

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PREFACE

The 1990 edition of the Wyoming Sales and Use Tax Revenue Report contains tax collection information by Standard Industrial Classification (SIC). In addition, sales tax collections for the retail sector, itemized by component, are provided. This report spans the activity for fiscal years 1979-1990 for sales tax collections, and fiscal years 1985-1990 for use tax collections. The fiscal year for Wyoming State Government extends from July 1 through June 30.

The data were provided by the Wyoming Department of Revenue and Taxation, and were compiled for publication by the Division of Research and Statistics, Department of Administration.

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Wyoming Sales and Use Tax Report 1990

Sales and use tax collections are two principal sources of revenue to state and local governments. However, their importance does not stop there. These two revenue sources, when surveyed over time, provide a valuable indication of economic progress and activity, both at the state and county level.

This report contains twelve fiscal years of sales tax collections and six fiscal years of use tax collections. The fiscal year for Wyoming State Government extends from July 1 through June 30.

The report also details collections by major industrial sectors for sales and use tax, at both the state and county levels. A detailed rundown of the retail sector for sales tax is contained within the report, as well. The reporting of tax collections is based upon the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC), developed by the Federal Office of Management and Budget. Under this system, a business is classified by primary activity, determined by principal product, or group of products produced, distributed, and/or services rendered. Each sector classification is briefly described in the glossary, which can be found on pages 135-140.

SALES TAX

Since 1967, the state imposed sales tax has been 3 percent. Historically, this tax has been shared between state government and the county of origin at 66.7% and 33.3%, respectively. However due to a statute modification that became effective July 1, 1989, the state share was reduced to 63.3% and the county share was raised to 36.67%. The revised allocation is to remain in effect until June 30, 1991.

The State's share of the sales tax revenue is placed in the General Fund. The significance of this tax is evident in the table and graph shown on pages 4 and 5, respectively. The portion returned to the counties is distributed to the municipalities based upon population.

Beginning in 1973, Wyoming counties were granted the option to impose an additional 1 percent sales tax through public election. During fiscal year 1990, all counties except Big Horn, Fremont, Goshen, Park, Sublette, and Washakie imposed the optional county sales tax. The optional sales tax revenue is returned to the counties to be utilized through their respective general revenue funds.

In addition to the county optional tax, any county through public election, may impose an excise tax of up to 1 percent on retail sales made within the county. The revenue generated from this tax is used solely for the planning, construction, furnishing, equipping, and debt servicing for any capital improvement project as authorized through public election. This tax is referred to as the 1 percent capital facilities option tax. During fiscal year 1990, Albany, Goshen, Niobrara, Sheridan, and Teton counties imposed the 1 percent capital facilities option tax. A table of effective tax rates can be found on pages 6-9.

To arrive at an estimate of county gross sales, the specific county tax collection can be divided by the corresponding tax rate. This method provides only a gauge of gross sales and does not include any non-taxable sales. (See pages 10-11 for a listing of all taxable events and exemptions.) Further, because county option taxes originate and expire at varying times, county sales tax rates can change from year to year. When measuring performance over time, the inclusion of these optional revenues

results in statistical discrepancy. The table and graph on page 24 displays only the total state 3 percent collections, and annual percent change for fiscal years 1980 through 1990.

USE TAX

State use tax is imposed on purchases made outside a taxing jurisdiction for first use, storage, or other consumption within that jurisdiction. Thus, the use tax prevents sales tax avoidance, or payment of a lesser tax rate by making purchases outside of the taxing jurisdiction, where first use, storage, or other consumption will occur. Wyoming taxing jurisdictions are the State of Wyoming, and/or each Wyoming county.

The use tax complements the sales tax. Effective January 1, 1981, the adoption of an optional sales tax includes an increase in the use tax of equal amount. State use tax is shared between state government and the county of origin on the same distribution basis as sales tax. Therefore, the revised allocation, as mentioned earlier in the sales tax description, applies here as well.



