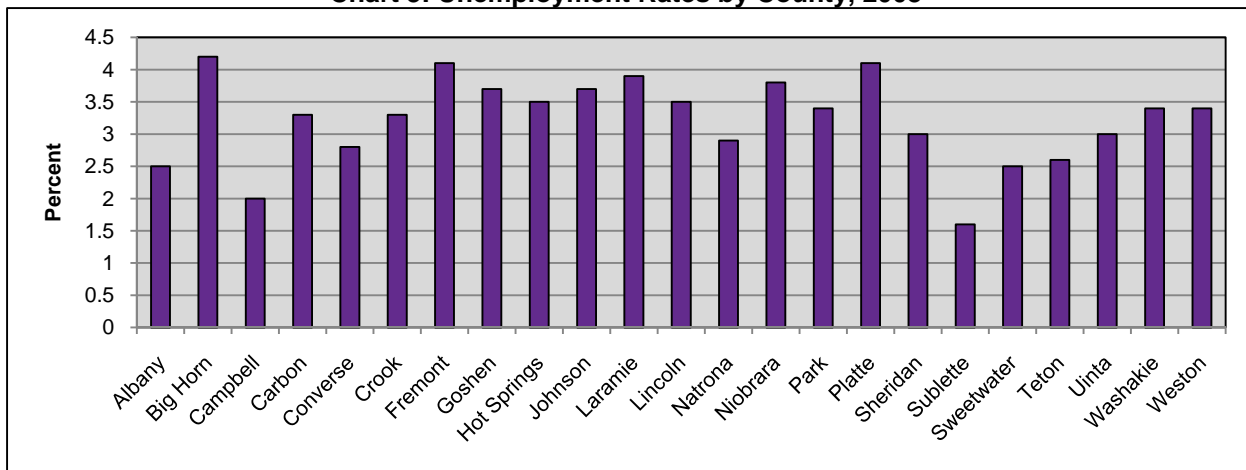
Mining employment growth in Wyoming was led by Sublette and Sheridan counties, with increases of 64.1 and 33.6 percent, respectively, from 2006 to 2007. Lincoln and Carbon counties reported the largest employment growth for the Construction sector, with increases of 50.3 and 31.4 percent, respectively. Construction demand in these two counties can be attributed to growth in the Mining sector, which has increased the need for housing; combined with relatively small base populations, even a small numeric growth appears large. Big Horn County's mining employment decrease of 35.2 percent from 2006 to 2007 can be attributed to a code change that reclassified a large firm from Big Horn to Sublette County.

Chart 2 illustrates employment by industry for each of the NAICS sectors for the United States and Wyoming. In 2007, for both the United States and Wyoming, the sector with the greatest proportion of employment was Government and Government Enterprises (Public Administration), with 13.4% and 18.5% of total employment, respectively. Overall, the United States and Wyoming have similar distributions of employment through the different sectors. However, Wyoming's greatest variation from the United States is in the Mining sector, which accounts for 8.2% of jobs in Wyoming but only 0.6% of jobs for the United States. Other leading employment sectors in Wyoming include Construction, Retail Trade, and Accommodation and Food Services. Construction employment is higher in Wyoming than in the United States due to the geographic size of the state, which demands more road construction and maintenance and utility construction including oil and gas pipelines. Tourism in Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park, and Jackson Hole are responsible for high employment in the Accommodation and Food Services sector, 8.8 percent in 2007.

Unemployment is defined as a person who is currently over the age of sixteen, who is not employed, but is capable of working and is actively seeking employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force. In 2008, the United States recorded an unemployment rate of 5.8 percent, whereas Wyoming only experienced a rate of 3.1 percent, making it the state with the second lowest unemployment rate in the nation. South Dakota had the lowest unemployment rate, 3.0 percent in 2008. Besides Wyoming and South Dakota, several states in the Rocky Mountain and Plains regions of the United States recorded employment rates well below the national average, they include Nebraska, North Dakota, Oklahoma, and Utah. Every county in Wyoming recorded unemployment rates lower than the rate for the United States. Big Horn and Platte Counties had the highest unemployment rates, 4.2 and 4.1 percent, respectively. Sublette County had the lowest unemployment rate, with only 1.6 percent unemployed.

Chart 3 shows the 2008 unemployment rates for each county in Wyoming. The counties with the lowest unemployment rates were Campbell, Sublette, and Sweetwater, areas that have been positively affected by the mineral industry. For the past three years, these counties have consistently had the lowest unemployment rates in Wyoming. While these areas attracted many new residents due to the numerous job opportunities, more rural counties within the State are finding it difficult to offer promising jobs. Rural areas such as Goshen and Platte Counties have experienced continued population declines due to the lack of opportunities and many residents relocated in search of work. Wyoming has also been faced with the problem of retaining young and educated workers in the State. Without the availability of careers that offer stimulating and high growth opportunities, many young people search for job prospects outside of Wyoming.

In summary, Wyoming's recent employment growth was achieved largely due to the boom in the mining industry, which also caused other sectors to be positively affected. Mining often occurs in otherwise unpopulated areas, creating jobs directly and indirectly associated with the Mining industry. The Construction sector was stimulated by the need to build more homes, businesses, infrastructure, and government projects. Retail, food service, and entertainment establishments expand and helps complete the creation of a lifestyle and economy in these areas experiencing population growth.

### Income

Income is broadly defined as revenue from all sources, i.e. businesses; Federal, State, local, and foreign governments; households; and institutions. Total Personal Income (TPI) is a measure of income received by all residents of a particular area from all sources within that area. TPI is calculated after deduction of personal contributions to Social Security, but before Federal tax deductions. This value includes net earnings by place of residence, rental income, personal dividend income, personal interest income, and transfer receipts.

Nationwide, TPI increased 6 percent from 2006 to 2007; while Wyoming's TPI increased 10.7 percent. This growth ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the U.S., only behind North Dakota and South Dakota. Similar to employment, TPI growth in Wyoming was largely attributed to increased mining activities and the associated job growth. For 2007, Wyoming's TPI was nearly \$25 billion. Because of Wyoming's small population, its TPI is one of the smallest in the country. Some of the highest TPI numbers in the nation are from states such as California and New York. California was the only state that exceeded one trillion dollars in TPI for 2007. Although the Rocky Mountain region experienced huge gains in TPI from 2006 to 2007, it still had the smallest regional TPI because of smaller population numbers.

