State Population Estimates by Age

Wyoming's population changed from 453,589 in 1990 to 479,743 in 1997, an increase of 5.8 percent. However, this growth trend has not been distributed evenly among different age groups. The population of children, age 11 and under, decreased by 12.9 percent, while the population of 12-24 year age group increased by 21.2 percent. One primary factor that contributed to this contraction in the young children population is the corresponding parents' generation (age 25-39) also endured a 20 percent decrease. This age group is likely either in the period of family formation or is already holding established families. In addition, this age group is more likely subject to increases and declines in migration resulting from economic conditions. Though the out-migration contributed to this group's drop, the lower birth rates in the late 1960's and early 1970's also affected their declines. The population ranging in ages 45-54 represents the early post World War II baby boom. The remarkable increase of 46.1 percent is the most rapidly growing age group between 1990 and 1997. The small increase realized in age group 60-69 is a result of overall low birth rates in late the 1920's and 1930's for the nation.

The 1997 estimate of Wyoming residents 65 years old or over was 54,300, an increase of 15.6 percent from 1990. The proportion of persons 65 and older was 11.3 percent compared to the national average of 12.7 percent. The population of Wyoming was slightly older than the U.S. average. The 1997 median age was 35.2 compared to the national level of 34.9 (see page 2).

Residential Building Permits

The total number of new residential housing units authorized for construction in Wyoming totaled 1,669 during 1997, with an estimated valuation of \$190,161,999. Though the housing units were down nearly 24 percent, the valuation decreased only 5.1 percent from the prior year level. The valuation per unit in 1997, at \$113,938, was 24 percent higher than the number recorded in 1996.

Six counties account for over 64 percent of all new units permitted in 1997 for the state. They are located in the southeast with Laramie (475) and Albany (154); northwest with Teton (204) and Park (135); and north with Sheridan (107). There were five counties with less than ten housing units permitted in 1997 (See page 3).

Employment and Per Capita Income

The number of full-time and part-time jobs increased 0.9 percent for the state, from 306,619 in 1995 to 309,292 in 1996. The growth rate for the nation was 1.9 percent over the same period. Hot Springs county showed the most substantial increase of 5.0 percent; Big Horn and Johnson counties also demonstrated significant increases of 3.3 and 4.2 percent, respectively. Only 5 counties experienced declines: Carbon (-1.3%), Crook (-0.7%), Goshen (-0.3%), Sweetwater (-2.3%), and Weston (-0.2%).

Wyoming's per capita income (PCI) for 1996 was \$21,587, an increase of 3.0 percent from 1995. The overall national PCI was \$24,436 in 1996, up 4.6 percent from a year ago level. Teton county had the highest PCI, at \$40,728; while Big Horn had the lowest figure of \$15,697 in 1996. Big Horn, Hot Springs, and Park counties exhibited the most phenomenal growth of 6.3, 8.2, and 6.2 percent, respectively, from 1995 to 1996. The only county which suffered a decline over the period was Platte (-1.0%) (see page 4).

Household Income, Poverty, and Health Insurance

Based on comparisons of 2-year moving averages (1995-96 and 1996-97), real median household income in Wyoming, at \$32,543 for the average of 1996-97, was not significantly different from 1995-96 average. Both the poverty rate and the health insurance coverage rate, at 12.7 and 85.5 percent, respectively, for the 1996-97 average also showed no significant difference from the prior period. The poverty threshold for a family of four was \$16,400 in 1997 (see page 5).
