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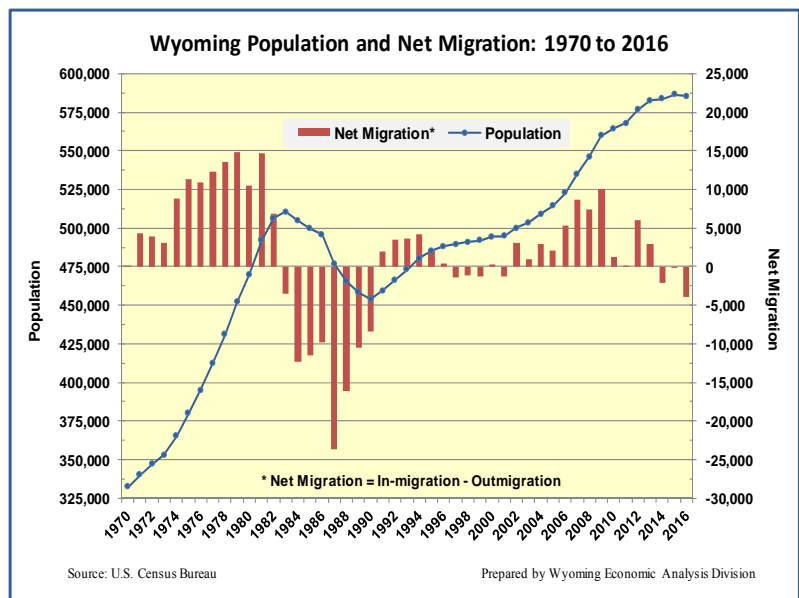

WYOMING POPULATION DECLINED BETWEEN JULY 2015 AND JULY 2016

CHEYENNE -- Wyoming's total resident population contracted to 585,501 in July 2016, according to estimates just released by the U.S. Census Bureau. The annual decrease from July 2015 was 1,054 persons, or 0.2 percent, the first decline since 1990. There are two components for population change. The natural increase (7,590 births less 4,838 deaths) was 2,752, but the estimated net migration (in-migration less outmigration) was about -3,800, which means that approximately 3,800 more persons left Wyoming than moved into the State between July 2015 and July 2016. In contrast, the revised annual population growth was 2,913 between July 2014 and July 2015.

Nationally, the population was an estimated 323.1 million in 2016, an increase of 0.7 percent from the previous year. Utah's 2.0 percent rate led the nation, followed by Nevada (2.0%), Idaho (1.8%), Florida (1.8%), and Washington (1.8%). Wyoming's growth rate ranked the 5th slowest in the nation. Besides Wyoming, seven other states lost population, including West Virginia (-0.5%), Illinois (-0.3%), Vermont (-0.2%), and Connecticut (-0.2%) during the 12 month period.

"People tend to move to areas where economies are vibrant, which is particularly true for Wyoming," said Dr. Wenlin Liu, Chief Economist with the Economic Analysis Division. Change in employment always tends to drive and lead the change in migration in the State. In other words, migration normally follows employment changes. Due to the dramatic drop in both oil and natural gas prices in late 2014, the stretch of the depressed prices for the most of last a couple of years, and a severe decline in coal production in the first half of 2016, the whole mining industry (including oil and gas extraction) in the state lost more than 8,000 jobs (or about -30.0%), and the overall payroll employment shrunk by 14,000 or -5.0 percent. Such a severe drop in employment, consequently, caused the increase in outmigration. In addition, the labor market nationwide, particularly in neighboring states such as Colorado, Utah, and Idaho, showed strong expansion, which attracted a number of Wyoming energy workers and residents during the period.



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"However, as a result of supply and demand rebalancing for energy commodities, prices have rebounded significantly since early spring. Accordingly, some oil and gas businesses came back to explore again, contributing to the stabilization of the economy as evidenced by state's unemployment rate declining in recent months, which are lessening outmigration." Liu continued.