**Chart 4: Total Personal Income and Population by County, 2007**

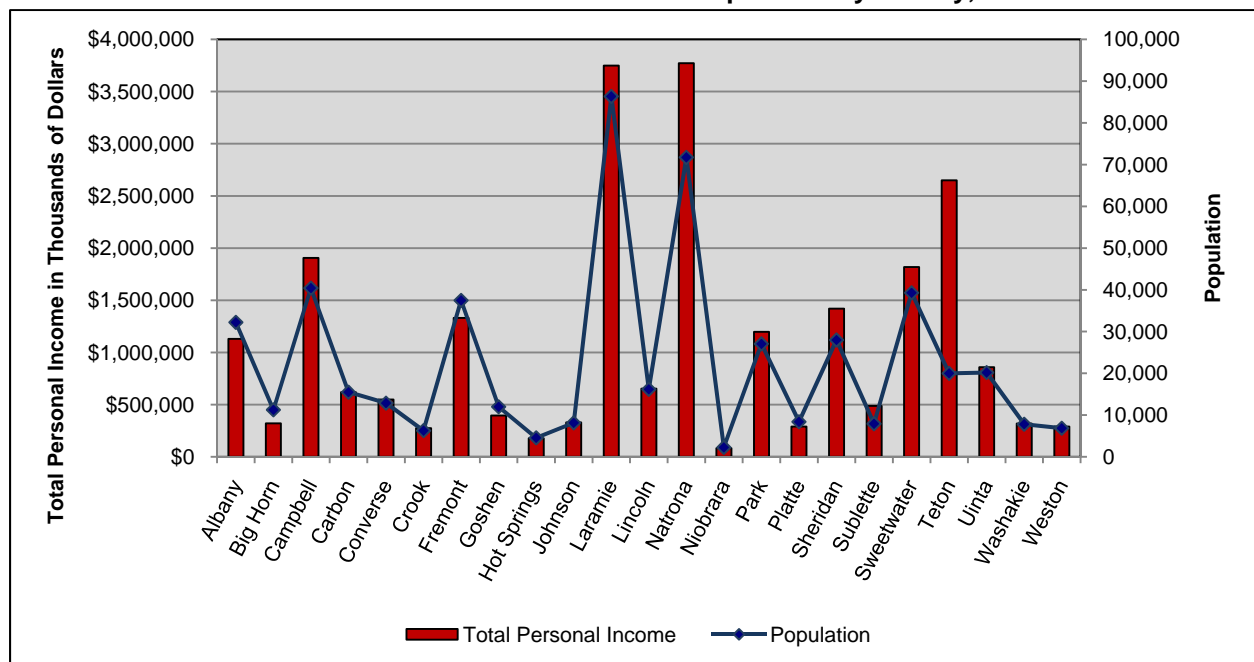
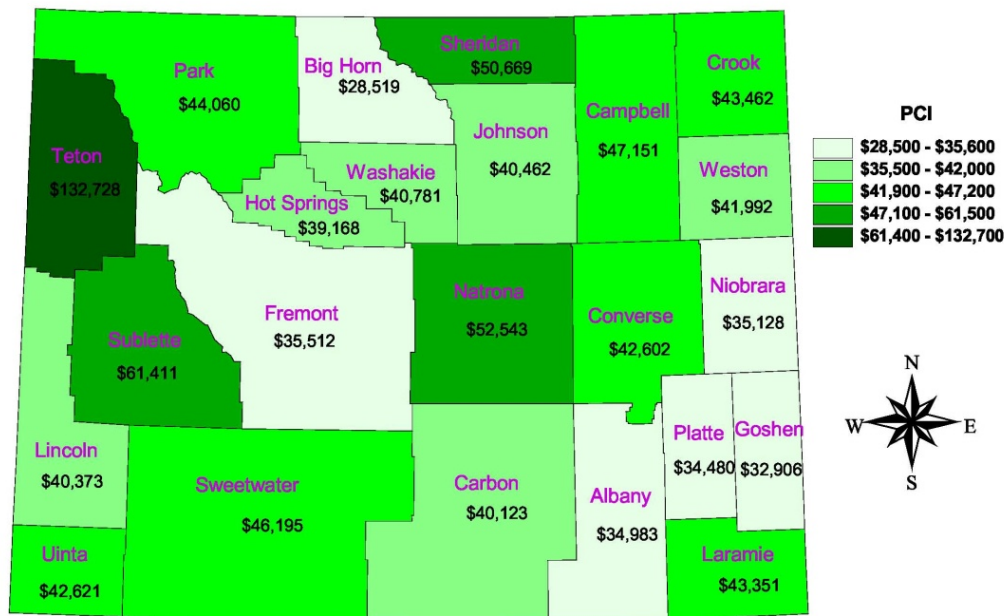


Chart 4 depicts TPI reflected through population for each county. Laramie and Natrona counties have the highest TPI with over \$3.7 billion each; and Niobrara County reported the lowest TPI of \$82.6 million for 2007. TPI in these three counties is reflected through their population numbers. Laramie and Natrona Counties have the two largest county populations in Wyoming, with 86,480 and 71,784 residents, respectively, while Niobrara County only had a population of 2,352 in 2007. Although in many counties, there is a direct relationship between TPI and population, Teton County is an example of where TPI is more affected by economic activity than population. Teton County has a population of 19,958, but its TPI is significantly higher due to its many wealthy residents whose incomes are boosted by investment and dividend income.

Per capita personal income (PCI) is defined as the Total Personal Income of an area divided by the population of that area. Since 2002, Wyoming has consistently had a higher PCI than the United States. In 2007, Wyoming had a PCI of \$47,047, an increase of 8.5% from 2006. Only North and South Dakota exhibited greater increases of PCI from 2006 to 2007. The United States reported a PCI of \$38,615, an increase of 4.9 percent from the previous year. Wyoming's high PCI can be attributed to its low population and the economic boost it experienced from increased mining activity.

Chart 5 shows per capita personal income by county for Wyoming in 2007. Teton County led Wyoming with a PCI of \$132,728. Teton County's large PCI is due to the large numerator, TPI, and a low denominator, population. TPI includes all income sources, including investment income and dividends, which largely contribute to TPI in Teton County. The county with the lowest per capita personal income was Big Horn with a value of \$28,519 in 2007. Big Horn and Niobrara counties were the only counties that experienced a decrease in per capita personal income. PCI in Sublette and Lincoln counties increased over 17 percent in 2007.

