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INTRODUCTION

The *2010 Wyoming Employment, Income, and Gross Domestic Product Report* serves as a compendium of Federal government data, highlighting Wyoming and its twenty-three counties. The report contains several of the best indicators of Wyoming's demographic and economic growth and is presented in a format which can be used for planning and projection purposes.

Specifically, data contained within the publication include:

- Total Employment, Employment by Industry, and Unemployment Rates for the United States, individual states, Wyoming, and counties.
- Income descriptions such as Total Personal Income, Per Capita Personal Income, Total Personal Income by Source and Earnings by Major Industry, and Average Wage and Salary per Job for the United States, Wyoming, and counties.
- Personal Transfer Receipts and Farm Income for Wyoming.
- Total Gross Domestic Product data for the United States and individual states; Gross Domestic Product by Industry for the United States and Wyoming.

All information contained herein, except unemployment data, was obtained from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA). The U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) served as the source for the unemployment rates. Source websites are listed below:

The BEA compiles employment and income data on a place of work basis, therefore a residence adjustment has been made. Employment and income data were compiled according to the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). Gross Domestic Product was also compiled using NAICS. NAICS is a classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability of industrial statistics across North America. Detailed information about data compilation is located in the Data Notes, Glossary, and Industry Classification section, pages 97 - 100. Definitions of the major NAICS sector classifications are found on pages 101 - 104. Due to processing time, the release of a majority of the data is lagged approximately 24 to 48 months.

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Summary

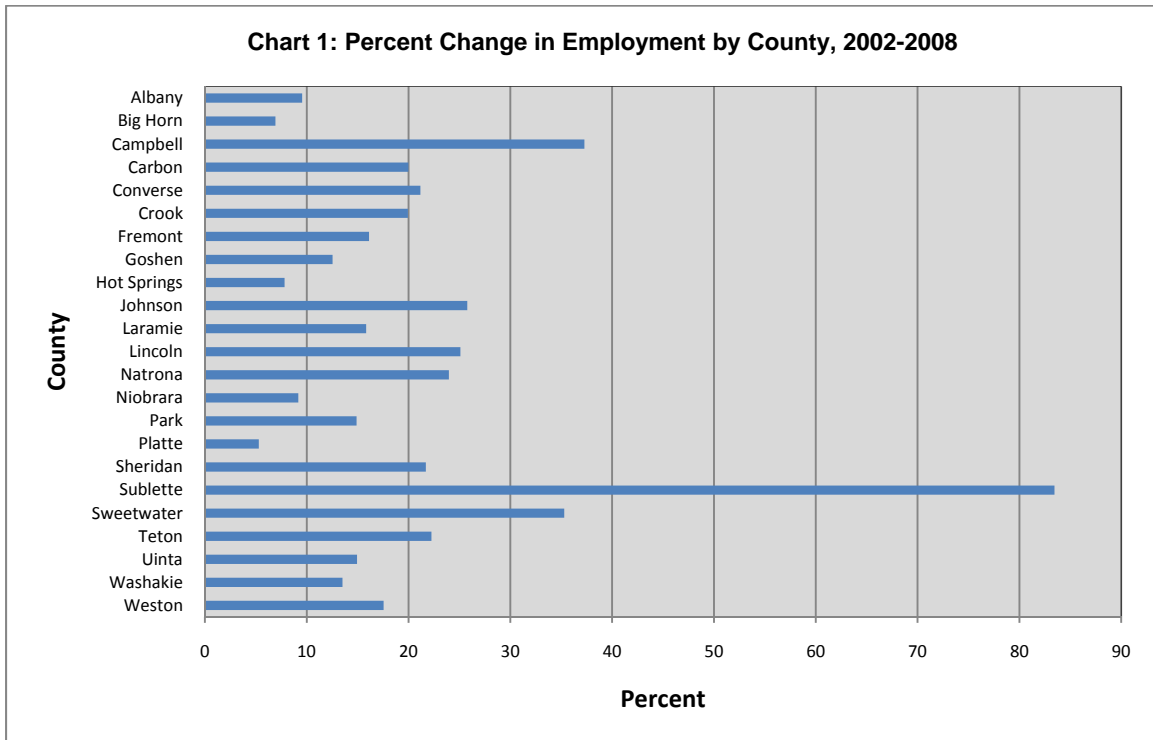
Employment

Compared to the rest of the United States, Wyoming has faced better employment conditions in recent years. Total employment in Wyoming increased 3.9% between 2007 and 2008, from 389,485 to 404,855 occupied jobs. From 2002 to 2008, Wyoming employment increased 21.3%. The United States, as a whole, has experienced an increase of just 1.0% in total employment in 2008 from the preceding year, from approximately 180 million jobs to 182 million. Total employment in the United States increased 10.1% between 2002 and 2008.

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) measures total employment by occupied jobs. Individual employers are surveyed to determine the total number of occupied jobs. All compensated jobs are counted, regardless of part or full-time employment. The BEA gives equal weight to full-time and part time jobs in its estimates of employment. Those who hold two jobs are counted twice. Wage and salary jobs and proprietors' jobs are counted, but unpaid family workers and volunteers are not.

All Wyoming counties incurred growth in total employment from 2002 to 2008. The counties with the largest increases in total employment during this time span include Sublette, Campbell and Sweetwater, with increases of 83.4%, 37.3%, and 35.3%, respectively. Employment growth in these counties was attributed to the mining boom, which provided high-paying mining jobs and also spurred an increase in employment for other industries as well.

In 2008, Wyoming experienced the largest annual percentage increase in total employment out of all fifty U.S. states. Most counties in Wyoming saw an increase in employment from the previous year. Lincoln County faced a year-over decrease of 3.3% in total employment in 2008, from 11,104 in 2007 to 10,736 in 2008. The largest percentage of year-over total employment growth in 2008 was in Converse County, with an 8.2% increase. The chart below shows the percentage increase in total employment from 2002 to 2008 in each Wyoming county.

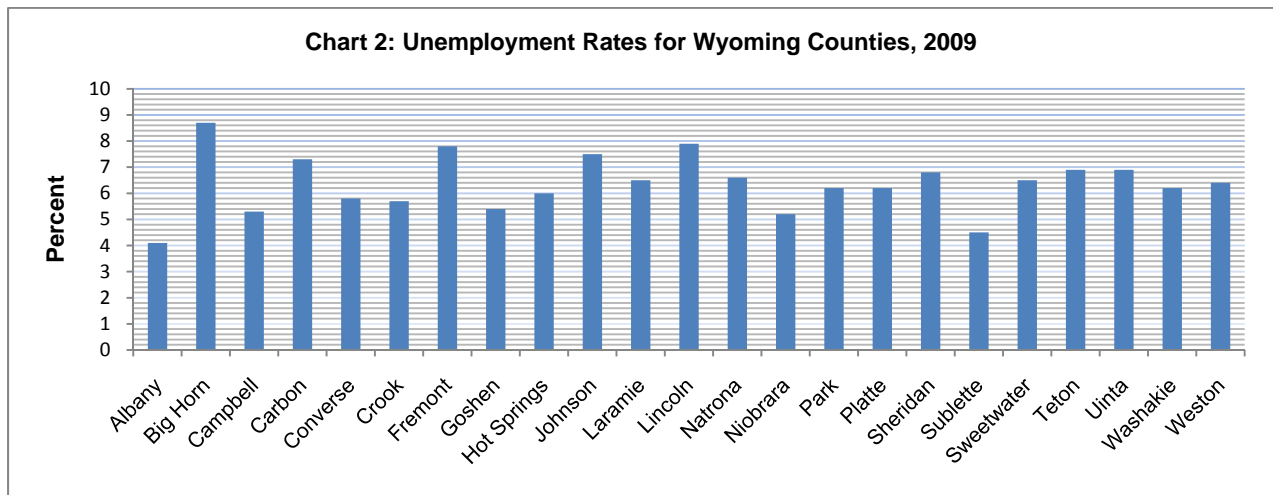


The unemployment rate for Wyoming in 2009 was 6.4%, which was the seventh lowest unemployment rate out of all fifty U.S. states. In comparison to the United States as a whole, Wyoming fared well in 2009 because the unemployment rate for the United States was 9.3%.

According to the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS), unemployed persons are those ages 16 and over who do not have a job, have actively looked for a job in the prior four weeks, and are currently available for work. Actively looking for work can include contacting potential employers, sending out resumes or filling out applications, and placing or answering advertisements among other methods of seeking employment.

To determine the unemployment rate, the percentage of unemployed persons is compared to the whole labor force. The labor force is a combination of all unemployed and employed persons. People not seeking either part-time or full-time employment are not part of the labor force. Likewise, persons who are under the age of 16, persons in an institution such as a nursing home or a corrections facility, and persons serving on active duty in the Armed Forces are not included in the labor force.

