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## ***Census 2000 Profiles***

The U.S. Census Bureau recently released Census 2000 demographic profile tables with social, economic, and housing characteristics for the Nation, states, counties, cities, towns, and Indian reservations. The data – summary tabulations of the responses to census long-form questions – will be used by local governments, businesses, and planners to make decisions affecting the life in their communities. Some of the characteristics included in the 3 new tables are educational attainment, marital status, disability, employment, occupation, commuting to work, income, poverty, vehicles available, housing value, and rental costs (see page 2 to 5). More detailed data will be released this summer with Summary File 3 (SF3) which includes subjects mentioned above but available by race and Hispanic origin, and to Census Tract and block group level.

## ***2001 County Population Estimates***

According to the U.S. Census Bureau's recently released population estimates, the July 2001 population for Wyoming slightly increased to 494,423 from 493,782, which was counted in Census 2000. The estimated net migration numbers, after accounting for the natural change (births minus deaths), indicated that over 2,000 more persons left the state than moved in since Census 2000. Nationally, the population was estimated at 284,796,887 in 2001, an increase of 1.2 percent from April 2000.

Most counties in Wyoming showed population decreases. However, Campbell and Johnson counties lead the state with strong growth rates of 3.4 and 2.4 percent due to the coalbed methane activities in the region. Albany, Sweetwater, and Washakie counties each suffered losses of at least 2.0 percent during the same period (see page 6).

## ***2000 Employment and Per Capita Income***

According to the estimates recently released by the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, the number of full-time and part-time jobs increased 2.9 percent for Wyoming, from 322,594 in 1999 to 330,657 in 2000. The growth rate for the nation was 2.6 percent over the same

period. Both Campbell and Teton counties showed the most substantial increase of more than 7 percent each. Wyoming's per capita income (PCI) for 2000 was \$27,372, an increase of 7.4 percent from 1999. The overall national PCI was \$29,469 in 2000, up 8.1 percent from a year ago level. Per capita personal income is the annual Total Personal Income (TPI) of residents divided by population. TPI is the sum of net earnings by place of residence, rental income, personal dividend income, and transfer payments.

Teton County had the highest PCI in the state, at \$50,913; while Big Horn recorded the lowest figure of \$19,884 in 2000. Albany, Hot Springs, Natrona, and Weston counties exhibited the most significant growth of over 10 percent, respectively, from 1999 to 2000 (see page 7). ## ***Migration Flow for Wyoming***

Recently released by the U.S. Internal Revenue Service, these migration data provide measures of population movement from state to state by using the number of individual income tax returns in 2000 and 2001, combined with number of personal exemptions claimed on these returns. Therefore, the data only represent those persons who filed tax returns, but still cover over 90 percent of the population nationwide.

The IRS numbers show that the state which had the most population exchange with Wyoming was Colorado. In-migration to Wyoming from Colorado (3,958) covered 15.5 percent of the total in-migrants, and out-migration to Colorado from Wyoming (4,543) was 16.7 percent of the total out-migrants between 2000 and 2001. Other states exhibiting significant migration exchange with Wyoming were large states such as California and Texas, and neighboring states.

The largest net in-migration (in-flow minus out-flow) to the state come from Nebraska and Utah where 251 and 217 persons were lost to Wyoming, respectively. The main net out-migration went to Arizona and Colorado which gained over 500 residents each from Wyoming (see page 8).

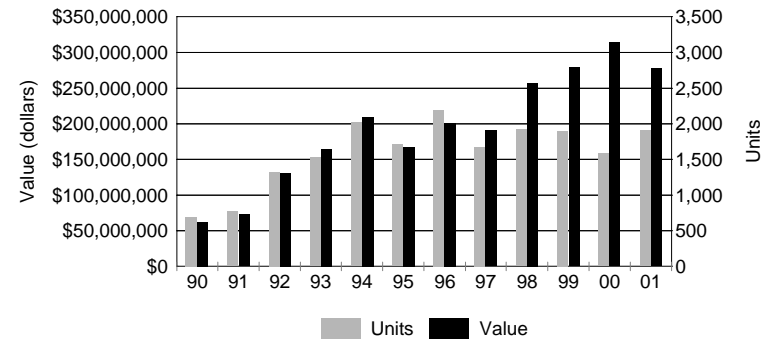