**Per Capita Personal Income (PCI): 2007**



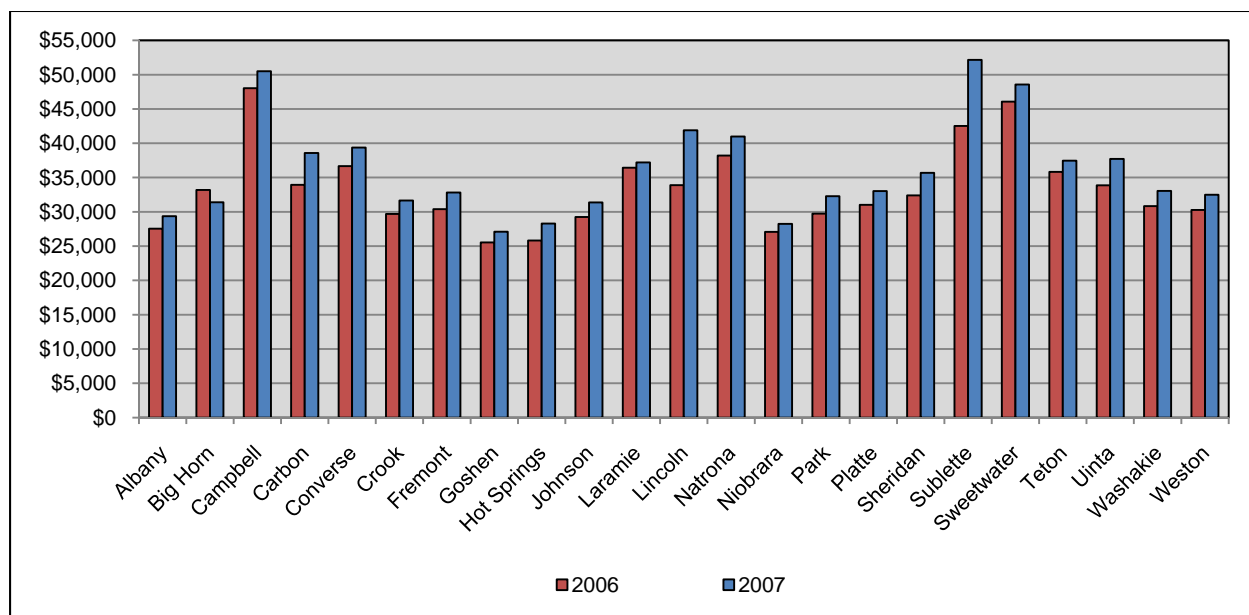

In 2007, the average wage in the United States was \$43,889 and \$38,901 in Wyoming. The nation's capitol, the District of Columbia, had the highest wage per job in the United States of \$72,587, significantly higher than any other state. This high was due to the large number of Federal government jobs in the District of Columbia. Chart 6, below, shows the average wage per job for each county in Wyoming for 2006 and 2007. The mining counties of Campbell, Sublette, and Sweetwater had the highest average wages for the State in 2007, each with an average wage per job greater than \$45,000. Wyoming's mining industry has expanded; and mining jobs are typically higher paying. High paying mining jobs are great for Wyoming and its counties because they attract individuals to otherwise unpopulated areas, stimulating growth in these smaller communities.

Each county in Wyoming experienced an increase in the average wage per job from 2006 to 2007, with the exception of Big Horn County. Big Horn County lost a significant amount of mining jobs this year, and the loss of these higher paying jobs brought down the average wage for this area. Laramie and Natrona Counties also had relatively high average wages for 2007. Many of the Federal and State government and professional jobs are located in these two counties. Goshen, Hot Springs, and Albany counties showed some of the lowest average wages for the State. Albany County is home to the University of Wyoming; therefore much of its population consists of college students who work in entry level and part-time positions that are typically lower paying jobs. Goshen and Hot Springs are small, rural counties, associated with agriculture, where the cost of living and wages are lower than average.

**Chart 6: Average Wage per Job by County, 2006 and 2007**

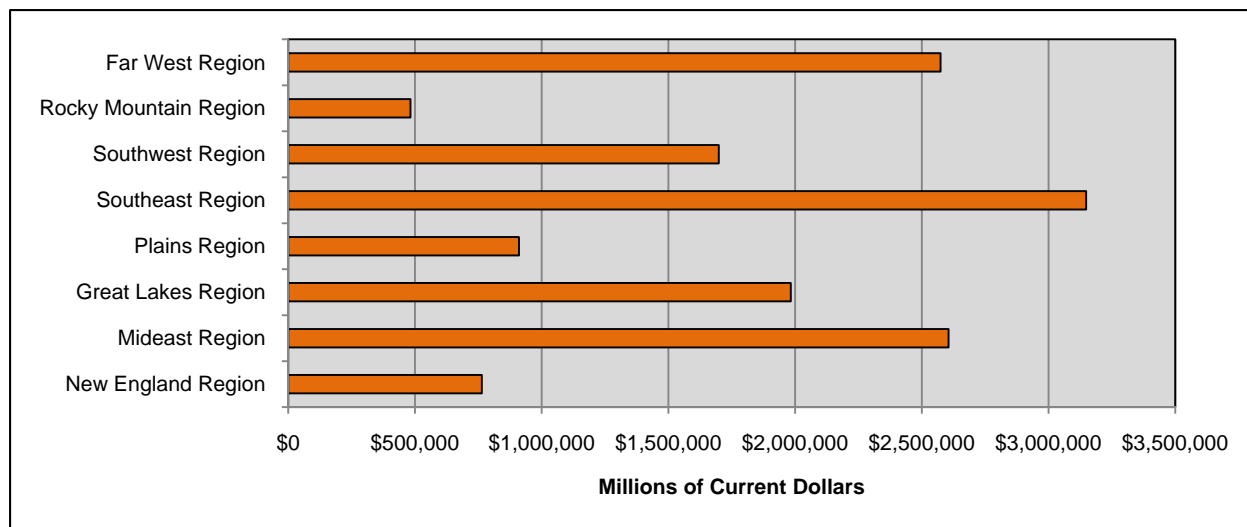


**Gross Domestic Product (GDP)**

Historically referred to as Gross State Product (GSP), Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by state is a comprehensive measure of economic activity within a state. It is the total market value of goods and services produced by the labor and property within a specific state during a specified period of time. Also equivalent to sales less intermediate inputs, GDP is reported using both current (nominal) and chained (real) dollars. Yearly increases can be attributed to the rise in the quantity or price of production. Current dollars reflect the period in which they are being reported; they have not been adjusted for inflation and

are the market value of an item, reflecting the value of a dollar for each specific year. Chained dollars, however, are compared and adjusted according to a base year to express real prices. For example, the Gross Domestic Product data uses chained 2000 dollars, meaning that the years of 2001 through 2007 are multiplied by the change in the chained-type quantity index number. Using chained dollars allows data users to more accurately evaluate growth through the years.