TAXABLE EVENTS AND EXEMPTIONS

Wyoming Statute 39-6-404 describes the following sales and services as taxable events:

- 1. Retail sales of tangible personal property within the state.
- 2. Leases of tangible personal property if the property would have been taxable, had it been sold.
- 3. Telephone and telegraph services, and the equipment used to carry out such services.
- 4. Intrastate transportation of passengers.
- 5. Sales by public utilities and by those furnishing gas, electricity, or heat for domestic, industrial, or commercial consumption.
- 6. Meals regularly served to the public, and cover charges.
- 7. Lodging services to transient guests, e.g., motels, hotels.
- 8. Admissions to amusements, or athletic events.
- Repair, alteration, or improvement of tangible personal property.
- 10. Contract seismographic surveying, contract geophysical surveying, and other contract geophysical exploration operations calculated to reveal the existence of geologic conditions favorable to the accumulation of oil or gas, and for all services rendered in and all types of coring, logging, testing, stimulating, perforating, cementing, completing, recompleting, or attempting to complete any well for production of oil or gas.
- 11. Sales of automobiles, mobile homes, campers, and semi-trailers.
- 12. Sales of alcoholic beverages.
- 13. Sales of computer hardware and non-customized computer software.

Wyoming Statute 39-6-402 (a) (iv) defines "Sales Price" as the consideration paid by the purchaser of tangible personal property, excluding the actual trade-in value allowed on property exchanged at the time of transaction, admissions or services which are subject to taxation as provided by this article, and excluding any taxes imposed by the federal government, or this article.

Wyoming Statute 39-6-405 governs exemptions from state sales tax. Exemptions include the following:

- 1. Sales of tangible personal property to a person engaged in manufacturing, if such property becomes an ingredient, or component of the item manufactured. Sales of containers, labels, etc., are also exempt.
- 2. Sales of livestock, feeds for feeding livestock for marketing purposes; seeds, roots, bulbs, small plants, and fertilizer, planted or applied to land, the products of which are to be sold.
- 3. Intrastate transportation of sick, injured, and deceased persons by ambulance, or hearse.
- 4. Intrastate transportation of employees when the transportation is paid for by the employer.
- 5. Intrastate transportation of raw farm products to processing plants.
- 6. Intrastate transportation of freight and passengers.
- 7. Sales of energy if the energy is consumed directly in manufacturing, processing, or agriculture.
- 8. Sales of power or fuel used directly in generating motive power for transportation purposes, provided that gasoline, or diesel fuels used had been taxed (per gallon) under the Special Fuels, or Gasoline Tax Acts.
- 9. Sales of the services of professional engineers.
- 10. Sales made to the State of Wyoming, or its political subdivisions.
- 11. Sales made to a religious, or charitable organization, or non-profit corporations providing meals to senior citizens.
- 12. Sales of trucks, etc., to holders of a valid I.C.C. permit, provided they are used substantially in interstate commerce.

- 13. Occasional sales made by religious, or charitable organizations for fund raising purposes.
- 14. Sales which Wyoming is forbidden to tax, either by the State, or by the laws, or constitution of the United States.
- 15. Sales of prescription drugs, oxygen for medical use, plasma, prosthetic devices, hearing aids, crutches, wheelchairs, eyeglasses and contact lenses, insulin for human relief, and any syringe, needle, or device for the administration thereof.
- 16. Leases of vehicle if the lease is computed from gross receipts of the operation, for holders of valid I.C.C. permits.
- 17. Wholesale sales.
- 18. Intrastate transportation of freight.
- 19. Sales of school annuals.
- 20. Sales of newspapers.
- 21. Sales to Wyoming joint apprenticeship and training programs.
- 22. Sales to Joint Powers Boards organized under the Wyoming Joint Powers Act.
- 23. Transportation of drilling rigs, including charges for loading, unloading, assembly, and disassembly.
- 24. Sales of food purchased with food stamps.
- 25. Admission to, or user fees for county, or municipal owned recreation facilities.
- 26. Sales of carbon dioxide and other gases used in tertiary production.
- 27. Labor/service charges, including transportation and travel, for repair, alteration, or improvement of property owned by the State of Wyoming, or its political subdivisions.
- 28. Sales of personal property, or services performed for the repair, alteration, or improvement of railroad rolling stock.
- 29. Lodging services provided by guides or outfitters.