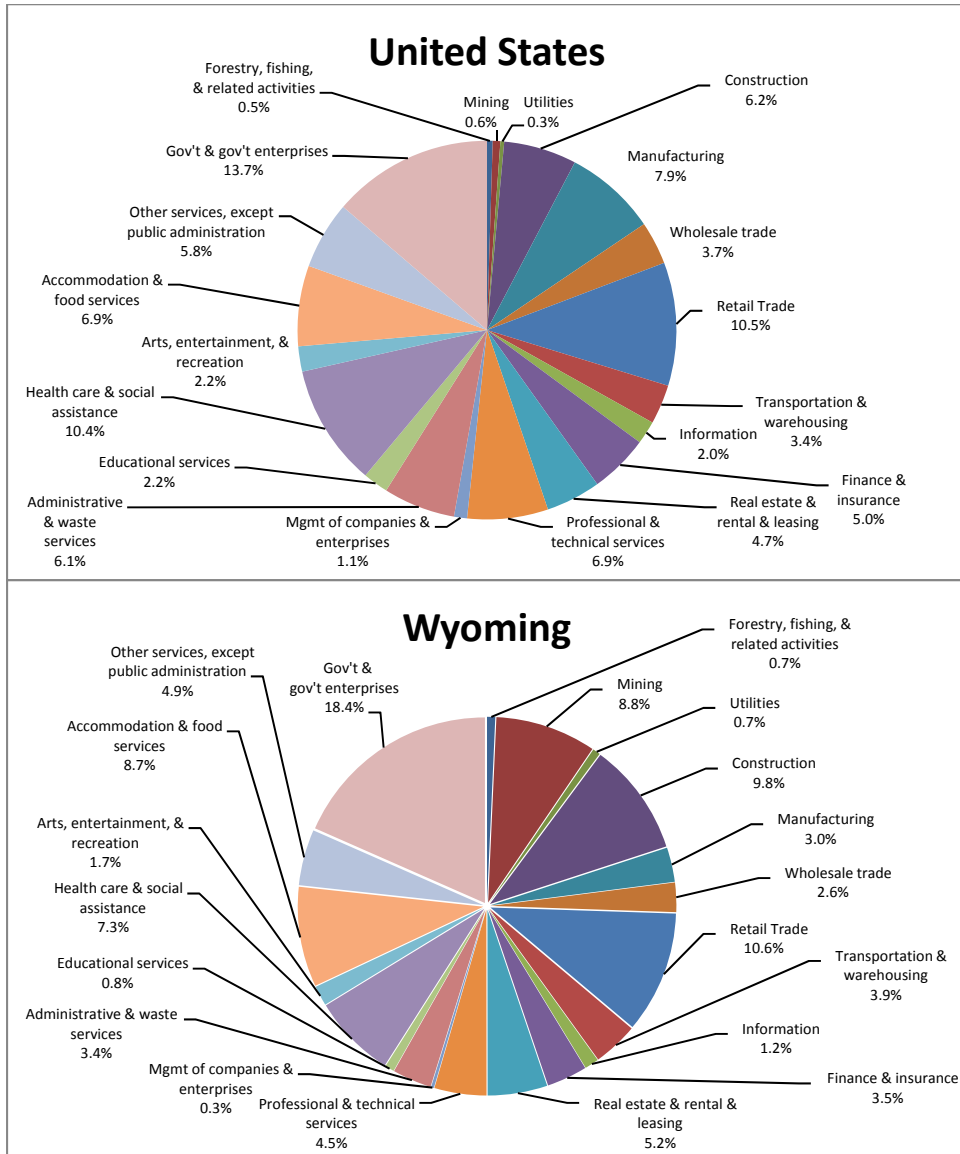
The three Wyoming counties with the lowest unemployment rates in 2009 were Albany, Sublette, and Niobrara, with rates of 4.1%, 4.5%, and 5.2%, respectively. A reason for the low unemployment rate in Albany County is because of the consistent growth in student enrollment in recent years at the University of Wyoming. Sublette County has steady employment from natural gas extraction in the Jonah Field, as well as employment in other mining activities. The three Wyoming counties with the highest unemployment rates were Big Horn, Lincoln, and Fremont with 8.7%, 7.9%, and 7.8%, respectively.



Of the twenty primary North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) sectors, Wyoming's *Mining* sector experienced the greatest year-over employment growth in 2008, increasing 14.2%. Likewise, the *Mining* sector led Wyoming's employment growth, from 2002 to 2008, with an increase of 71.0%, boosting employment by over fourteen thousand jobs during that time, and defining the industry as an employment leader for the state. Other sectors demonstrating significant employment growth in Wyoming included *Real Estate and Rental and Leasing* and *Professional and Technical Services*. Employment growth in *Real Estate and Rental and Leasing* increased 70.2% from 2002 to 2008, or by 8,377 jobs. Employment growth in *Professional and Technical Services* increased 29.5% from 2002 to 2008, or by 4,059 jobs.

The chart on the next page represents the distribution of employment by sector according to the 20 different NAICS industry sectors in the United States and Wyoming.

Chart 3: Distribution of Employment by NAICS Industry for the United States and Wyoming, 2008



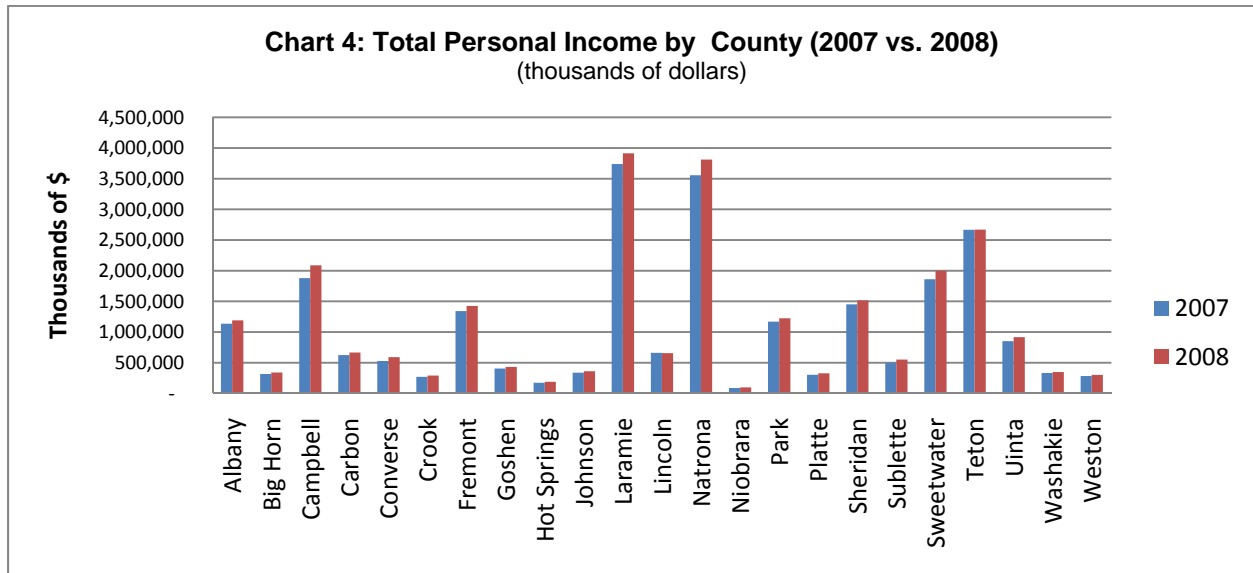
Income

Total Personal Income (TPI), defined by the BEA, is income received by all persons from all sources. Any current, before-tax income of residents less personal contributions to government social insurance is counted. These sources include income received from participation in production and government or business transfer payments. Examples of income received from participation in production include wages, salaries, and rental income. An example of a transfer payment is Social Security.

The TPI for the United States rose 2.9% from 2007 to 2008, climbing from \$11.9 trillion to \$12.2 trillion. North Dakota, Alaska, and South Dakota all had the highest TPI increases from 2007 to 2008, with increases of 9.3%, 7.8%, and 7.1%, respectively. Much of the increases can be attributed to the small population in each state, where a small increase in TPI for any of these three states could seem relatively large given their small

populations. Texas, California, and New York all experienced the largest numerical increases in TPI from 2007 to 2008, with increases of \$40.8 billion, \$31.8 billion, and \$25.1 billion, respectively.

From 2007 to 2008, Wyoming TPI increased 5.9%. Niobrara County led all Wyoming counties with an increase of 13.3%, while Lincoln County was the only Wyoming county with a decrease in TPI, down 1.1%. The chart below depicts TPI for each Wyoming county in both 2007 and 2008, in thousands of dollars.



TPI does not account for the population of an area, thus, making a comparison between two areas difficult. To offset this population discrepancy among different counties, states, and regions, the Per Capita Personal Income (PCI) measure is used for comparing different locations.

PCI is calculated by taking the TPI of the residents of a given area and dividing it by the resident population of that area. In computing PCI for states and counties, BEA uses the U.S. Census Bureau's annual mid-year population estimates. The population for all years is estimated as of July 1, except for seasonal populations, such as the college student population, which is measured as of April 1.

Sometimes, local area PCI estimates may be misleading for a couple of reasons. In some cases, an unusually high or low PCI is the brief result of unusual conditions, such as a bumper crop or a natural disaster. In other instances, the income levels of certain groups atypical of the resident population may cause a longer-term high or low PCI that is not indicative of the economic well-being of the area. For example, a major construction project, such as a power plant, attracts highly paid workers whose incomes are measured at the construction site. This high PCI may not be indicative of the usual economic well-being of the permanent residents of the area.

On the other hand, the occurrence of a large institutional population, such as that of a college or a prison, will tend to keep the PCI of an area at a lower level because the residents of these institutions have little income. This lower PCI does not represent the economic health of the other residents of the area. This affects a few counties in Wyoming. Albany County is home to the University of Wyoming, which causes a lower PCI for the county. Wyoming counties with prisons and other correctional facilities, such as Carbon, Goshen, and Niobrara, may also be affected.

The PCI estimates can also be misleading in areas where population changes rapidly. Population is measured at mid-year; however, income is measured over a year. A significant change in the population of an area during the year, particularly if it occurs around mid-year, can cause a misrepresentation in the PCI estimates.

In counties where farm income dominates other sources of income, additional concerns should be taken into account. Farm proprietors' income as measured for PCI reflects returns from current production; it does not measure current cash flows. Sales from inventories are included in current gross farm income, but they are excluded from net farm income because they represent income from a previous year's production. Additions to inventories are included in net farm income at current market prices; therefore, farmers' attempts to regulate their cash flows by adjusting inventories are not reflected in BEA's farm proprietors' income estimates. However, this regulation of cash flows by farmers extends their earnings cycles, so it helps them to survive losses or lowered income for 2 or 3 years. In addition, the PCI of sparsely populated counties that are dependent on farming will react more sharply to the changes of weather, world market demand, and government policies related to agriculture than that of counties where the sources of income are more diversified. Despite these concerns, PCI is a valuable measure to compare incomes across geographies. These precautions help to paint the complete picture of an area's economic well-being.