**Chart 7: Gross Domestic Product for Regions of the United States, 2008**

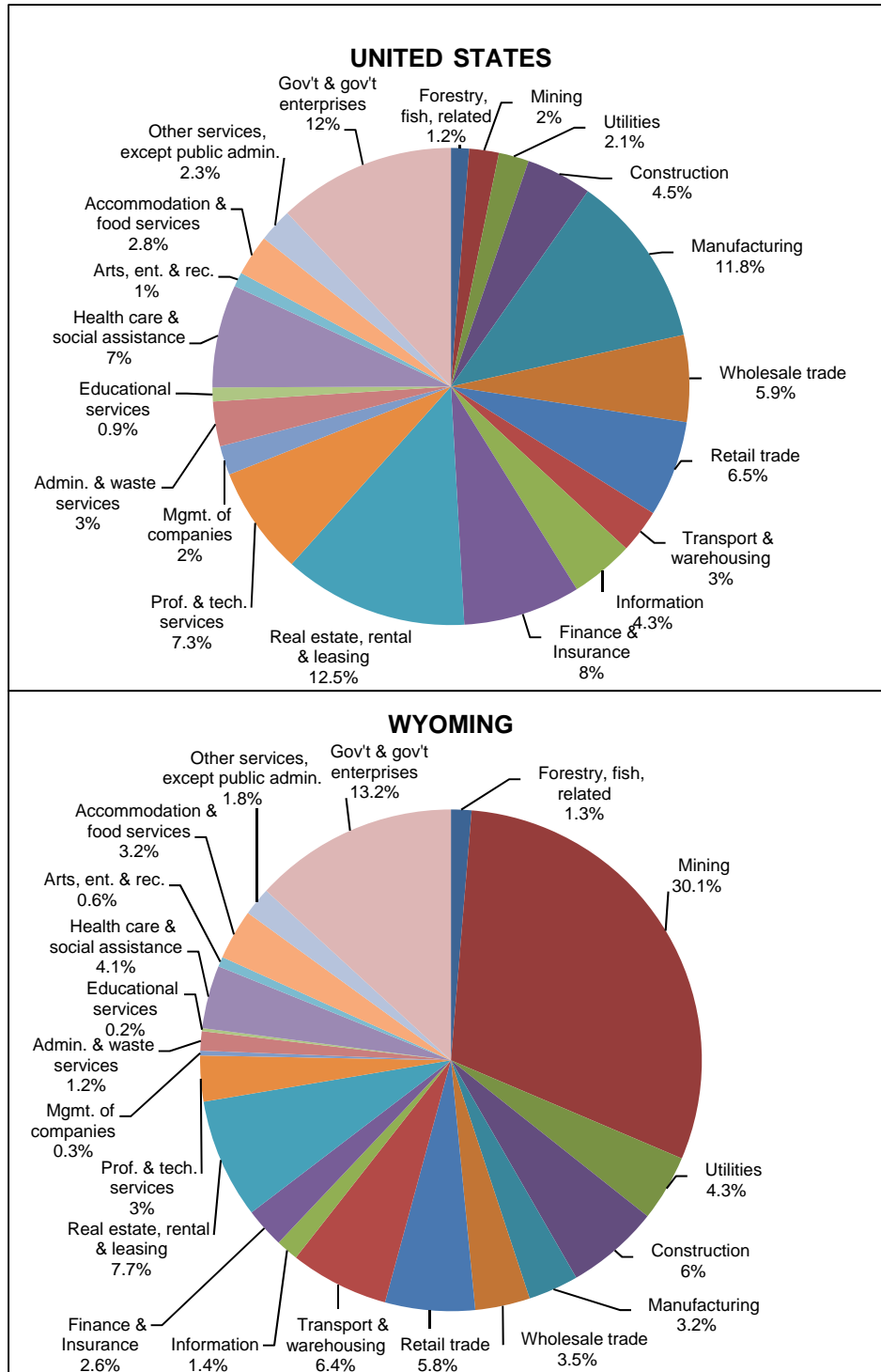


In 2008, the United States reported a Gross Domestic Product of over \$14 trillion. Wyoming’s GDP was one of the lowest in the nation, with \$35.3 billion in 2008, ahead only of Vermont and North Dakota. Chart 7 shows GDP for 2008 for the eight regions of the United States in current dollars for 2008. As illustrated this chart, the Rocky Mountain Region had the lowest GDP in the United States with only \$482 billion in 2008. Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Utah and Wyoming comprise this region. Comparatively, the Southeast Region, made up of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia led the regions with a GDP of \$3.1 trillion.

Chart 8, on the following page, reports the current dollar percentages of the Gross Domestic Product by industry for the United States and Wyoming for 2007. The most noticeable difference between the two charts is the percent distributions. For the United States, the GDP shares are fairly evenly distributed throughout the various sectors. Leading the United States’ GDP are the sectors of Real Estate, Rental and Leasing; Government; and Manufacturing, each responsible for about 12 percent of the United States’ GDP. In contrast, Wyoming’s Gross Domestic Product is dominated by one industry, Mining, which accounts for 30.1 percent of the State’s GDP, compared to only 2 percent of U.S. GDP. As evidenced by employment, income, and Gross Domestic Product data, the influence and benefits that mining has brought to Wyoming are quite significant. The mining industry and the success it has experienced in recent years in Wyoming have had a positive effect on the State’s economy.

Agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting comprise 1.3% of Wyoming's Gross Domestic Product. Although agriculture does not make up a large portion of Wyoming's GDP, it contributes considerably to the culture and lifestyle of Wyoming residents. Wyoming has a rich agricultural history and many rural residents rely on agriculture for their livelihood. The influence and significance of agriculture may not be evident in a basic analysis of Wyoming's economy, but visiting the State or talking with one of the many ranching or farming families reveals the importance of agriculture to Wyoming's identity.

Farm earnings were down in 2007, with over half of Wyoming's counties reporting negative earnings. Sixteen out of the twenty-three counties were affected by the trials and difficulties associated with farming and ranching, resulting in negative earnings. Seven more counties experienced negative earnings in 2007 in comparison to 2006, when only nine counties had negative farm earnings. Several factors, such as rising feed and fuel costs and drought, resulted in lower profits for livestock and crop production. After experiencing one of the most severe droughts in Wyoming's history, pastures and farmlands were in poor condition. In the last few years, the prices for corn and grain have skyrocketed, making it more expensive to feed livestock. Wyoming producers have been receiving lower prices for livestock, which combined with higher fuel and feed prices, lead to reduced profit. Chart 9 illustrates the 2007 farm earnings and number of farms for Wyoming counties. In 2007, there were about 8,800 farms and ranches in Wyoming, with the average size being just over 2,745 acres. In contrast, the United States' average farm size was 418 acres. Chart 9 indicates that a greater number of farms is usually associated with more farm earnings, with the exception of Fremont County. Fremont, Goshen, and Laramie counties had the most farms in Wyoming for 2007, each with over 800 farms. Hot Springs and Teton counties had the fewest farms, with 180 farms in each county.

