

Where Should I Be Counted If I Have Multiple Residences?

Help! I have more than one residence!

People may live in multiple places for several reasons. For example, you might be a Snowbird and live at two or more residences during the year (i.e. traveling seasonally). And, sometimes there are questions about where someone should fill out the form. Ultimately fill out the form where you usually spend most of the year. Here are some tips for filling out your form so you are counted where you want to be counted.

- ✓ Do NOT complete the form at your vacation residence if you feel you should be counted at another residence and will return to the other residence on or before July 1st, 2010. On this form received at your vacation residence enter "0" (zero) for the number of people who live at this address, write "Usual home elsewhere" on the form and send it back using the pre-paid envelope.
- ✓ When you return to your regular residence, wait for a Census Bureau Enumerator to follow up with you at your permanent address. Census Takers will follow up with all households who did not respond to the Census during May, June and early July.
- ✓ In the event you will not be able to return to your regular addresses on or before July 1st, you may visit a Be Counted or Questionnaire Assistance Center site located near you. You can find the locations closest to you by visiting www.2010Census.gov