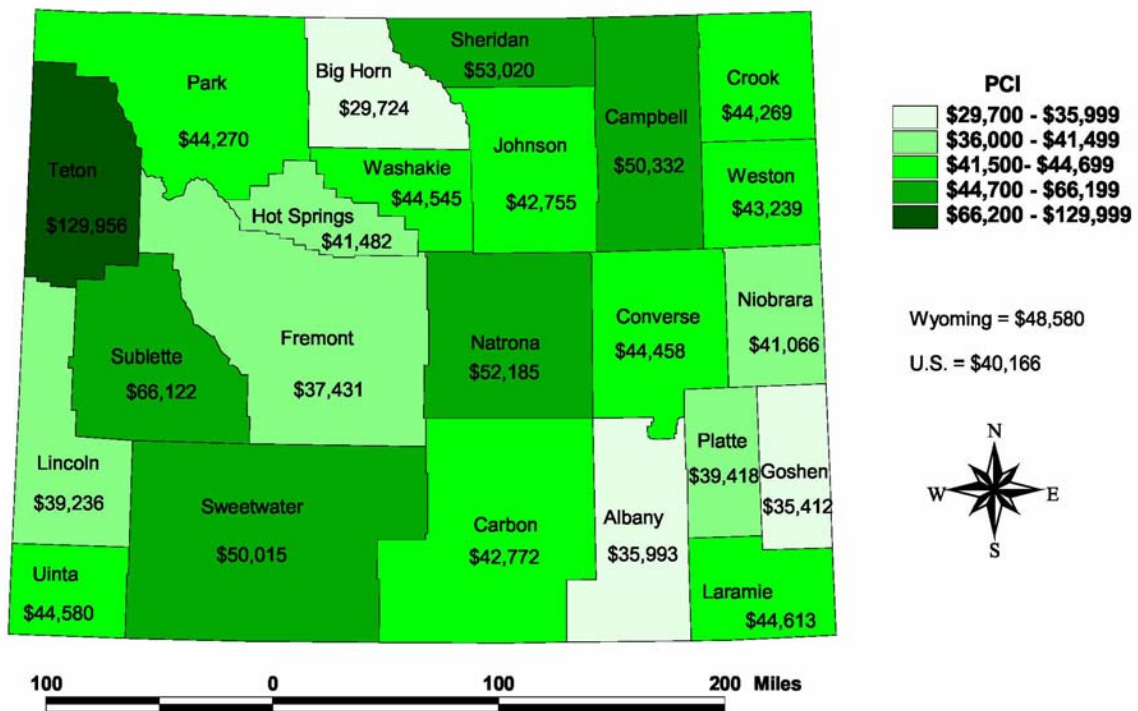
PCI for the United States in 2008 was \$40,166, a 2.0% increase from the prior year. PCI for Wyoming in 2008 was \$48,580, or \$8,414 more than that of the national average. The PCI for Wyoming was 20.9% larger than the PCI for the United States. The percentage increase in PCI from 2007 to 2008 in Wyoming was 4.0%, which was the 4th largest increase of all states in the U.S. The only states to fare better during this time period were North Dakota, Alaska, and South Dakota. In 2008, Wyoming's PCI was the 5th highest in the U.S., surpassed by New Jersey, New York, Massachusetts, and Connecticut.

The remarkable growth in Wyoming's PCI in recent years was due to the high wages associated with the increased economic activity in the state predominantly from the booming *Mining* sector. In 2002, before the mining boom, Wyoming's PCI was \$32,075, which was \$613, or 1.9%, larger than that of the national average. From 2002 to 2008, national PCI increased by 27.7%, with an annual growth rate of 4.2%. Likewise, Wyoming's PCI increased 51.5% during the same time span, with an annual average growth rate of 7.2%. During this time period inflation measured 17.8%, according to the U.S. Consumer Price Index.

Of all Wyoming's counties, Teton County had the highest PCI in 2008, at \$129,956. There are several reasons that may be attributable to this high PCI. Some residents in Teton County have large incomes and the population of the county is small, so a few ultra-wealthy individuals can skew the PCI higher. Many people who work in Teton County live in nearby Idaho or other Wyoming counties to avoid the high cost of living, and their incomes and population do not factor into Teton County's PCI. However, Teton County is unique and does not represent the PCI trend in that of Wyoming's other 22 counties. Unlike the source of income in many of Wyoming's counties, much of the source of income by residents of Teton County comes from dividends and interest, not from wages and salary. Following Teton County, Sublette County has the second highest PCI in Wyoming, with a PCI of \$66,122 in 2008. The high PCI in this county is due to high wages paid to employees in the *Mining* sector. The lowest PCI of all Wyoming counties was Big Horn County, with a PCI of \$29,724. Big Horn County has a smaller, more rural and agricultural-based economy than does other parts of the state, which contributes to a smaller PCI for the county.

As previously mentioned, TPI includes all forms of income, including salary and wages, dividends, interest earned, rent and personal transfers like Social Security. In the United States, the major source of income is from salaries and wages, which accounted for 53.5% of TPI in 2008. The major industries that provided wages and salaries in the United States in 2008 were in the private sector, accounting for 82.2% of all earnings by place of work. In contrast, the government sector supplied 16.9% of all earnings by place-of-work. The sectors that showed the most earnings by place-of-work were *Manufacturing, Health Care and Social Assistance, and Professional and Technical Services*. Since 2002, the sectors that demonstrated the greatest growth in TPI for the U.S. were *Mining, Professional and Technical Services, and Educational Services*, with increases of 109.6%, 46.7%, and 45.8%, respectively.

In Wyoming, earnings by place-of-work are a smaller component of TPI than it is in most of the nation. Earnings by place-of-work make up just 49.8% of TPI in the state. Also, government employment in Wyoming makes up a larger percentage of earnings by place-of-work than does for the national average, up to 22.2% in 2008. The major players that provide wages and salaries in Wyoming are not as significant in other parts of the United States. For example, the *Mining* sector makes up 17% of earnings by place-of-work in Wyoming, while only providing 1.2% of earnings by place-of-work in the rest of the nation. The sectors that contributed to the major sources of TPI in Wyoming in 2008 are in *Mining, Construction, and Health Care and Social Assistance*. Wyoming had a larger proportion of workers in the *Mining and Government* sectors in comparison to the U.S.

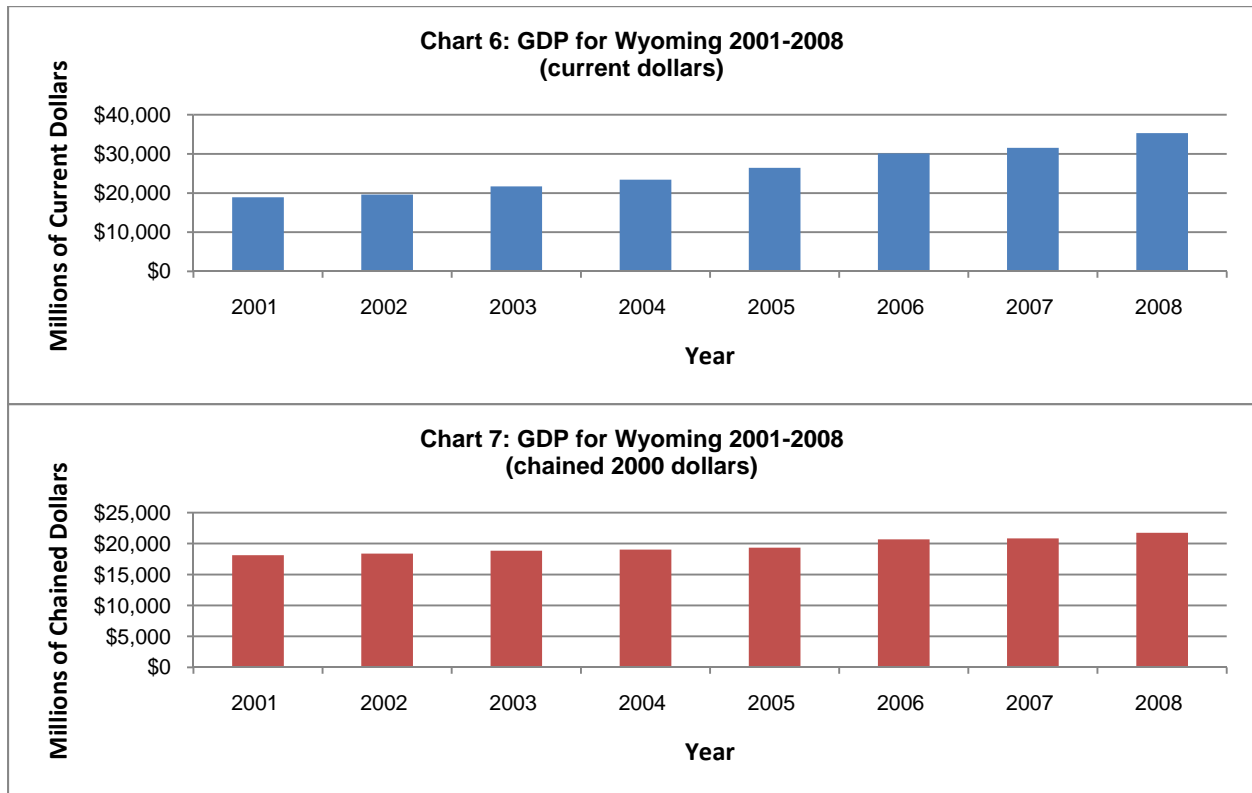
Although PCI is higher in Wyoming than it is in the rest of the nation, the average wage per job is more throughout most of the nation than it is in Wyoming. The average wage per job is defined as the total wages and salaries in a certain area divided by the number of jobs; both full and part-time jobs are included.