**Chart 9: Farm Earnings and Number of Farms by County, 2007**

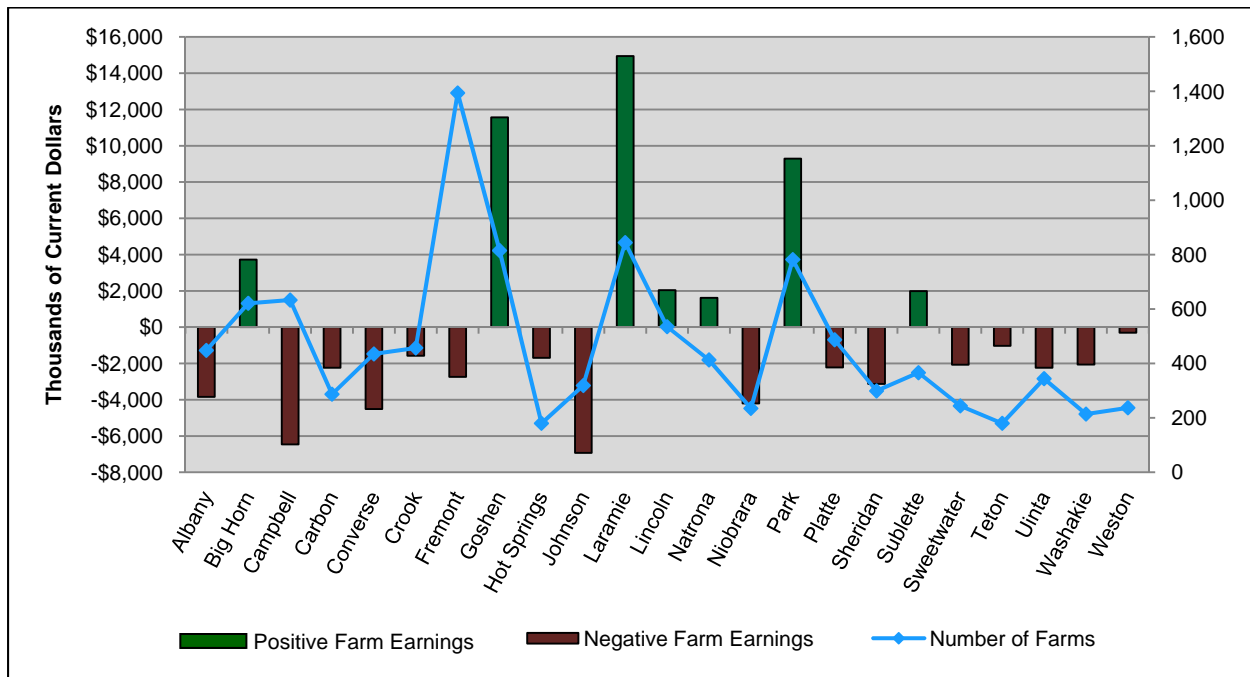

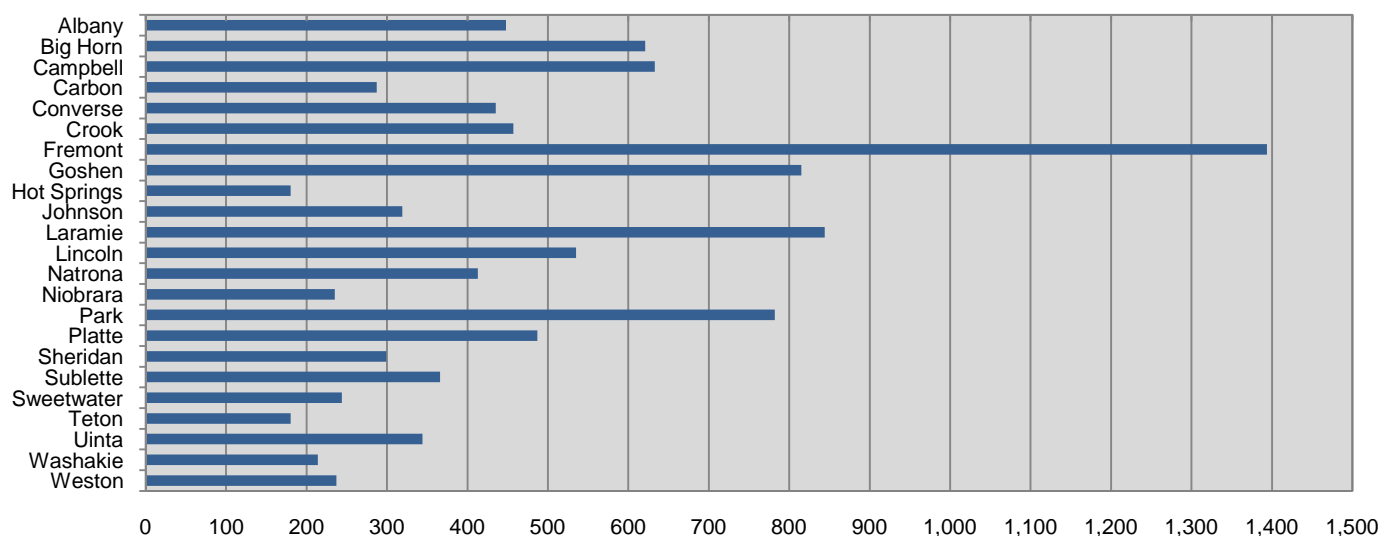

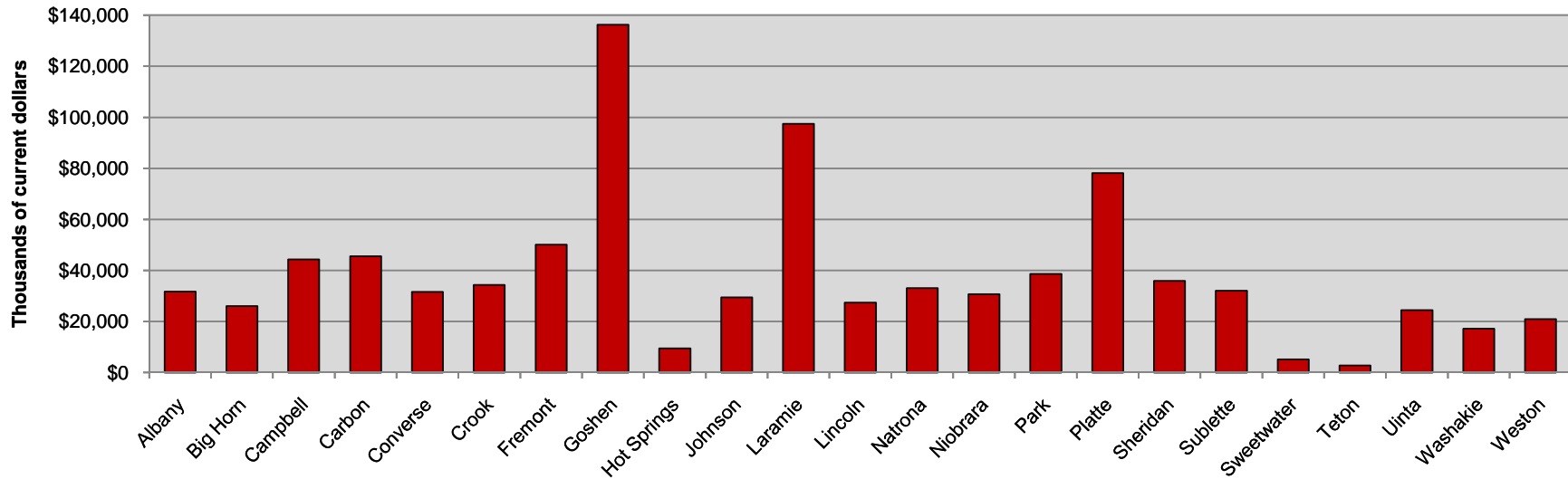

**Number of Farms in Wyoming by County: 2007**

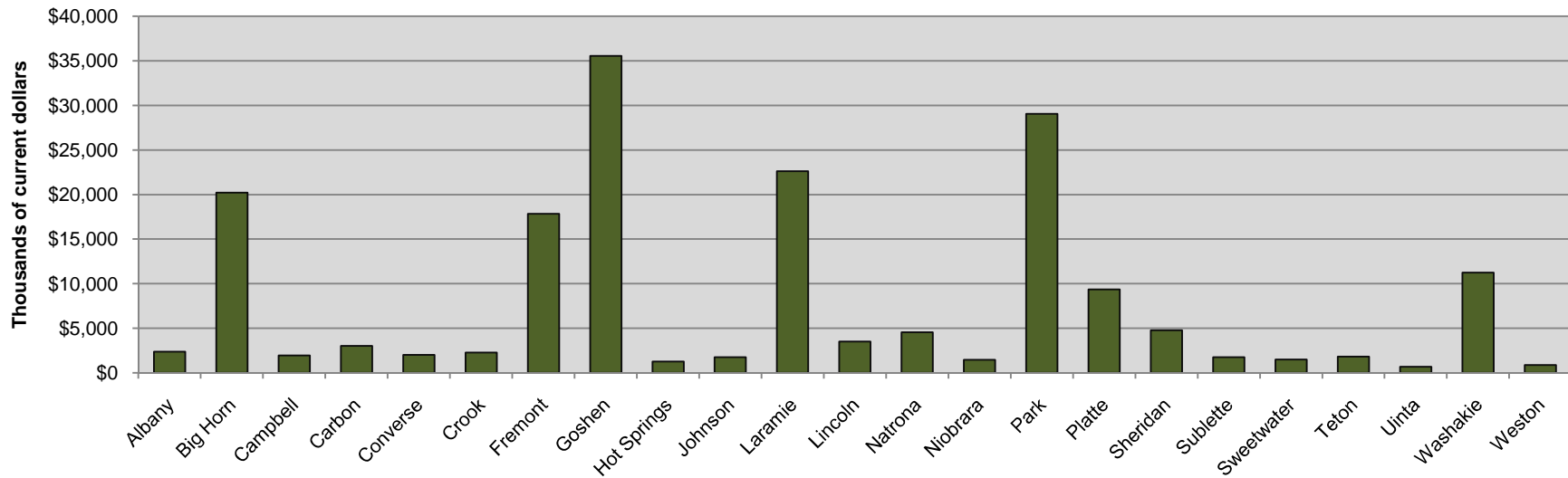

## FOOTNOTES

### **Total Personal Income (TPI):**

- (1) U.S. Census Bureau mid-year population estimates. Estimates for 2001-2007 reflect county population estimates available as of April 2009.
- (2) Contributions for government social insurance are included in earnings by type and industry, but they are excluded from personal income.
- (3) The adjustment for residence is the net inflow of the earnings of inter-area commuters. For the United States, it consists of adjustments for border workers: Wage and salary disbursements to U.S. residents commuting to Canada less wage and salary disbursements to Canadian and Mexican residents commuting into the United States.
- (4) Rental income of persons includes the capital consumption adjustment.
- (5) Proprietors' income includes the inventory valuation adjustment and capital consumption adjustment.
- (6) The estimates of earnings for 2001-2006 are based on the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The estimates for 2007 are based on the 2007 NAICS.