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SECTION I

SALES TAX COLLECTIONS

STATE AND COUNTY SUMMARY TABLES AND GRAPHS

SUMMARY OF SALES TAX COLLECTIONS

Total state sales tax collections for the past twelve fiscal years are summarized in this section. As shown on page 17, total sales tax collections peaked in fiscal year 1982, at \$227,011,946. Following that apex were four years of collections hovering in the \$185 to \$191 million realm. The fiscal year 1987 total, at \$170.5 million, marked a notable 8 percent decline from the previous year. This declivity was due largely to reduced activity in the Mining, Construction, Manufacturing, and Wholesale Trade sectors. As poor economic times continued, sales tax collections endured further declines. During fiscal year 1988, collections were off 1.5 percent from the year prior, rebounding only slightly in fiscal year 1989 to 0.23 percent over FY 1988.

Sales tax collections were up significantly in fiscal year 1990, yielding a total of \$177,650,266. At 5.56 percent over the 1989 period, this revenue source registered the largest annual increase since fiscal year 1982. Receipts in 9 of the 10 industrial sectors were over previous levels.

Annual sales tax collections for eighteen counties increased over previous year levels. Sheridan county revealed the most sizable increase of 44.9% over fiscal year 1989. This large increase was due mainly to the adoption of the capital facilities option tax in September, 1989. Other significant increases were realized in Niobrara county (24.2%), Sweetwater county (18.2%), Platte county (17.9%), Sublette county (14.6%), and Lincoln county (14.4%). The increases in total sales collections for Niobrara and Platte counties stemmed heavily from major growth in the Service and


Transportation sectors. Sweetwater county realized a significant increase in the Mining sector (68.4%), along with major growth in the Manufacturing, and Wholesale Trade sectors. In Sublette county, a 90 percent increase in the Manufacturing sector, along with a major boost from the Service and Mining sectors, were the heavyweights behind that county's total sales tax increase. Construction shot up dramatically (222.4%) in Lincoln county, along with major increases in the Wholesale Trade and Service sectors. Out of state sales tax collections were up notably, at 11.5 percent over FY 1989 collections.

The largest single decline in sales tax collections was seen in Hot Springs county, dipping nearly 7 percent below the year earlier level. This reduction in sales revenue resulted from continued decadence in the Manufacturing (-70.1%), Wholesale Trade (-48.8%), and Mining (-7.2%) sectors. Following closely behind Hot Springs in declining sales tax collections was Uinta county, at -6.4 percent below fiscal year 1989. Uinta county's collection decline reflects a large refund paid to the State for over reporting of taxes. Carbon, Laramie, and Big Horn counties also realized declining sales tax collections of -4.8, -4.2, and -2.8 percent, respectively. The decline in Carbon county's total resulted from a substantial downturn in the Construction (-25.0%), Service (-21.0%), and Transportation (-17.7%) sectors. Declines in 7 of the 10 industrial sectors were responsible for Laramie county's reduced total. The decline in Big Horn's total resulted from reduced activity in 6 of the 10 industrial sectors.

Growth rates for the past twelve years can be found on page 24. Only the 3 percent sales tax collections (no optional taxes) were used for this comparison. Monthly sales tax collections (state) are provided on page 25 for seasonal analysis.



SALES TAX COLLECTIONS BY MAJOR INDUSTRIAL SECTOR


This section of the report contains state and county sales tax collections by major industrial sector. A brief explanation of each sector can be found in the glossary.