Supplements to wages, including bonuses, paid vacation, and retirement incentives are not included. The United States' average wage per job in 2008 was \$45,716, while in Wyoming it was \$41,906.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP)

Originally referred to as Gross State Product (GSP), Gross Domestic Product (GDP) by state is an inclusive measure of economic activity within a state. It is the total market value of goods and services produced by the labor and property within a state during a specified period of time. Also, equivalent to sales less intermediate inputs, GDP is reported using both current (nominal) and chained (real) dollars. Yearly increases in GDP can be attributed to the rise in the quantity or price of production. Current dollars reflect the period in which they are being reported, have not been adjusted for inflation, and are the market value of an item. This measure reflects the value of a dollar for each specific year. Chained dollars, however, are compared and adjusted according to a base year to express real prices. For example, the GDP data uses chained 2000 dollars, meaning that the years of 2001 through 2008 are multiplied by the change in the chained-type quantity index number which produces a figure in 2000 dollars. Using chained dollars allows data users to more accurately evaluate growth through the years by negating the change of inflation. When comparing over time periods, it is best to use chained dollars.

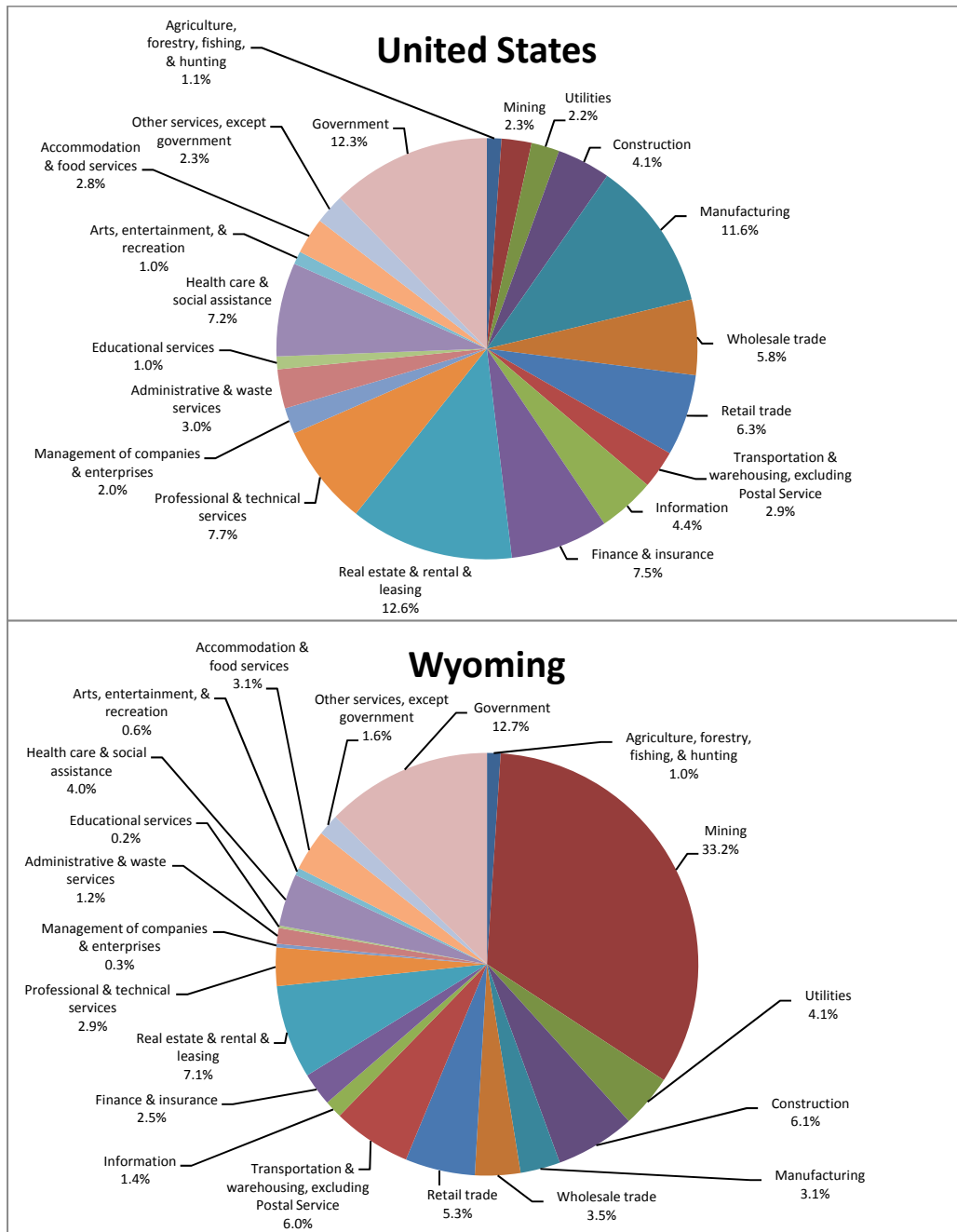
In 2008, U.S. GDP was approximately \$14.2 trillion. Wyoming had the third smallest GDP in 2008, \$35.3 billion, which was ahead of only Vermont and North Dakota. This is not necessarily a negative indicator, as Wyoming has the smallest population of all 50 states, and a small GDP is expected. When looking at chained dollars, Wyoming ranked second lowest in GDP, at \$21.75 billion. The following charts depict the GDP by state for Wyoming from 2001 to 2008. The first chart shows the current dollar GDP for Wyoming, while the second shows the GDP chained to 2000 dollars.



The year-over increase in GDP for Wyoming in 2008, in chained dollars, was 4.4%. The increase, in chained dollars, from 2001 to 2008, was 20.1%, which represented an average annual growth rate of 2.6%. In comparison, the United States saw a year-over increase of just 0.74% GDP for 2008, in chained dollars. Since 2001, the United States has incurred an increase of 17.2% in GDP, which revealed an average annual growth rate of 2.3%. From 2001 to 2008, GDP in Wyoming has grown faster than has the national GDP, in chained dollars.

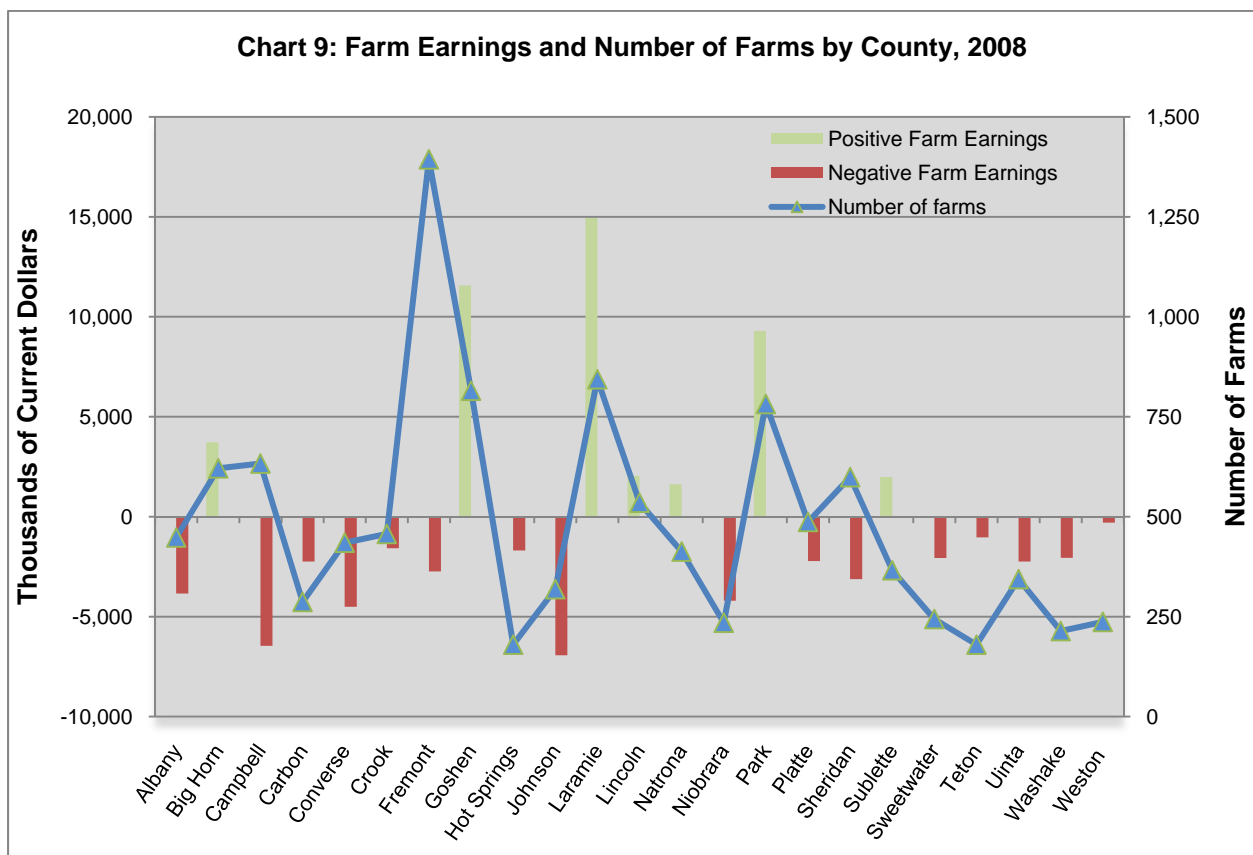
The following charts show GDP contribution of each of the 20 major NAICS sectors as a percentage of total GDP for U.S. and Wyoming.

Farm earnings were down in 2008, with over half of Wyoming's counties reporting negative earnings. Sixteen out of the twenty-three counties were affected by the trials and difficulties associated with farming and ranching, which resulted in negative earnings. Seven more counties experienced negative earnings in 2008, in comparison to 2007, when only nine counties had negative farm earnings. Several factors, such as rising feed and fuel costs, and drought, resulted in lower profits for livestock and crop production. After experiencing one of the most severe droughts in Wyoming's history, pastures and farmlands were in poor condition. In the last few years, the prices for corn and grain have skyrocketed, making it more expensive to feed livestock. Wyoming producers have been receiving lower prices for livestock, which combined with higher fuel and feed costs, lead to reduced profit. The following chart illustrates the 2008 farm earnings and number of farms for Wyoming counties. In 2008, there were about 11,000 farms and ranches in Wyoming, with the average size of just over 2,736 acres. In contrast, the United States' average farm size was 418 acres.