- (7) "Other" consists of wage and salary disbursements to U.S. residents employed by international organizations and foreign embassies and consulates in the United States.

### **Transfer Receipts:**

- (1) Consists largely of temporary disability payments and black lung payments.
- (2) Consists of Medicaid and other medical payments.

- (10) Consists largely of Bureau of Indian Affairs payments, education exchange payments, Alaska Permanent Fund dividend payments, compensation of survivors of public safety officers, compensation of victims of crime, disaster relief payments, compensation for Japanese internment, and other special payments to individuals.

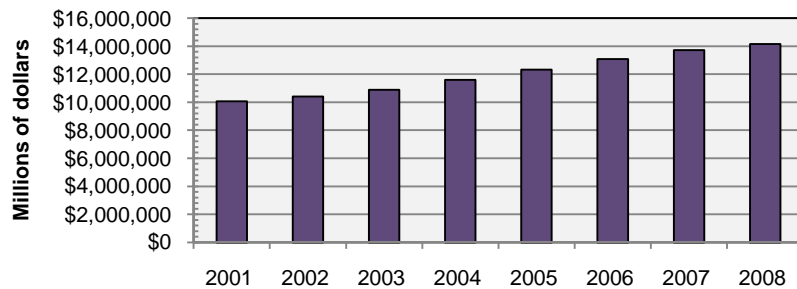

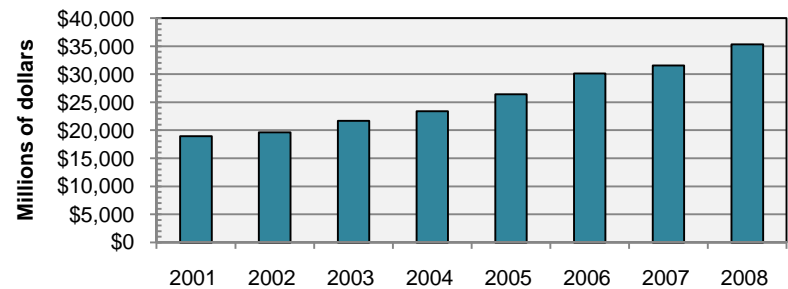

## DATA NOTES

### **EMPLOYMENT:**

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates employment as a count of occupied jobs, not number of employed people. Employment under this definition includes all full-time and part-time jobs. If an individual holds more than one job at any given time, the individual is counted multiple times, once for each employment position occupied. BEA employment also includes proprietors or self-employed, but not unpaid family workers or volunteers. Employment figures in this document are from the BEA.

