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## *Population Under 18 Years Old in Wyoming*

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's recently released data, 128,873 persons under 18 years of age were counted in Wyoming in 2000. This represents a 4.9 percent decline since 1990, when 135,525 were recorded. Their proportion of the total population also dropped significantly from 29.9 percent in 1990 to 26.1 percent in 2000. However, the total Wyoming population increased 8.9 percent, and the median age increased from 32.1 to 36.2 during the decade, reflecting a rapid change in age distribution.

Among the persons under 18 years in 2000, 91,939 (71.3%) lived in married-couple families; 7,240 (5.6%) lived in single-dad families; and 19,525 (15.2%) were in single-mom families. In 1990, however, this population and its proportions living in those type of families were numbered 106,153 (78.3%), 4,745 (3.5%), and 17,302 (12.8%), respectively. The under 18 population in traditional families decreased 13.4 percent between 1990 and 2000, while it increased 12.8 percent in single-mom families, and showed a staggering jump of 52.6 percent in single-dad families during the same 10 year period. The number of persons under 18 years with grandparents as their guardians also grew substantially from 3,201 to 5,150 between 1990 and 2000. In Fremont County, nearly 10 percent of all children lived in such kind of families as grandchildren in 2000 (see page 2).

## *Employment and Per Capita Income*

According to the estimates recently released by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, the number of full-time and part-time jobs increased 1.9 percent for Wyoming, from 315,657 in 1998 to 321,592 in 1999. The growth rate for the nation was 2.2 percent over the same period. Both Teton and Lincoln counties showed the most substantial increase of more than 4 percent, respectively.

Wyoming's per capita income (PCI) for 1999 was \$26,363, an increase of 5.8 percent from 1998. The overall national PCI was \$28,546 in 1999, up 4.5 percent from a year ago level. Per capita personal income is the annual Total Personal Income (TPI)

of residents divided by population. TPI is the sum of net earnings by place of residence, rental income, personal dividend income, and transfer payments.

Teton County had the highest PCI in the state, at \$59,632; while Big Horn recorded the lowest figure of \$19,738 in 1999. Niobrara, Teton, and Weston counties exhibited the most significant growth of 13.2, 9.7, and 9.7 percent, respectively, from 1998 to 1999. As a matter of fact, all counties recorded PCI increases between 1998 and 1999 (see page 3).

## *Migration Flow for Wyoming*

Recently released by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, these migration data provide measures of population movement from state to state by using the number of individual income tax returns in 1999 and 2000, combined with number of personal exemptions claimed on these returns. Therefore, the data only represent those persons who filed tax returns, but still cover over 90 percent of the population nationwide.

The IRS numbers show that the state which had the most population exchange with Wyoming was Colorado. In-migration to Wyoming from Colorado (3,231) covered 15.1 percent of the total in-migrants, and out-migration to Colorado from Wyoming (3,661) was 16.2 percent of the total out-migrants between 1999 and 2000. Other states exhibiting significant migration exchange with Wyoming were large states such as California and Texas, neighboring states (including Utah, Montana, Nebraska, South Dakota, and Idaho), Arizona and Washington. The least population flow was realized between Wyoming and small eastern states such as Rhode Island, Delaware, and Vermont.

The largest net in-migration (in-flow minus out-flow) to the state continues to come from California. Though the influx of 266 residents to Wyoming during the 1999-2000 period was higher than the prior year level, it was much less than the 1992-93 level of 1,518. Nevada and North Dakota also registered a 100 and 87 residents loss to Wyoming, respectively. The main net out-migration went to Colorado, Arizona, and Idaho which gained at least 200 residents each from Wyoming (see page 4).

**Householder** – the person in whose name the home is owned, being bought, or rented; **Spouse** – who is married to and living with the householder, including common-marriage.

**Own Child** – a son or daughter by birth, marriage (a step child), or adoption.

**Nonrelative** – any household member who is not related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. Examples are roommates or foster children.

**Institutionalized** – people under formally authorized, supervised care or custody, such as correctional and juvenile institutions, and mental hospitals.

**Noninstitutionalized** – people who live in group quarters other than institutions. Examples are people in college dormitories or group homes.

\* Number of Returns: includes records for individual income tax forms 1040, 1040A and 1040EZ. The foreign category also includes forms 1040NR, 1040PR, 1040VI and 1040SS processed through Cycle 39. Returns processed after late September are not included in the data. The number of returns also exclude returns with filer and spouse of filer deceased (and there are no other exemptions on the return); returns that do not match Year-1 to Year-2 and matched returns that are not geographically coded in either year, and "zero exemptions" returns are all excluded.

\* Number of Exemptions: includes the filer (if not deceased), the number of children exemptions (at home, away, and with EIC), the number of parent's exemptions and the number of other exemptions.

\* Matching Returns: tax returns are matched for two particular tax years (2000 and 1999). These are generically referred to as Year-1 (prior year) and Year-2 (current year). There are three categories of match status: (a) matched, (b) unmatched, Year-1 only, and (c) unmatched, Year-2 only. The match is made based on the SSN of the primary filer only. That is, no match is attempted on the secondary filer.

\* Non-Migrant: tax returns filed in the state of Wyoming both in 2000 and in 1999.

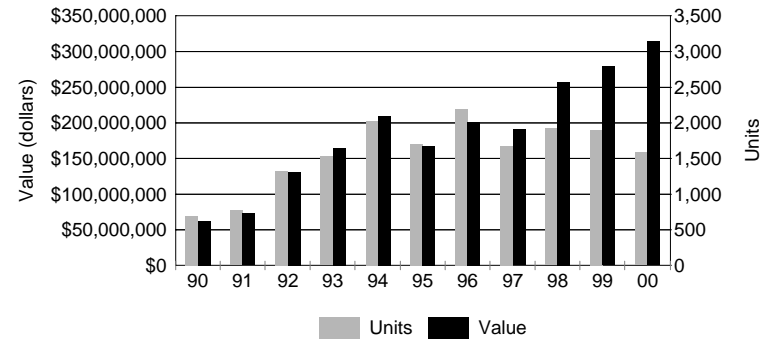