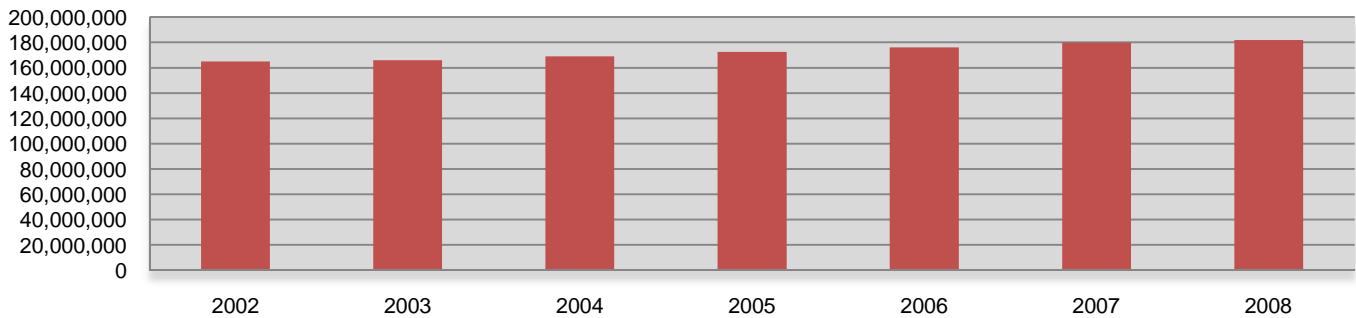

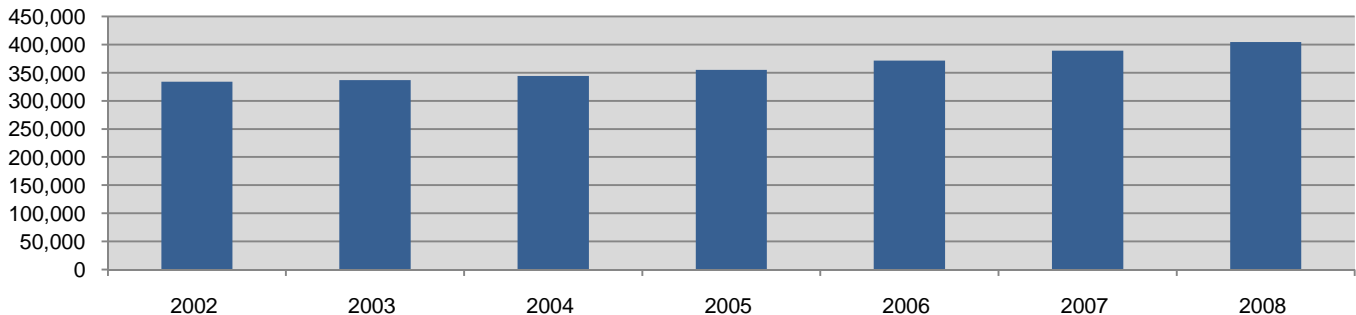

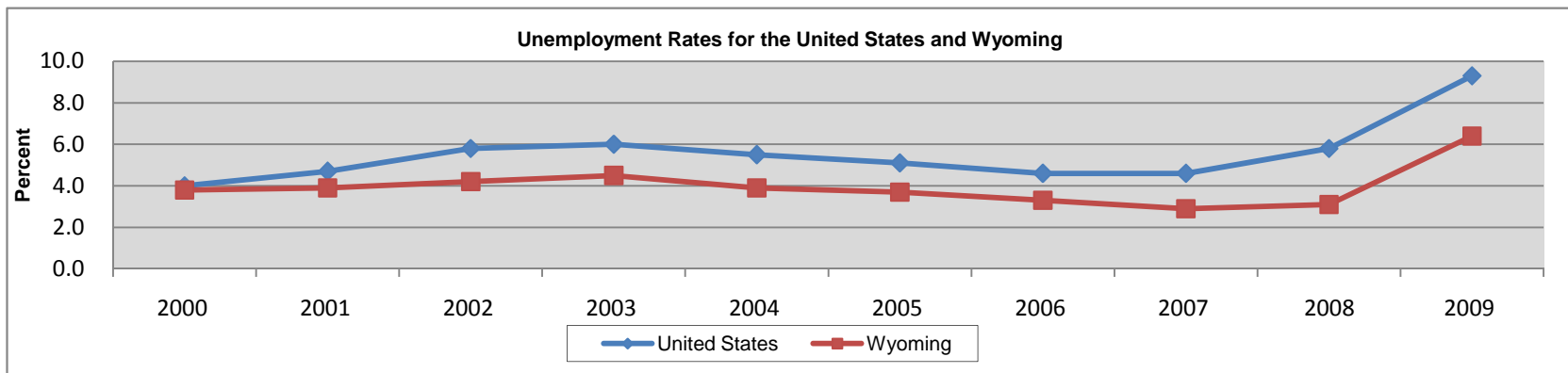

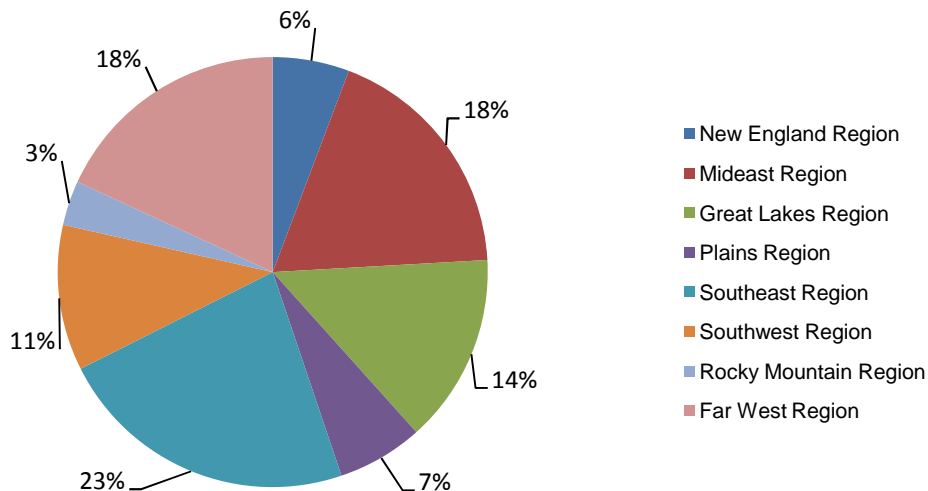

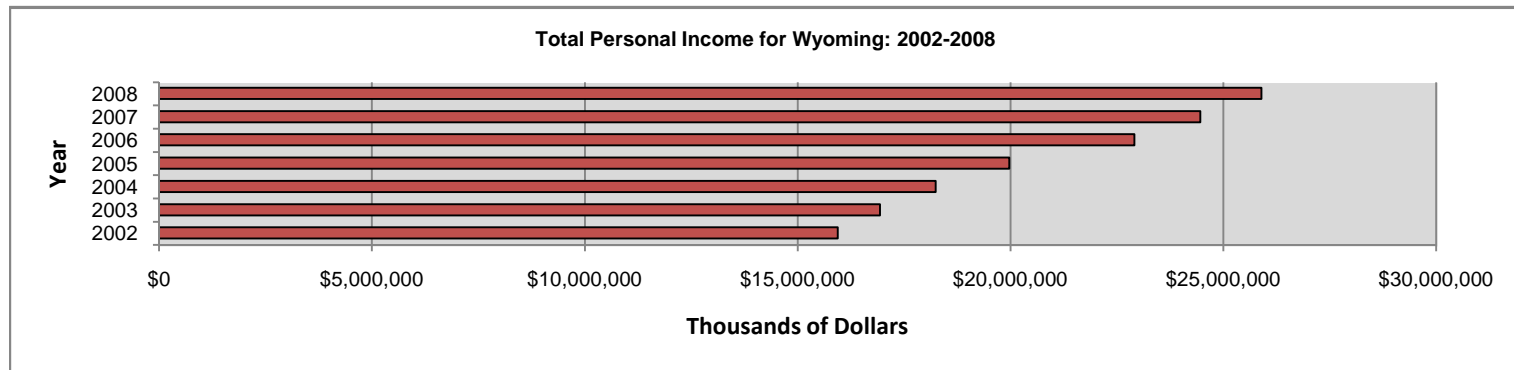

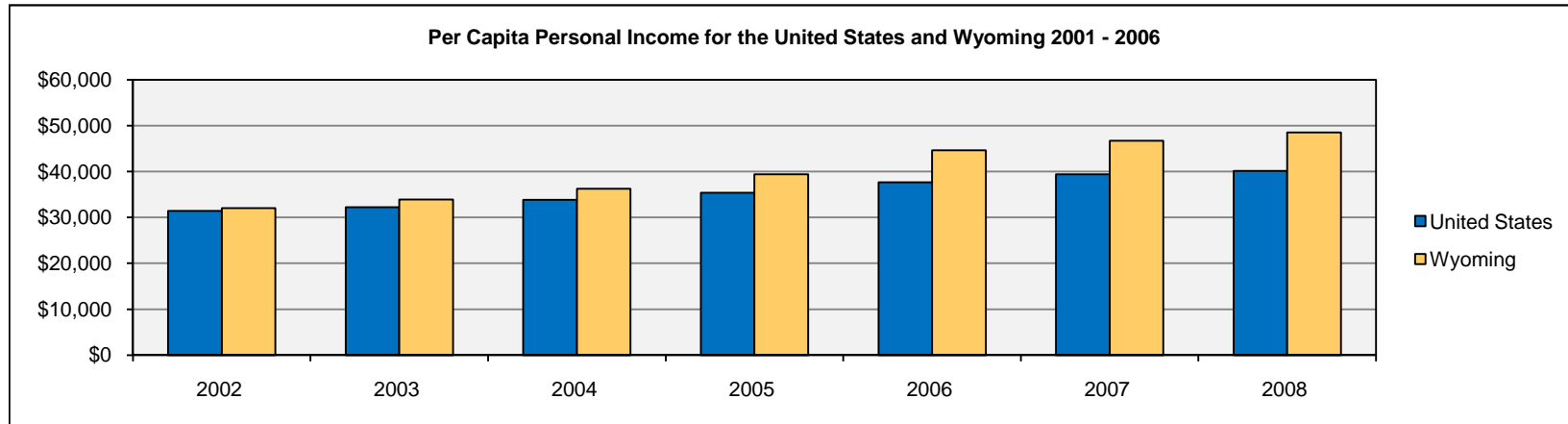

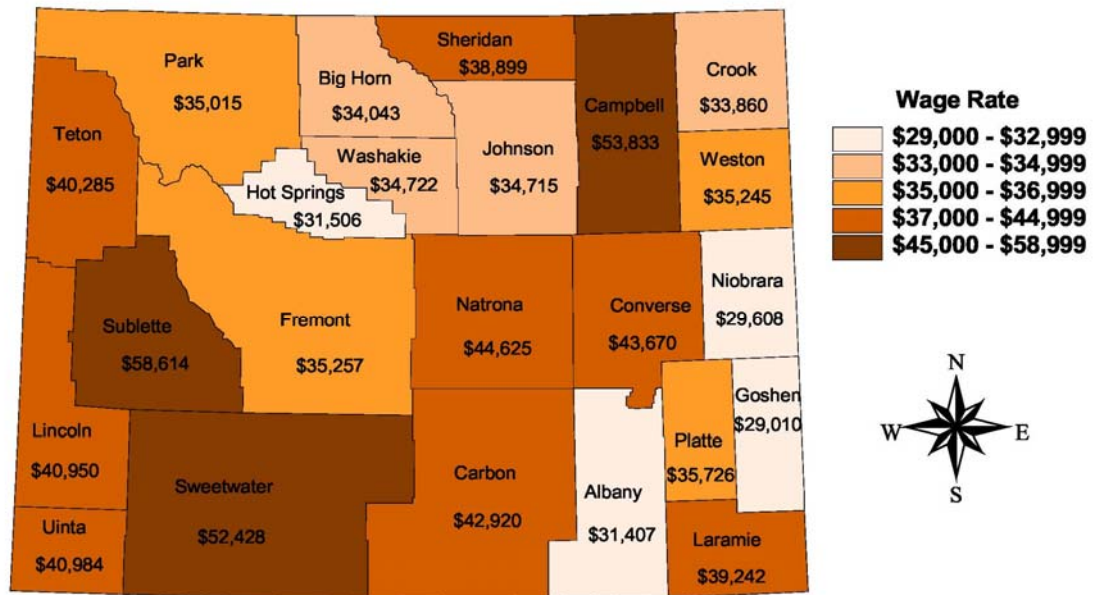

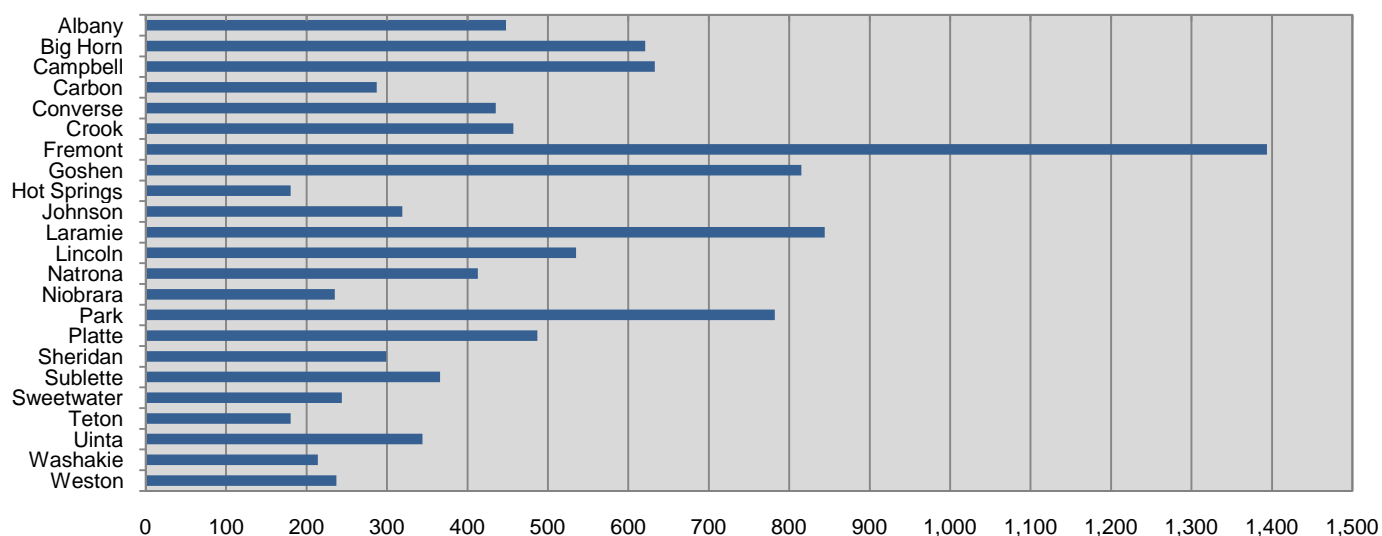

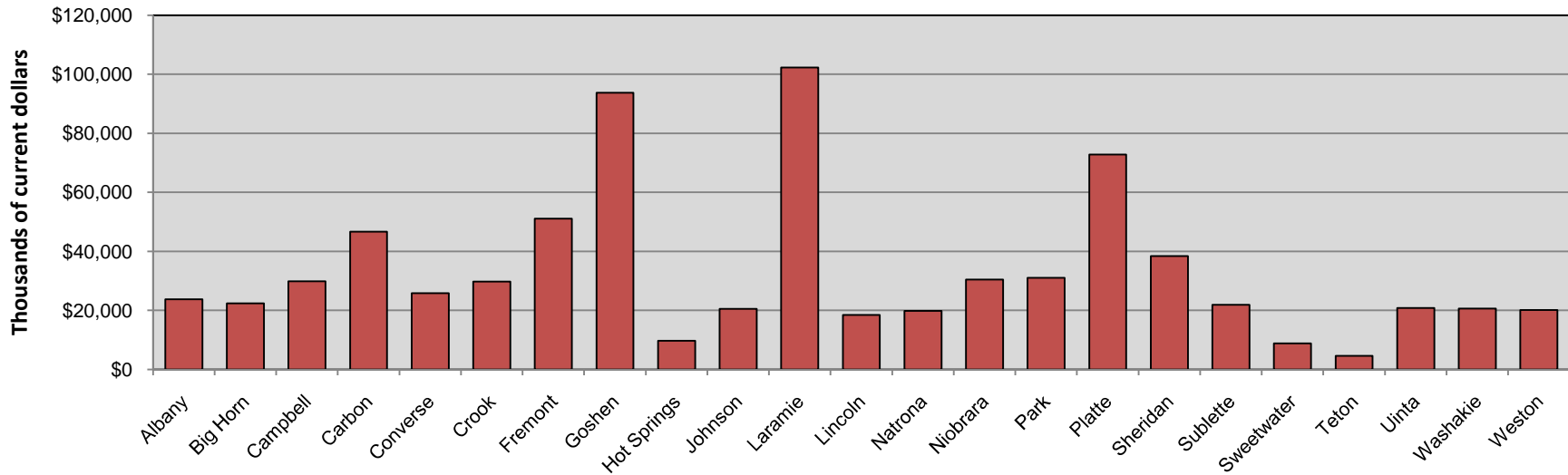

Number of Farms in Wyoming by County: 2008

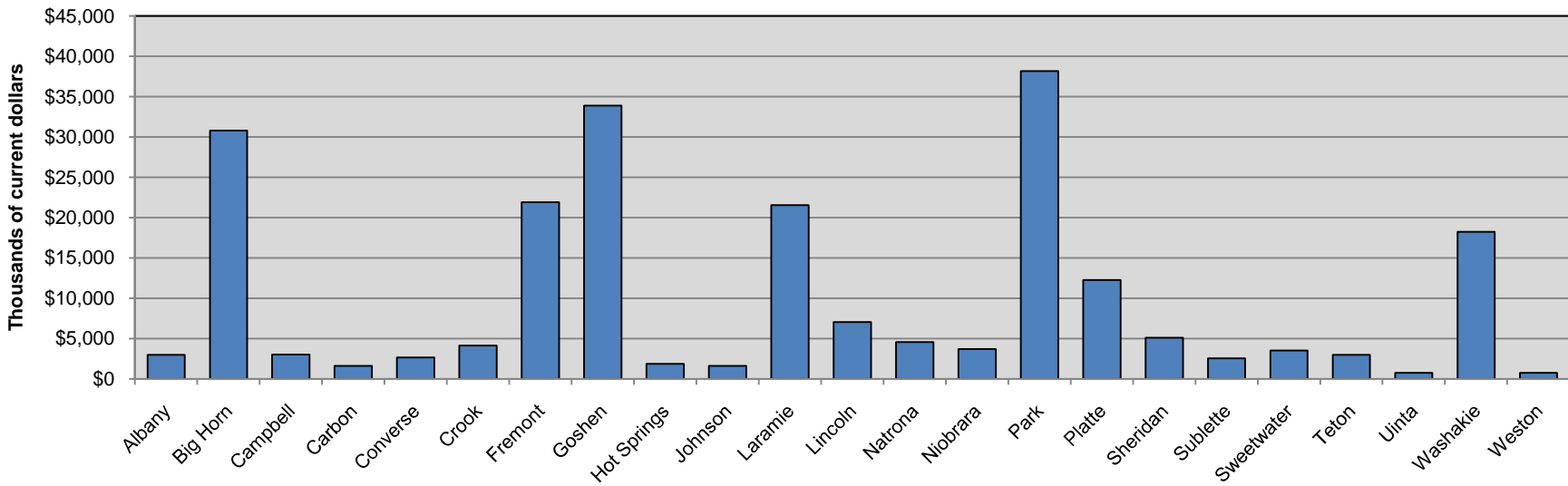

Total Personal Income (TPI):

- (1) Census Bureau midyear population estimates. Estimates for 2001-2008 reflect county population estimates available as of April 2010.
- (2) Contributions for government social insurance are included in earnings by type and industry but they are excluded from personal income.
- (3) The adjustment for residence is the net inflow of the earnings of interarea commuters. For the United States, it consists of adjustments for border workers: Wage and salary disbursements to U.S. residents commuting to Canada less wage and salary disbursements to Canadian and Mexican residents commuting into the United States.
- (4) Rental income of persons includes the capital consumption adjustment.
- (5) Proprietors' income includes the inventory valuation adjustment and capital consumption adjustment.
- (6) The estimates of earnings for 2001-2006 are based on the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The estimates for 2007 forward are based on the 2007 NAICS.