In contrast, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) counts each employed person only once. The BLS defines an employed person as someone who, during the reference week, performed any type of labor for pay, worked at least 15 hours unpaid in family enterprises, or was temporarily absent from work for non-economic reasons.

Unemployment data is compiled by the BLS. Unemployed persons include those persons who did not work during the reference week, were available for work, and made specific efforts to find employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force.

### **TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME (TPI):**

Total personal income (TPI), as defined by the BEA, is the current income of residents in a particular area from all sources. It is measured after deductions of personal contributions to Social Security, but before personal tax deductions have been made. It includes income received from businesses; federal, state, and local governments; households; institutions; foreign governments; other labor income (such as employers' contributions to private social insurance programs); farm and non-farm proprietor income; dividends, interest, and rent; and transfer payments. It is the only key economic indicator which is adjusted for seasonality; it is not, however, adjusted for price changes.

Because TPI is a measure of income received, estimates of state and local area personal income should reflect the residence of the income recipients. Of the six major components of personal income, three are recorded on a place-of-residence basis: transfer receipts or payments; dividends, interest, and rental income; and proprietors' income. The data available at the state and county level for wages and salaries; other labor income; supplements to wages and salaries; and personal contributions for social insurance, are estimated from data that are recorded by place-of-work.

Four adjustments are made to earnings by place-of-work to derive total personal income by place-of-residence. Following these adjustments, total earnings still comprise the bulk of total personal income. Beginning with total labor and proprietor earnings, the first adjustment is made by deducting contributions for social insurance. Although these are considered part of employee total earnings for the current period, social insurance contributions are not received during the current period and are, therefore, not included in personal income.

The second adjustment is made for employee by place-of-residency. The BEA defines employee residency as the location at which the employee is residing while employed. An example of this type of adjustment is a regular occurrence in Sheridan County, Wyoming. There are employees that work in the coal mines in Montana, but reside in Sheridan County, Wyoming. Earnings for these employees show up as earnings data for Montana. However, in the derivation of personal income by place-of-residence, an adjustment is made to reallocate these earnings as personal income for Wyoming. This residency adjustment for Wyoming is, therefore, the net effect of all interstate place-of-work versus place-of-residence discrepancies.

A third adjustment is made by appending dividends, interest, and rental income. Dividends are payments in cash or other assets, excluding stock, by for-profit corporations to non-corporate stockholders in state. Interest is the monetary and imputed interest income of persons from all sources. Rental income is the monetary income of persons from the rental of real property; the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of non-farm dwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources.

The fourth and final adjustment is the addition of transfer receipts or payments. Transfer receipts or payments are income payments to persons, generally in monetary form, for which they do not render current services. As a component of personal income, they are payments by governments and businesses to individuals and nonprofit institutions. Common examples of transfer payments include Social Security payments and public assistance.

Once these four adjustments to the earnings by place-of-work are made, the result is total personal income by place-of-residence. Personal income effectively measures the size of consumer markets. When presented by industry of origin, as in this report, earnings can also be interpreted as a measure of the size of industrial markets.

Per capita personal income (PCI) is calculated by dividing total personal income of the area by the total population of that area. Per capita personal income is a useful tool to compare income across regions, states, and counties, because it removes the effects of population growth on TPI. Per capita personal income can also be used to track income growth over time.

#### **GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP):**

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for a state as the sum of Gross Domestic Product Originating (GDPO) by industry in all industries. This measure of GDP is the state counterpart of the Nation's gross domestic product (GDP) by industry from the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

The GDPO by industry is the contribution of each industry, including government, to GDP. An industry's GDPO, often referred to as its "value added," is equal to its gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory change) minus its intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased or imported from other industries).

For each industry, the estimate of gross domestic product is composed of four components (estimated in current-dollars only): (1) Compensation of employees; (2) proprietors' income with inventory valuation adjustment (IVA) and capital consumption allowances; (3) indirect business tax and non-tax liability (IBT); and (4) Other, mainly capital related, charges. Most of the compensation and proprietors' income components of GDP are primarily based on BEA's estimates of earnings by place-of-work, an aggregate in the state personal income series. The IBT component of GDP reflects liabilities charged to business expense, most of which are sales and property taxes levied by state and local governments. The capital charges component of GDP comprises corporate profits with IVA, corporate capital consumption allowances, business transfer payments, net interest, rental income of persons, and subsidies less current surplus of government enterprises.

Current and constant (chained) dollar estimates of total GDP are presented for the U.S. and states for the years 2001-2007. Current and constant dollar estimates of GDP by NAICS industry classification are also presented for Wyoming by industry for 2001-2007.

## GLOSSARY

**Chained Dollars** – A measure used to express real prices. It is a measure used to approximate the chained-type index level and is calculated by taking the current-dollar level of a series in the base period and multiplying it by the change in the chained-type quantity index number for the series since the base period. Chained-dollar estimates correctly show growth rates for a series, but are not additive in periods other than the base period.

**Current Dollars** – The market value of an item, which reflects price and quantities of the period being measured and has not been adjusted for inflation. For example, 2007 data in current dollars indicate values based on the worth of the dollar in the year 2007.

**Industry** – A group of establishments that produce similar products or provide similar services. For example, all establishments that manufacture automobiles are in the same industry. A given industry, or even a particular establishment within that industry, might have employees in dozens of occupations. The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) groups similar establishments into industries.

**Inflation** – An increase in the level of consumer prices, or equivalently, a decline in the purchasing power of money. Inflation is defined as a time for generally rising prices for goods and factors of production.

**North American Industry Classification System (NAICS)** – A classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability in industrial statistics across North America. It replaced the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) in 2000. A list of NAICS classifications can be found on page 103.

**Transfer Receipts** – Payments made by the government to individuals and non-profit institutions that are not in exchange for goods and services, such as Social Security payments, and are a component of personal income. The term was previously identified as transfer payments.

## INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

The industry classifications utilized in this report are classified in accordance with the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), published by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. The estimates of earnings for 2001-2006 are based on the 2002 NAICS and estimates for 2007 are based on the 2007 NAICS. The twenty major industrial sectors that comprise NAICS are: 1) Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; 2) Mining; 3) Utilities; 4) Construction; 5) Manufacturing; 6) Wholesale Trade; 7) Retail Trade; 8) Transportation and Warehousing; 9) Information; 10) Finance and Insurance; 11) Real Estate and Rental and Leasing; 12) Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services; 13) Management of Companies and Enterprises; 14) Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services; 15) Educational Services; 16) Health Care and Social Assistance; 17) Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation; 18) Accommodation and Food Services; 19) Other Services (except public administration); and 20) Public Administration. These primary sectors are unchanged from the 2002 NAICS to the 2007 NAICS.