Total state sales tax collections grew 5.6 percent from fiscal year 1989 to fiscal year 1990. Total collections in 9 of the 10 sectors were above previous year levels. The Mining sector exhibited the most significant increase in sales tax collections, at 10.9 percent over fiscal year 1989. The Agriculture sector, at 9.9 percent over the year earlier level, showed the second largest increase. Manufacturing in Wyoming grew substantially, nearly 9 percent over the previous year. The Wholesale Trade, Public Administration, and Service sectors all exhibited growth over fiscal year 1989 levels of better than 8 percent. Construction and Retail Trade increased better than 5 percent from year earlier levels. The Finance sector, comprised mainly of establishments involved in fields of finance, insurance, and real estate, showed nearly a 4 percent growth in activity from fiscal year 1989. The only major sector indicating a decline from fiscal year 1989 was the Transportation sector, at -4.1 percent.

The graph on page 30 displays each of the industrial sector's contribution, and relative importance to total sales tax collections for fiscal year 1990. Pages 31 through 75 display state and county sales tax totals by specific sector.

RETAIL SALES TAX COLLECTIONS

This section of the report lists the sales tax collections, by component, in the Retail Trade sector. Collections are reported at both the state and county levels. The Retail sector is divided into eight major components which are briefly explained in the glossary.


Statewide, total retail sales tax collections for fiscal year 1990 were up 5 percent from the previous year. The graph on page 80 displays twelve years of total retail sales tax collections. (See page 81 for relative importance of components.)

All of the eight retail sales components realized gains over year earlier levels. Building and Hardware stores experienced the most sizable increase, at 8.6 percent over fiscal year 1989. Collections in the Restaurant component were up 8.2 percent from the previous year level. The Apparel component realized a 6.6 percent increase over fiscal year 1989. The other components, Furniture stores, General Merchandise stores, Automotive Service stores, Miscellaneous stores, and Food stores, yielded increases over previous year levels of 4.9 percent, 4.4 percent, 4.2 percent, 3.4 percent, and 3.4 percent, respectively.

The most significant increase in retail sales tax collections at the county level was in Sheridan county, which realized a 45.3 percent increase over fiscal year 1989. Niobrara county experienced the next largest annual growth in this category, at nearly 26 percent over the total collected in fiscal year 1989. Other significant increases in retail sales tax collections were seen in Platte (15.1%), Sublette (14.0%), Crook (12.1%), and Lincoln (11.4%) counties.


TOTAL RETAIL SALES TAX COLLECTIONS

SECTION IV

USE TAX COLLECTIONS

STATE AND COUNTY SUMMARY TABLES AND GRAPHS

SUMMARY OF USE TAX COLLECTIONS

Total state and county use tax collections for the past six years are displayed in this section of the report. The graph on page 111 displays six years of total use tax collections, at the state level. Although not exhibited in this graph, use tax collections peaked in 1982, at a level of \$58.7 million. Beginning in fiscal year 1983, use tax collections declined annually until fiscal year 1986. Major construction during fiscal year 1986 boosted use tax collections a significant 31 percent over the previous year level to \$44.6 million. Economic conditions worsened in fiscal year 1987, thus, most of the major construction projects, not yet completed, were postponed. Use tax collections in fiscal year 1987 were off \$16.7 million, or 37.4 percent from the year earlier level, to a total of \$27.9 million. Declension continued through fiscal year 1988, again due to the scarcity of large scale construction and related transportation activity. At \$25.5 million, use tax collections in 5 of the 9 industrial sectors (Wholesale and Retail Trade are combined in this section of the report) were below previous year levels.

Beginning in fiscal year 1989, state use tax collections improved. At nearly 6 percent over the fiscal year 1988 total, collections in 6 of the 9 sectors were above year earlier levels, totalling \$27.0 million.

Use tax collections during fiscal year 1990 realized yet further strength. Gaining 12.3 percent over fiscal year 1989, total collections for the 1990 fiscal year reached \$30.3 million. This was the largest annual increase in this tax collection

since fiscal year 1986. Significant increases were realized in 7 of the 9 industrial sectors.