Transfer Receipts:

- (1) Consists largely of temporary disability payments and black lung payments.
- (2) Consists of Medicaid and other medical payments.
- (3) Consists of payments made under the TriCare Management Program (formerly called CHAMPUS) for the medical care of dependants of active duty military personnel and of retired military personnel and their dependents at nonmilitary medical facilities.

DATA NOTES

EMPLOYMENT:

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates employment as a count of occupied jobs, not number of employed people. Employment under this definition includes all full-time and part-time jobs by place-of-work. If an individual holds more than one job at any given time, the individual is counted multiple times, once for each employment position occupied. BEA employment also includes proprietors or self-employed, but not unpaid family workers or volunteers. Employment figures in this document are from the BEA.

In contrast, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) counts each employed person only once even if the person holds more than one job. The BLS defines an employed person as someone who, during the reference week, performed any type of labor for pay, worked at least 15 hours unpaid in family enterprises, or was temporarily absent from work for non-economic reasons.

Unemployment data is compiled by the BLS. Unemployed persons include those persons who did not work during the reference week, were available for work, and made specific efforts to find employment. The unemployment rate is calculated by dividing the number of unemployed persons by the total civilian labor force.

TOTAL PERSONAL INCOME (TPI):

Total personal income (TPI), as defined by the BEA, is the current income of residents in a particular area from all sources. It is measured after deductions of personal contributions to Social Security, but before personal tax deductions have been made. It includes income received from businesses; federal, state, and local governments; households; institutions; foreign governments; other labor income (such as employers' contributions to private social insurance programs); farm and non-farm proprietor income; dividends, interest, and rent; and transfer payments. It is the only key economic indicator which is adjusted for seasonality; it is not, however, adjusted for price changes.

Because TPI is a measure of income received, estimates of state and local area personal income should reflect the residence of the income recipients. Of the six major components of personal income, three are recorded on a place-of-residence basis: transfer receipts or payments; dividends, interest, and rental income; and proprietors' income. The data available at the state and county level for wages and salaries; other labor income; supplements to wages and salaries; and personal contributions for social insurance, are estimated from data that are recorded by place-of-work.

Four adjustments are made to earnings by place-of-work to derive total personal income by place-of-residence. Following these adjustments, total earnings still comprise the bulk of total personal income. Beginning with total labor and proprietor earnings, the first adjustment is made by deducting contributions for social insurance. Although these are considered part of employee total earnings for the current period, social insurance contributions are not received during the current period and are, therefore, not included in personal income.

The second adjustment is made for employee by place-of-residency. The BEA defines employee residency as the location at which the employee is residing while employed. An example of this type of adjustment is a regular occurrence in Sheridan County, Wyoming. There are employees that work in the coal mines in Montana, but reside in Sheridan County, Wyoming. Earnings for these employees show up as earnings data for Montana. However, in the derivation of personal income by place-of-residence, an adjustment is made to reallocate these earnings as personal income for Wyoming. This residency adjustment for Wyoming is, therefore, the net effect of all interstate place-of-work versus place-of-residence discrepancies.

A third adjustment is made by appending dividends, interest, and rental income. Dividends are payments in cash or other assets, excluding stock, by for-profit corporations to non-corporate stockholders in state. Interest is the monetary and imputed interest income of persons from all sources. Rental income is the monetary income of persons from the rental of real property; the imputed net rental income of owner-occupants of non-farm dwellings; and the royalties received by persons from patents, copyrights, and rights to natural resources.

The fourth and final adjustment is the addition of transfer receipts or payments. Transfer receipts or payments are income payments to persons, generally in monetary form, for which they do not render current services. As a component of personal income, they are payments by governments and businesses to individuals and nonprofit institutions. Common examples of transfer payments include Social Security payments and public assistance.

Once these four adjustments to the earnings by place-of-work are made, the result is total personal income by place-of-residence. Personal income effectively measures the size of consumer markets. When presented by industry of origin, as in this report, earnings can also be interpreted as a measure of the size of industrial markets.

Per capita personal income (PCI) is calculated by dividing total personal income of the area by the total population of that area. Per capita personal income is a useful tool to compare income across regions, states, and counties, because it removes the effects of population growth on TPI. Per capita personal income can also be used to track income growth over time.

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT (GDP):

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) calculates Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for a state as the sum of Gross Domestic Product Originating (GDPO) by industry in all industries. This measure of GDP is the state counterpart of the Nation's gross domestic product (GDP) by industry from the national income and product accounts (NIPA's).

The GDPO by industry is the contribution of each industry, including government, to GDP. An industry's GDPO, often referred to as its "value added," is equal to its gross output (sales or receipts and other operating income, plus inventory change) minus its intermediate inputs (consumption of goods and services purchased or imported from other industries).

For each industry, the estimate of gross domestic product is composed of four components (estimated in current-dollars only): (1) Compensation of employees; (2) proprietors' income with inventory valuation adjustment (IVA) and capital consumption allowances; (3) indirect business tax and non-tax liability (IBT); and (4) Other, mainly capital related, charges. Most of the compensation and proprietors' income components of GDP are primarily based on BEA's estimates of earnings by place-of-work, an aggregate in the state personal income series. The IBT component of GDP reflects liabilities charged to business expense, most of which are sales and property taxes levied by state and local governments. The capital charges component of GDP comprises corporate profits with IVA, corporate capital consumption allowances, business transfer payments, net interest, rental income of persons, and subsidies less current surplus of government enterprises.

Current and constant (chained) dollar estimates of total GDP are presented for the U.S. and states for the years 2002-2008. Current and constant dollar estimates of GDP by NAICS industry classification are also presented for Wyoming by industry for 2002-2008.

GLOSSARY

Chained Dollars – A measure used to express real prices. It is a measure used to approximate the chained-type index level and is calculated by taking the current-dollar level of a series in the base period and multiplying it by the change in the chained-type quantity index number for the series since the base period. Chained-dollar estimates correctly show growth rates for a series, but are not additive in periods other than the base period.

Current Dollars – The market value of an item, which reflects price and quantities of the period being measured and has not been adjusted for inflation. For example, 2008 data in current dollars indicate values based on the worth of the dollar in the year 2008.

Industry – A group of establishments that produce similar products or provide similar services. For example, all establishments that manufacture automobiles are in the same industry. A given industry, or even a particular establishment within that industry, might have employees in dozens of occupations. The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) groups similar establishments into industries.

Inflation – An increase in the level of consumer prices, or equivalently, a decline in the purchasing power of money. Inflation is defined as a time for generally rising prices for goods and factors of production.

North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) – A classification system developed jointly by the United States, Canada, and Mexico for improved comparability in industrial statistics across North America. It replaced the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) in 2000. A list of NAICS classifications can be found on page 103.

Transfer Receipts – Payments made by the government to individuals and non-profit institutions that are not in exchange for goods and services, such as Social Security payments, and are a component of personal income. The term was previously identified as transfer payments.

INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

The industry classifications utilized in this report are classified in accordance with the 2002 North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), published by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. NAICS is the standard used by Federal Statistical Agencies in classifying establishments for the purpose of collecting, analyzing, and publishing statistical data related to the U.S. businesses and 2007 economy. The estimates of earnings for 2001-2006 are based on the 2002 NAICS and estimates for 2007 are based on the 2007 NAICS. The twenty major industrial sectors that comprise NAICS are: 1) Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting; 2) Mining; 3) Utilities; 4) Construction; 5) Manufacturing; 6) Wholesale Trade; 7) Retail Trade; 8) Transportation and Warehousing; 9) Information; 10) Finance and Insurance; 11) Real Estate and Rental and Leasing; 12) Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services; 13) Management of Companies and Enterprises; 14) Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services; 15) Educational Services; 16) Health Care and Social Assistance; 17) Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation; 18) Accommodation and Food Services; 19) Other Services (except public administration); and 20) Public Administration. These major sectors remain unchanged for the most part between the 2002 and 2007 NAICS. Under the 2007 NAICS, the Mining Sector is referred to as Mining, Quarrying, and Oil and Gas Extraction. Six of the twenty sectors had some changes within the sector from 2002 to 2007.

For purposes of this classification, an establishment is an economic unit, generally at a single physical location, where business is conducted or where services or industrial operations are performed. For example, a factory, mine, store, or office. Each establishment is assigned an industry code on the basis of its primary activity, which is determined by its principal product (or group of products) produced or distributed, or services rendered. Ideally, the principal product or service should be determined by its relative share of "value added" at the establishment. In practice, however, it is rarely possible to obtain this measure for individual products or services. Typically, it is necessary to adopt some other criterion which may be expected to give approximately the same results in determining the primary activity of an establishment.

Occasionally, in activity-diversified establishments, the appropriate measure cannot be determined or estimated for each product or service. In some instances, an industry classification based upon the recommended output measure will not adequately represent the relative economic importance of each of the varied activities carried on at such establishments. In such cases, employment or payroll information should be used to determine the primary activity of a particular establishment.

Due to this broad categorization of multi-sector establishments under one code, estimates will frequently be understated in one sector and overstated in another. While this does not influence the accuracy of either county or state totals, it will obviously have an effect upon estimates for a particular sector.