For purposes of this classification, an establishment is an economic unit, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed. Each establishment is assigned an industry code on the basis of its primary activity, which is determined by its principal product (or group of products) produced or distributed, or services rendered. Ideally, the principal product or service should be determined by its relative share of "value added" at the establishment. In practice, however, it is rarely possible to obtain this measure for individual products or services. Typically, it is necessary to adopt some other criterion which may be expected to give approximately the same results in determining the primary activity of an establishment.

Occasionally, in activity-diversified establishments, the appropriate measure cannot be determined or estimated for each product or service. In some instances, an industry classification based upon the recommended output measure will not adequately represent the relative economic importance of each of the varied activities carried on at such establishments. In such cases, employment or payroll information should be used to determine the primary activity of a particular establishment.

Due to this broad categorization of multi-sector establishments under one code, estimates will frequently be understated in one sector and overstated in another. While this does not influence the accuracy of either county or state totals, it will obviously have an effect upon estimates for a particular sector.

Data from business tax returns, provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), are used to generate detailed industrial estimates of self-employed individuals at the national level. At the state level, Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) records on individuals making self-employed contributions are used to get first round estimates by industry. This has resulted in an increase in the count of self-employed individuals, which was prompted by the following factors. First, those proprietors who were previously only counted once in the Current Population Survey (CPS), but who are in fact proprietors of two or more businesses, are now being counted once for each business. In addition, all persons formerly classified solely as wage and salary employees, but also spend some time as sole proprietors or participating partners in businesses, are now being counted in each of their multiple positions.

NAICS is reviewed every five years to determine if any changes are necessary to maintain the relevance, accuracy, and timeliness of the classifications. Identifying emerging industries is a primary focus of NAICS reviews. Regular evaluations of NAICS classifications are important steps toward greater global comparability of industry activities.

## NORTH AMERICAN INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM (NAICS)

**11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting:** The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or their natural habitats. The establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: agricultural production and agricultural support activities. Production includes establishments performing the complete farm operation whereas the support includes the performance of one or more activities associated with farm operation.

**21 Mining:** The Mining sector comprises establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. The term mining is used in the broad sense to include quarrying, well operations, beneficiating (e.g., crushing, screening, washing, and flotation), and other preparation customarily performed at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: mine operation and mining support activities. Operation includes establishments operating mines, quarries, or oil and gas wells on their own account or for others on a contract or fee basis. Support activities include establishments that perform exploration and/or other mining services on a contract or fee basis.

**22 Utilities:** The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities.

**23 Construction:** The Construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g. highways and utility systems). Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in subdividing land for sale as building sites are also included in this sector.

**31-33 Manufacturing:** The Manufacturing sector comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing, except in the cases where the activity is appropriately classified in Sector 23, Construction. Establishments in the Manufacturing sector are often characterized as plants, factories, or mills; however, establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public are also included in this sector.

**42 Wholesale Trade:** The Wholesale Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The merchandise described in this sector includes the output of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office. These warehouses and offices are characterized by having little display of merchandise.

**44-45 Retail Trade:** The Retail Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of the merchandise. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high

volume of walk-in customers. This type generally has extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers. Nonstore retailers are organized to serve the general public and reach their customers and market their merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of “infomercials,” the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-to-door solicitations, and distribution through vending machines.

**48-49 Transportation and Warehousing:** The Transportation and Warehousing sector includes industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation. Establishments in these industries use transportation equipment or transportation related facilities as a productive asset. The type of equipment depends on the mode of transportation. The modes of transportation include air, rail, water, road, and pipeline.

**51 Information:** The Information sector comprises establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. The main components of this sector are publishing industries, motion picture and sound recording industries, broadcasting industries, telecommunications industries, Web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries.

**52 Finance and Insurance:** The Finance and Insurance sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions (transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets) and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) Raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities; and (3) Providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs.

**53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing:** The Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks.

**54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services:** The Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector comprises establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others. These activities require a high degree of expertise and training. The establishments in this sector specialize according to expertise and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries, and in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services.

**55 Management of Companies and Enterprises:** The Management of Companies and Enterprises sector comprises (1) establishments that hold the securities of (or other equity interests in) companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or (2) establishments (except government establishments) that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that normally undertake the strategic or organizational planning and decision making role of the company or enterprise. Establishments that administer, oversee, and manage may hold the securities of the company or enterprise.

**56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services:**

The Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services sector comprises establishments performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations. These essential activities are often undertaken in-house by establishments in many sectors of the economy. The establishments in this sector specialize in one or more of these support activities and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries and, in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services.

**61 Educational Services:** The Educational Services sector comprises establishments that provide instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects. This instruction and training is provided by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges, universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and/or accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning. Instruction is imparted in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home.

**62 Health Care and Social Assistance:** The Health Care and Social Assistance sector comprises establishments providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities. The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. The services provided by establishments in this sector are delivered by trained professionals. All industries in the sector share this commonality of process, namely, labor inputs of health practitioners or social workers with the requisite expertise. Many of the industries in the sector are defined based on the educational degree held by the practitioners included in the industry.

**71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation:** The Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation sector includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing; (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests.

**72 Accommodation and Food Services:** The Accommodation and Food Services sector comprises establishments providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, and beverages for immediate consumption. The sector includes both accommodation and food services establishments because the two activities are often combined at the same establishment. Excluded from this sector are civic and social organizations; amusement and recreation parks; theatres; and other recreation or entertainment facilities providing food and beverage services.

**81 Other Services (except Public Administration):** The Other Services (except Public Administration) sector comprises establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system. Establishments in this sector are primarily engaged in activities, such as equipment and machinery repair, promoting or administering religious activities, grant making, advocacy, and dry-cleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services.

**92 Public Administration:** The Public Administration sector consists of establishments of federal, state, and local government agencies that administer, oversee, and manage public programs and have executive, legislative, or judicial authority over other institutions within a given area. These agencies also set policy, create laws, adjudicate civil and criminal legal cases, provide for public safety and for national defense. In general, government establishments in the Public Administration sector oversee governmental programs and activities that are not performed by private establishments. Establishments in this sector typically are engaged in the organization and financing of the production of public goods and services, most of which are provided for free or at prices that are not economically significant.