Annual use tax collections for sixteen counties increased over previous year levels. Platte county revealed the most significant increase of 166.8 percent over the fiscal year 1989 collection. This large increase was due mainly to a thrust in the Construction sector. Sublette county also realized a major gain in use tax collections, at 96.3 percent over the fiscal year 1989 level. A significant increase in the Service sector of this county was the major catalyst in this increased total. Other sizable increases were realized in Big Horn (54.6%), Sheridan (52.0%), and Converse (46.9%) counties. Out of state use tax collections were up notably, at 34.9 percent over the fiscal year 1989 total.

Crook county realized the largest decline in use tax collections, falling -32.8 percent from a year earlier. This lag stemmed from sharp declines in the Construction, and Wholesale and Retail Trade sectors. Albany county also sustained a significant decline in use tax collections during fiscal year 1990. Diminished activity in the Transportation and Construction sectors was the core of this decline. Laramie (-13.3%), Johnson (-11.3%), Uinta (-7.0%), Carbon (-4.0%), and Teton (-0.9%) counties realized declining totals in use tax collections for fiscal year 1990.

Growth rates for the past six years can be found on page 115. Only the 3 percent use tax collections (no optional taxes) were used for this comparison.

USE TAX COLLECTIONS BY MAJOR INDUSTRIAL SECTOR


This section of the report contains state and county use tax collections by major industrial sector. A brief explanation of each sector can be found in the glossary.

Total state use tax collections grew 12.3 percent from fiscal year 1989 to fiscal year 1990. Total collections in 7 of the 9 sectors (Wholesale Trade and Retail Trade are combined in this section) were higher than previous year levels. The Manufacturing sector exhibited the most sizable increase in use tax collections, making a 70.1 percent increase over fiscal year 1989. The Agriculture sector, at 47.5 percent over the year earlier level, realized the second largest increase. The Mining sector's contribution to use tax grew 44.9 percent over the previous year. The Service sector realized a 31.9 percent growth in collections from fiscal year 1989. The Wholesale and Retail Trade, along with the Finance sectors realized increases of better than 11 percent. The Public Administration sector exhibited a 4.2 percent increase over the previous year level. The two sectors revealing declines from fiscal year 1989 levels were the Transportation and Construction sectors, at -25.4 and -17.5 percent, respectively.

The graph on page 120 displays each of the industrial sector's contribution, and relative importance to total use tax collections for fiscal year 1990. Pages 121 through 133 display state and county sales tax totals by specific sector.

AGRICULTURE

This division includes establishments primarily engaged in agricultural production, forestry, commercial fishing, hunting and trapping, and related services. (p. 21)

APPAREL

This major group includes retail stores primarily engaged in selling new clothing, shoes, hats, underwear, and related articles for personal wear and adornment. Furriers and custom tailors carrying stocks of materials are included. (p. 323)

AUTOMOBILE

This major group includes retail dealers selling new and used automobiles, boats, recreational vehicles, utility trailers, and motorcycles including mopeds; those selling new automobile parts and accessories; and gasoline service stations. In Wyoming, these collections **do not** include sales of new and used vehicles, since the County Treasurer collects this tax, therefore, it is included in the Public Administration sector. (p. 265)

BUILDING AND HARDWARE

This major group includes retail establishments primarily engaged in selling lumber and other building materials; paint; glass and wallpaper; hardware; nursery stock; lawn and garden supplies and mobile homes. (p. 315)

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT TAX (Sec. 39-6-412, W.S. 1984)

This is an optional sales tax imposed for the express purpose of capital construction. The revenue from the tax shall be used only for planning, construction, furnishing, equipping and debt service for any capital improvement project authorized by public election.

CONSTRUCTION

This division includes establishments primarily engaged in construction. The term construction includes new work, additions, alterations, reconstruction, installations, and repairs.