Data from business tax returns, provided by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), are used to generate detailed industrial estimates of self-employed individuals at the national level. At the state level, Federal Insurance Contributions Act (FICA) records on individuals making self-employed contributions are used to get first round estimates by industry. This has resulted in an increase in the count of self-employed individuals, which was prompted by the following factors. First, those proprietors who were previously only counted once in the Current Population Survey (CPS), but who are in fact proprietors of two or more businesses, are now being counted once for each business. In addition, all persons formerly classified solely as wage and salary employees, but also spend some time as sole proprietors or participating partners in businesses, are now being counted in each of their multiple positions.

NAICS is reviewed every five years to determine if any changes are necessary to maintain the relevance, accuracy, and timeliness of the classifications. Identifying emerging industries is a primary focus of NAICS reviews. Regular evaluations of NAICS classifications are important steps toward greater global comparability of industry activities.

NORTH AMERICAN INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM (NAICS)

11 Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting: The Agriculture, Forestry, Fishing, and Hunting sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in growing crops, raising animals, harvesting timber, and harvesting fish and other animals from a farm, ranch, or their natural habitats. The establishments in this sector are often described as farms, ranches, dairies, greenhouses, nurseries, orchards, or hatcheries. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: agricultural production and agricultural support activities. Production includes establishments performing the complete farm operation whereas the support includes the performance of one or more activities associated with farm operation.

21 Mining: The Mining sector comprises establishments that extract naturally occurring mineral solids, such as coal and ores; liquid minerals, such as crude petroleum; and gases, such as natural gas. The term mining is used in the broad sense to include quarrying, well operations, beneficiating (e.g., crushing, screening, washing, and flotation), and other preparation customarily performed at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity. The sector distinguishes two basic activities: mine operation and mining support activities. Operation includes establishments operating mines, quarries, or oil and gas wells on their own account or for others on a contract or fee basis. Support activities include establishments that perform exploration and/or other mining services on a contract or fee basis.

22 Utilities: The Utilities sector comprises establishments engaged in the provision of the following utility services: electric power, natural gas, steam supply, water supply, and sewage removal. Within this sector, the specific activities associated with the utility services provided vary by utility: electric power includes generation, transmission, and distribution; natural gas includes distribution; steam supply includes provision and/or distribution; water supply includes treatment and distribution; and sewage removal includes collection, treatment, and disposal of waste through sewer systems and sewage treatment facilities.

23 Construction: The Construction sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in the construction of buildings or engineering projects (e.g. highways and utility systems). Establishments primarily engaged in the preparation of sites for new construction and establishments primarily engaged in subdividing land for sale as building sites are also included in this sector. Construction work may include new work, additions, alterations, or maintenance and repairs.

31-33 Manufacturing: The Manufacturing sector comprises establishments engaged in the mechanical, physical, or chemical transformation of materials, substances, or components into new products. The assembling of component parts of manufactured products is considered manufacturing, except in the cases where the activity is appropriately classified in Sector 23, Construction. Establishments in the Manufacturing sector are often characterized as plants, factories, or mills. Establishments that transform materials or substances into new products by hand or in the worker's home and those engaged in selling to the general public are also included in this sector. Products made on the same premises from which they are sold, such as bakers, candy stores, and custom tailors are also included.

42 Wholesale Trade: The Wholesale Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in wholesaling merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale of merchandise. The merchandise described in this sector includes the output of agriculture, mining, manufacturing, and certain information industries, such as publishing. Wholesalers sell merchandise to other businesses and normally operate from a warehouse or office. These warehouses and offices are characterized by having little display of merchandise.

44-45 Retail Trade: The Retail Trade sector comprises establishments engaged in retailing merchandise, generally without transformation, and rendering services incidental to the sale

of the merchandise. This sector comprises two main types of retailers: store and nonstore. Store retailers operate fixed point-of-sale locations, located and designed to attract a high volume of walk-in customers. This type generally has extensive displays of merchandise and use mass-media advertising to attract customers. Nonstore retailers are organized to serve the general public and reach their customers and market their merchandise with methods, such as the broadcasting of “infomercials,” the publishing of paper and electronic catalogs, door-to-door solicitations, and distribution through vending machines.

48-49 Transportation and Warehousing: The Transportation and Warehousing sector includes industries providing transportation of passengers and cargo, warehousing and storage for goods, scenic and sightseeing transportation, and support activities related to modes of transportation. Establishments in these industries use transportation equipment or transportation related facilities as a productive asset. The type of equipment depends on the mode of transportation. The modes of transportation include air, rail, water, road, and pipeline.

51 Information: The Information sector comprises establishments engaged in the following processes: (a) producing and distributing information and cultural products, (b) providing the means to transmit or distribute these products as well as data or communications, and (c) processing data. The main components of this sector are publishing industries, motion picture and sound recording industries, broadcasting industries, telecommunications industries, Web search portals, data processing industries, and the information services industries.

52 Finance and Insurance: The Finance and Insurance sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in financial transactions (transactions involving the creation, liquidation, or change in ownership of financial assets) and/or in facilitating financial transactions. Three principal types of activities are identified: (1) Raising funds by taking deposits and/or issuing securities and, in the process, incurring liabilities; (2) pooling of risk by underwriting insurance and annuities; and (3) Providing specialized services facilitating or supporting financial intermediation, insurance, and employee benefit programs.

53 Real Estate and Rental and Leasing: The Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector comprises establishments primarily engaged in renting, leasing, or otherwise allowing the use of tangible or intangible assets, and establishments providing related services. The major portion of this sector comprises establishments that rent, lease, or otherwise allow the use of their own assets by others. The assets may be tangible, as is the case of real estate and equipment, or intangible, as is the case with patents and trademarks.

54 Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services: The Professional, Scientific, and Technical Services sector comprises establishments that specialize in performing professional, scientific, and technical activities for others. These activities require a high degree of expertise and training. The establishments in this sector specialize according to expertise and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries, and in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: legal advice and representation; accounting, bookkeeping, and payroll services; architectural, engineering, and specialized design services; computer services; consulting services; research services; advertising services; photographic services; translation and interpretation services; veterinary services; and other professional, scientific, and technical services.

55 Management of Companies and Enterprises: The Management of Companies and Enterprises sector comprises (1) establishments that hold the securities of (or other equity interests in) companies and enterprises for the purpose of owning a controlling interest or influencing management decisions or (2) establishments (except government establishments) that administer, oversee, and manage establishments of the company or enterprise and that

normally undertake the strategic or organizational planning and decision making role of the company or enterprise. Establishments that administer, oversee, and manage may hold the securities of the company or enterprise.

56 Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services:

The Administrative and Support and Waste Management and Remediation Services sector comprises establishments performing routine support activities for the day-to-day operations of other organizations. These essential activities are often undertaken in-house by establishments in many sectors of the economy. The establishments in this sector specialize in one or more of these support activities and provide these services to clients in a variety of industries and, in some cases, to households. Activities performed include: office administration, hiring and placing of personnel, document preparation and similar clerical services, solicitation, collection, security and surveillance services, cleaning, and waste disposal services.

61 Educational Services: The Educational Services sector comprises establishments that provide instruction and training in a wide variety of subjects. This instruction and training is provided by specialized establishments, such as schools, colleges, universities, and training centers. These establishments may be privately owned and operated for profit or not for profit, or they may be publicly owned and operated. They may also offer food and/or accommodation services to their students. Educational services are usually delivered by teachers or instructors that explain, demonstrate, supervise, and direct learning. Instruction is imparted in diverse settings, such as educational institutions, the workplace, or the home.

62 Health Care and Social Assistance: The Health Care and Social Assistance sector comprises establishments providing health care and social assistance for individuals. The sector includes both health care and social assistance because it is sometimes difficult to distinguish between the boundaries of these two activities. The industries in this sector are arranged on a continuum starting with those establishments providing medical care exclusively, continuing with those providing health care and social assistance, and finally finishing with those providing only social assistance. The services provided by establishments in this sector are delivered by trained professionals. All industries in the sector share this commonality of process, namely, labor inputs of health practitioners or social workers with the requisite expertise. Many of the industries in the sector are defined based on the educational degree held by the practitioners included in the industry.

71 Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation: The Arts, Entertainment, and Recreation sector includes a wide range of establishments that operate facilities or provide services to meet varied cultural, entertainment, and recreational interests of their patrons. This sector comprises (1) establishments that are involved in producing, promoting, or participating in live performances, events, or exhibits intended for public viewing; (2) establishments that preserve and exhibit objects and sites of historical, cultural, or educational interest; and (3) establishments that operate facilities or provide services that enable patrons to participate in recreational activities or pursue amusement, hobby, and leisure-time interests.

72 Accommodation and Food Services: The Accommodation and Food Services sector comprises establishments providing customers with lodging and/or preparing meals, snacks, and beverages for immediate consumption. The sector includes both accommodation and food services establishments because the two activities are often combined at the same establishment. Excluded from this sector are civic and social organizations; amusement and recreation parks; theatres; and other recreation or entertainment facilities providing food and beverage services.

81 Other Services (except Public Administration): The Other Services (except Public Administration) sector comprises establishments engaged in providing services not specifically provided for elsewhere in the classification system. Establishments in this sector are primarily engaged in activities, such as equipment and machinery repair, promoting or

administering religious activities, grant making, advocacy, and dry-cleaning and laundry services, personal care services, death care services, pet care services, photofinishing services, temporary parking services, and dating services.

92 Public Administration: The Public Administration sector consists of establishments of federal, state, and local government agencies that administer, oversee, and manage public programs and have executive, legislative, or judicial authority over other institutions within a given area. These agencies also set policy, create laws, adjudicate civil and criminal legal cases, provide for public safety and for national defense. In general, government establishments in the Public Administration sector oversee governmental programs and activities that are not performed by private establishments. Establishments in this sector typically are engaged in the organization and financing of the production of public goods and services, most of which are provided for free or at prices that are not economically significant.