(p. 53)

FINANCE

This division includes establishments operating primarily in the fields of finance, insurance and real estate. (p. 335)

FOOD STORES

This major group includes retail stores primarily engaged in selling food for home preparation and consumption. (p. 319)

FURNITURE

This major group includes retail stores selling goods used for furnishing the home, such as furniture, floor coverings, draperies, glass and chinaware, domestic stoves, refrigerators, and other household electrical and gas appliances. (p. 325)

GENERAL MERCHANDISE

This major group includes retail outlets such as department stores, variety stores and general merchandise stores which sell a number of lines of merchandise such as dry goods, apparel, accessories, furniture and home furnishings, small wares, hardware and food. (p. 317)

INHERITANCE TAX (Sec. 39-6-810 to 39-6-813, W.S. 1977)

This new provision repealed the old state Inheritance Tax. The state now collects all or its pro rata share of the "Federal Credit for State Death Tax". This tax is applicable to the estates of descendants whose date of death is January 1, 1983 and thereafter. This tax is commonly referred to as a "pickup tax", wherein the state of domicile, and the states where the non-resident descendent owned real and tangible personal property with an actual situs in the non-domiciliary state, collect the Federal Credit or a pro rata share which is allowable on the Federal Estate Tax Return.

MANUFACTURING

The manufacturing division includes all establishments such as plants, factories, and mills engaged in the mechanical or chemical transformation of materials or substances into new products. (p. 67)

MINERAL SEVERANCE TAX (Section 39-6-301 to 39-6-307, W.S. 1977)

The tax is levied on the cash market value of specified minerals and valuable deposits after the mining or production process is completed. The particular rate varies with the type of deposit. The distribution of collections also varies from the State funds (General, Trust and Agency, Capitol Facilities, etc.) with the type of deposit.

MINING

This division includes all establishments primarily engaged in mining. Mining is used in the broad sense to include the extraction of solid and gaseous minerals occurring naturally as well as other preparation customarily done at the mine site, or as a part of mining activity. (p. 39)

MISCELLANEOUS STORES

This major group includes retail establishments not elsewhere classified such as drug stores, liquor stores and used merchandise stores. (p. 329)

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

This division includes the executive, legislative, judicial, administrative and regulatory activities of Federal, State, local and international governments. (p. 407)

RESTAURANTS

This major group includes retail establishments selling prepared foods and drinks for consumption on the premises, and also lunch counters and refreshment stands selling prepared foods and drinks for immediate consumption. (p. 329)

RETAIL TRADE

This division includes establishments engaged in selling merchandise for personal or household consumption and rendering services incidental to the sale of the goods. (p. 313)

SALES TAX (Sec. 39-6-401 to 39-6-417, W.S. 1977)

This tax is levied on the gross receipts from the sale of tangible personal property and specified services. For a listing of rates and exemptions refer to tables 2 and 3, respectively. The collections are distributed between the State General Fund and local jurisdictions.

SERVICES

This division includes establishments primarily engaged in providing a wide variety of services (ie. legal, health and repair) for individuals, business and government establishments, and other organizations. (p. 353)

TRANSPORTATION

This division includes establishments providing to the general public or to other business enterprises, passenger and freight transportation, communication services, electricity, gas, steam, water or sanitary services, and the U.S. Postal Service. (p. 265)

USE TAX (Sec. 39-6-501 to 39-6-603, W.S. 1977)

The Use Tax is levied upon tangible personal property that is purchased from an out-of-state vendor and shipped directly to the purchaser for storage, use or consumption in the state. Freight and property in interstate transportation is exempted. For a listing of rates and exemptions refer to tables 2 and 3, respectively. Collections are distributed between the State General Fund and local jurisdictions.

WHOLESALE TRADE

This division includes establishments or places of business primarily engaged in selling merchandise to retailers; to industrial, commercial, institutional, farm, construction contractors, or professional business users; or to other wholesalers; or acting as agents or brokers in buying merchandise for or selling merchandise to such persons or companies.
